

A British Invasion in Gippsland? Jake Hanney

Jake Hanney at only 16 years of age will be releasing his fourth album of original music, "End of the Road" later this year [September/October] which has an uncanny resemblance to the style of Sir Paul McCartney. In fact, the album includes a "four-song medley" which could be mistaken as a McCartney medley from the 'Red Rose Speedway' or 'Back to the Egg albums'. Jake hails from Drouin in West Gippsland and has been honing his craft now from a young age. He wrote his first song, 'Loverbird' at the age of 8, released his first album 'Sympathy' at age 12 and has gone on to not only writing/composing his own tracks, but playing all the instruments, producing, mixing and mastering them also. Along the process, he has had every one of his eight singles, reach the Top 20 in the Regional Atomic Charts, with his Christmas Single, "This Christmas Day' [jointly performed with his younger sister, Claudia], reaching #1 and staying there for three weeks, and his most successful single, "Everytime", sitting at the #1 spot for 7 consecutive weeks. He has also received Radium Awards for three of his singles, and a Plutonium Award for his single, "1000 Reasons Why". The accolades continue. The first break came in 2019 (at age 12) at the time Jake released his first album, 'Sympathy', he won the local 'Bunyip Kids X-Factor'. From there in addition to his regional chart success, he reached the semi-finals of the Voyager International Song-writing Competition in 2020, and reached the FINAL of the same International Song-writing Competition in 2022 [over 10 000 entrants]. He has also been featured on two occasions on the Dennis Walter Show on 3AW.

Jake's upcoming album is a further development from his 2022 album, 'Elimination and Creation', and is a testimony to his growing song-writing skills. Jake's music has a very 60's/70's vibe to it, with some tracks showing an obvious influence from The Beatles, ABBA, ELO, The Kinks and Paul McCartney/Wings, not only in the 'sound' of the music, but in the production.

Because of the young age at which Jake started recording, and then Covid and the amazing effort required to produce four complete albums by the age of 16, Jake, up to now, has been principally a recording artist, but at the release of this upcoming album, Jake is looking at performing and being a familiar face around The Pakenham and West Gippsland area.

It is Jake's dream to form a local band, who share his love of the 60's/70's pop, soft rock genre, and from there, take off! Jake also records and performs covers within this genre, some of which can be found on his You Tube channel: Jake Hanney Music.

As Jake has done with previous albums, they will be available through most streaming services (Spotify, itunes etc.) and the album will be released on cd at \$10 + p/h\$ (including a booklet containing the lyrics and photos). Jake is looking for the first time to make his new album also available as a vinyl lp. For small runs, this is quite an expense, so Jake is hoping that 50 - 100 people (fans and future fans) might like to pre-order a vinyl lp at \$50 + p/h\$ (to make it viable) by contacting Jake through his website: jakehanney.com

Your support for Jake and his music is very much appreciated, and I think you will be pleasantly surprised at what is a great album, and by pre-purchasing the album [especially on vinyl] you just might be helping to create a bit of history.

Oh, it might be worth mentioning here that Jake has just recently [16 June, 2023] released his 9th single, "Always on my Mind" – a ballad. It will also feature on his upcoming album, "End of the Road". Like all of Jake's original music, it is available on most music platforms.









William Holgate born 1876 and Joseph Arthur born in 1879 were two sons of Enoch Holgate and Anna Maria Denton. By 1889, the family had land on the Tonimbuk Road, just past the present freeway and Arthur in 1903 opened a store in Bunyip in partnership with Mr Rosenbrock and cycled to work from the property. He enlisted in the first world war in 1914 and received a Distinguished Conduct Medal for his services. On his return a Mr Nichols became Arthur's partner in the store. He married Isobel, daughter of Mr & Mrs Lothian of the well known publishing firm and they lived in A'Beckett Road. The couple were very well read and donated material and tools for shelves in the Bunyip School Library and in later years, after Isobel's death her library was given to the school. The couple were lovers of antiques, the arts and horticulture and received many awards from the Royal Melbourne Show for floral exhibits. On their property they

specialized in growing trees and flowers, including magnificent wild daffodils and maiden hair ferns in the bush which surrounded their home. Arthur cultivated a rare pink trumpeted daffodil, which he named after his wife and planted in George Street, which are still standing today. University students spent time at the Holgate property, sketching and painting. Isobel Holgate was a generous contributor to many public organisations, including the C.W.A. She died on the 18th September 1946 at Bunyip. Arthur died in 1967 and left a bequest that improvements be made to the grounds of St Thomas' Church of England by the planting of trees. The couple remain remembered to this day in Holgate Memorial Park, the site of their former property in A'Beckett road.

TALKIN' ...FISHIN' MAKING SCENTS OF IT ALL.

No matter what lure, soft plastic or bait you use, it can always do with a burst of flavour. Adding the lure of an attractant in the form of a scented odour can vastly enhance your catch rate. Choice is a variation of flavours, in either oils or pastes, there is a few good ones on the market, or another option is you can mix up your own.

Boiled up in the kitchen adds a special aroma to the house, the pot is not the only thing you'll bring to the boil. Please take my advice and do it in the garage or shed on your camping cooker/stove, along with your berley recipes. The tell-tale sign you've got a good brew going is the number of 'blowies' you're attracting from blocks away.

Oil mixtures can be a bit thin, however they need to be if you're spraying them through an atomiser spray bottle and they wash off after a couple of casts, unless you dry them off first in the sun. This helps them to stay on a bit longer or adding a sticking agent like gelatine or glycerine will help. You can best apply with a spray atomiser bottle available in various sizes at most \$2 shops, but don't make it too thick or it will just clog up the nozzle. Another way is to dip it into your solution, but is your lure is leaving an oil slick trail behind it? Too much!

Pastes are sticky and scented and so handy, but use an applicator or your rod reel and everything else will wreak of it later. Ingredients you can include and use are Tuna Oil, Fish sauces and oils, Oyster and shrimp sauce, Garlic paste, flavoured kitchen salts, fish tank flakes food, Crab jelly.

All of these in many combinations will work, but its trial and error to get the consistency you want for the application method and the enticing smell for the species you're targeting.

Building safer local roads in Nar Nar Goon

Black Spot upgrade works are now underway on Bald Hill Road and Five Mile Road in Nar Nar Goon.

Vital road upgrades will be completed on Bald Hill Rd from July to September 2023 as part of the Australian Government's Black Spot Program.

Works will include:

- The installation of a right turn and shoulder widening at the Bald Hill Road and Five Mile Road intersection
- Permanent speed limit change
- Sealing 30m of Five Mile Rd side road intersection
- Installation of flag lighting around the intersection
- Removal of small trees and shrubs
- Pavement construction
- Line marking
- Signage

Black Spot projects target dangerous road locations where crashes are frequently occurring and focuses on improving existing infrastructure.


Based on the crash history for the 5-year period ending June 2020, there were a total of five crashes near the Bald Hill Rd and Five Mile Rd intersection, including one fatal crash.

To improve safety and reduce the risk of crashes occurring on Bald Hill Rd, council is permanently reducing the speed limit on Bald Hill Rd and Five Mile Rd from 100 km/h to 80 km/h in addition to the upgrade works.

These upgrade works will make an important contribution towards reducing the potential for serious injuries and deaths on this local road and surrounding areas.

To ensure community safety throughout the works, lane closures and traffic management, including reduced speed limits and traffic and footpath detours will be in place.


