

Are you burning-off safely?





For many people, burning-off vegetation is an effective way to prepare and maintain properties. Unfortunately each year CFA crews are called out to help people who lost control of their burn-off.

Here is some simple advice to stay safe when burning-off.

FIRE DANGER PERIOD

You can only burn-off if you have a written permit issued by the Municipal Fire Prevention Officer or the CFA District Office.

TOTAL FIRE BAN DAYS	
All fires in the open air are banned during Total Fire Ban days.	Har nei
Any permits are suspended for the duration of any Total Fire Ban days.	Ha

Have you checked your council's local law regarding when and where you can burn off?	You need to check your council's website for local laws to ensure you're allowed to bourn off. Your council may have regulations and certain days that you can burn. If CFA has declared the Fire Danger Period for your municipality, open ar burning is prohibited unless a specific permit is obtained. Fires for burning off during this time without a permit can be up to 120 penalty units and/or up to 12 months' jail.		
Have you checked the weather?	Check weather forecasts for the day of your burn-off and a few days afterwards. If more than light winds you should postpone your burn-off. Also check it won't be too windy on following days, as the wind can reignite your burn.		
Do you have an adequate water supply?	You need to have enough water to estinguish a possible outbreak. For small fires, it's recommended you either have access to a hose or al least 10 litres of water. For larger fires appropriate frelighting equipment and/or machinery may be required.		
Clean up around your burn site.	Create a 3-metre clearance of all flammable material around your whole burn-off site.		
Have you registered your burn-off?	Register your burn-off by calling 1800 668 511. This will ensure CFA won't be called out unnecessarily to your burn-off.		
Have you notified your neighbours?	Ensure you are considerate of your neighbours when burning off. Notily them if you are in close proximity and the smoke may affect them. Also burning items that are wet or green may cause excessive smoke.		
Have you put it out property?	Make sure there are enough people to monitor, contain and extinguish your burn-off safety and effectively. Ensure that your burn-off is completely edinguished before you leave it.

Never leave a burn-off unattended – stay for its entire duration.• If your burn-off gets out of

control, call '000' immediately.

Free native plants for Cardinia Shire residents!

Cardinia Shire's annual indigenous plant giveaway is on again!

Council and the Cardinia Environment Coalition Inc. Nursery are giving away 2 free native plants to the first 1,000 Cardinia Shire households who take up the offer.

The plants are available at Cardinia Environment Coalition (CEC) Inc Nursery at Deep Creek Reserve (62 Cameron Way, Pakenham) from now until Friday 17 June 2022, or while stock lasts. Cardinia Shire Mayor Councillor Jeff Springfield said the free plant giveaway would encourage residents to plant native species in their gardens.

"Native plants are so important for our biodiversity. A garden planted out with native varieties that are indigenous to our shire helps to build a healthier ecosystem and support our local wildlife. "Council is proud to support our community to create a greener Cardinia Shire through the investment of 2 native plants for 1,000 households to plant in their gardens," Cr Springfield said. Cardinia Shire residents must bring proof of address to CEC Inc. Nursery at Deep Creek Reserve to receive 2 free native tube stock plants. Residents can choose from small to large woody stem trees. Two plants per household.

CEC Nursery Inc. at Deep Creek Reserve is located at 62 Cameron Way, Pakenham. It is open from 9am-12pm on Fridays.

The collected chemicals are safely sorted and transported to a specialist waste treatment facility. Where possible, chemicals are recycled or used for other purposes such as energy recovery.

Additionally, DrumMuster provides commercial and residential community members with disposal opportunities for eligible, cleaned agvet chemical containers.

Council's trained staff manage the event, and organise for the drums to be collected and recycled afterwards.

Lest we Forget – "Sandy" " The only horse to return home to Australian soil " By Roman Kulkewycz

Today when people discuss war, images of guns, missiles, warships and planes come to mind.

An integral part of WW1 was the horse. Horses carried soldiers into battle. They were the forerunner of today's modern tanks.


Sandy was one of 136,000 Australian "walers" (the general name applied to Australian horses abroad) were sent overseas for use by the Australian Imperial Force and the British and Indian governments. Only one horse from the 136,000 made it back to Australia. sent abroad in World War I, donated from the O'Donnell family at Old Tallangatta, he was sent to Gallipoli but it is unknown if he was one of those horses landed.

Sandy belonged to Major General Sir William Bridges, who was killed at Gallipoli and made a dying wish for Sandy to be taken back to Australia. In October 1917, the Minister for Defence, Senator George Pearce, called for Sandy to be brought home. He was



boarded on the freighter Booral in September 1918, sailing from Liverpool and arriving in Melbourne in November.

Sandy saw out the rest of his days at the Remount Depot. Although he was originally intended to go to Duntroon, his increasing blindness and debility prompted the decision to have him put down, "as a humane action", in May 1923. His head and neck were mounted and became part of the Memorial's collection. Sandy was displayed for many years, although is currently not on exhibition owing to deterioration through age.




