Cardinia Shire Council has announced the 2022–23 Festival and Events Grants and the Community Wellbeing Support Grants programs.

At its meeting on Monday 18 July 2022, Council considered and endorsed the awarding of more than:

- \$230,595 in funding toward 48 applications under the 2022–23 Festival and Events Grants program.

\$60,642 in funding toward 34 applications under the 2022–23 Community Wellbeing Support Grants program.

Cardinia Shire Mayor Councillor Jeff Springfield said the grants programs seek to provide support for a range of events and sustainable initiatives that improve health and wellbeing, support volunteer development, and build capacity of community organisations.

“Our grants programs are one way that we can provide support to our community and volunteer groups and help them deliver a wide range of initiatives to the benefit of the whole community.

“Thank you to everyone who took the time and effort to submit your applications, and congratulations to all of the successful applicants. Council wishes you all the very best with your events and projects,” said the Mayor.

Festivals and events grants

Council’s Festivals and Events Grants program supports eligible not-for-profit, community-run festival and event organisers and RSL clubs. The grants help cover the costs of running local events that reflect local identity and interests, including community, arts and cultural festivals and events, as well as agricultural shows and major events.

This year’s funding includes grants previously approved in the 2020-21 and 2021-22 Festival and Events Grants programs for events that had to be postponed due to COVID-19.

Community wellbeing support grants

Council’s Community Wellbeing Support Grants program seeks to equitably support sustainable community-led initiatives that address identified and unmet community need and aim to:

- improve resident health and wellbeing
- support opportunities for volunteer development

build capacity of community groups through support for projects and programs.

The Community wellbeing support grants are awarded to eligible community groups and projects across Cardinia Shire for:

- **Seeding grants** to support the cost of starting a new organisation, group, club, program, project, or service.
- **Volunteering grants** to help create volunteering programs, train volunteers, or promote volunteering opportunities.
- **Small change grants** to assist with a range of ad hoc costs that cannot be met through other funding sources, such as buying small items of equipment, website redevelopment, Christmas decorations and more.

Why Ride??

Here's the way I see it...if you are reading this article you may already have at least some interest in the subject of motorbiking. Maybe you ride now, used to ride or would like to consider riding? Perhaps its on the bucket list, or its faint passing thought? Either way, let me try to feed the interest just a little further with some of my reasons for riding a motorbike....

For the thrill of it – there's nothing quite like the feeling of a motorbike...mounted over a motor, wind in your face and bugs in your teeth! I've been riding for over 20 years but I still get a kick out it. Perhaps Robert Pirsig said it best in the book "Zen and the Art of Motorcycle Maintenance":

"You're completely in contact with it all. You're in the scene, not just watching it anymore, and the sense of presence is overwhelming."



Cost saving - It may have taken record fuel prices to put motorcycles into the mainstream consciousness, but the fact that bikes can get more than double the fuel economy of cars makes them serious money savers – for commuting or just for fun, whether or not prices stay high

Parking made perfect – a bike will typically take the same space of 2 cars. In Melbourne's CBD parking is easy, especially as roads are being increasingly closed off to car/truck traffic. In fact, according to Vicroads, in Victoria, you can park your motorcycle on a footpath, unless there is a sign saying you can't, and as long as you're not blocking the path of pedestrians, delivery vehicles, public transport users or parked cars. Whether it's the side of the road, a shopping centre or your favourite coffee shop...just roll up and hop off!

Camaraderie – there's a respect, an acknowledgement between riders as they pass one another on the road. Motorcyclists often feel like they belong to a big community, and that sensation gives us something in common; we share a bond that sets us apart from the rest of the motoring world.

Individuality – Despite the fact that motorcyclists are a part of a big biking group, we also tend to be more individualistic than the next person. Cruisers or sportbikes... dirt bikes or adventure bikes...Harley Davidson or KTM...250cc single or a 2.3lt Rocket. Whether it's expressed through our bikes, brands, clothes or journeys, motorbiking can be an outlet through which we reveal our personalities.

Performance – how else can you experience the performance and acceleration of a \$500k Ferrari for under \$15k?? I'm not condoning speeding, but from a pure performance and acceleration perspective, its hard to beat a bike.

A great escape – as I have spruiked before in previous articles...motorbiking is my escape. Whether you head off for 2 months, 2 weeks, or 2 hours...throwing your leg over a bike changes your perspective on things. The sense of freedom feels complete on two wheels, and riding doesn't just take you on a journey; it is the journey!

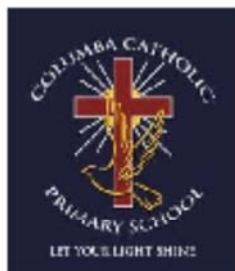

Funding is limited, applications will be assessed upon submission. Please note that the program will not fund items or changes to services which have received funding from previous grants programs.

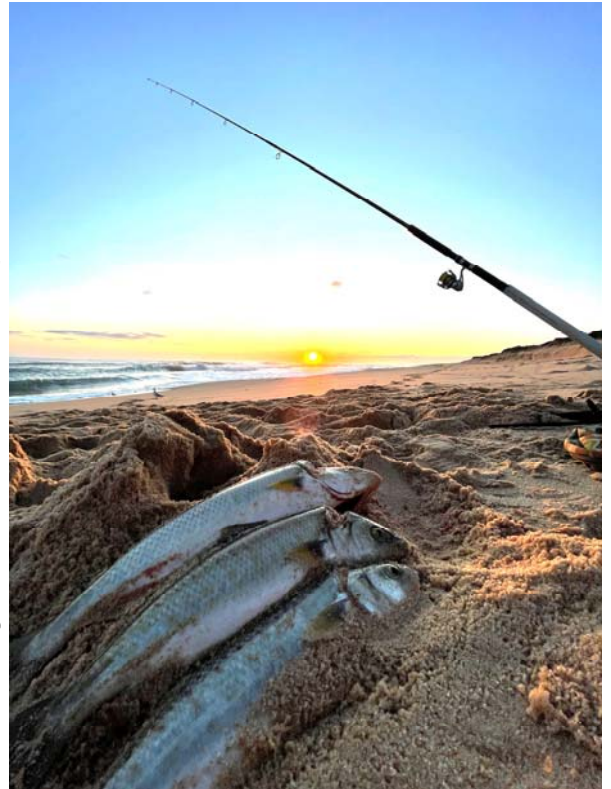

TALKIN' ...FISHIN' BAIT OR LURE

With the rising cost of weekly groceries at the market, alternative menus need to be considered. Same is to be said for the bait prices, no longer a cheap part of the fishing equipment, pipis are now well over \$12 for a 500g bag, and most of the weight is made up of ice and shell, not really economical. The alternative cheaper option is to use lures, there's mainly 3 types to choose from, soft plastics, metal lure or hard body bibbed, all produce good results in combination with the right target species. Being winter, Salmon is still the go if you're visiting any of the many surf beaches along our coast, including inlets and their shorelines.



You should arm yourself with a light and comfortable spinning rod up to 3m in length, especially if you're going to be at it all day. Balance it up with a fast retrieval reel that will hold at least 200m of 5-8kg line, for that unexpected fast run or break off. Incorporate small ball bearing swivels to prevent line twisting, applying careful detail in your knots as always, so to prevent the loss of fish and valuable lures. Vary the retrieve rate of your lures and also the depth the lure is operating at, then if you do get fish in that strike zone continue with the same formula. Your window of opportunity may be brief, either the tide flow or pattern frequency of a feeding school entering the area can limit your catch.

So make hay while the sun shines, try to use a snap-swivel so you

can fast change lures quickly and find the most effective one. For salmon flash is important, chrome is good or all white with a splash of red, keeping the size around the baitfish proportions. Occasionally

change to a soft plastic and drag it along the bottom looking for that ever predatory flathead that always seem to be lurking for another victim. Casting a long distance is not always the answer either, sometimes they're right in close enough to see them in the waves rolling before breaking. Stay alert and safe, keep your eyes on the water, good fishing!

The tour began in Bunyip and travelled to the beautiful St Joseph's Catholic Church at Iona where the church and hall were both explored. Local historian Heather Arnold spoke on the buildings and businesses that were located at Iona some of which still stand today. Heather also spoke on Carlo Catani the engineer responsible for the plans to drain the huge area of 250 square miles of land.

Gerard spoke on the hard and dedicated work of the men and women who toiled to make a living for themselves and gain some land ownership for their labours on the drainage scheme. To obtain employment on the swamp works men had to be married, registered as unemployed, had to accept a 20 acre block of land, work for two weeks for wages on the drains and spend

two weeks on the improvements on their own blocks. Living conditions were harsh and working conditions even worse and many workers didn't stay the course and walked off their land. Twenty percent of the 350 original settlers stayed and persevered and some properties are still farmed by their descendants today.

The tour then continued on to Cora Lynn and the old St Josephs Convent school where the group toured the old schoolroom and listened to tales of former students. The school is currently being renovated and the owners plan to bring the old school back to life.

The day finished with a trip to Bayles where the historical society was presented with a publication showing flora and fauna of the swamp and a "potted" pictorial history of the area by Susan Davies who also talked about Bayles and it's history. The then finished with lunch at the Koo Wee Rup Hotel, a rendition of "Swamp Girl" by Pauline McKinnon & Kathy Adams the tired but weary travellers then returned to Bunyip.
