It's around this time of year when we generally start getting asked questions like "do you know when fire restrictions are coming in"

The short answer is No, we don't know at this point in time.

The cooler wet weather we have been experiencing for some time now has slowed down the curing of the grasslands and delayed the start of the traditional fire danger period in our area. That doesn't mean its not coming. It's just not here yet.

Other areas of the state to the North and North West have either entered or announced their starting dates for their fire danger period. You need to be mindful of this when travelling to and visiting these areas. https://www.cfa.vic.gov.au/warnings-restrictions/fire-danger-period-restrictions

In the meantime, we urge all residents to continue to be vigilant and continue with their summer preparations and property cleanup. If you are burning off, please do so safely and follow the local council guidelines including burning only on the permissible days for your specific address. Remember to register your burn off with the CFA on 1800 668 511 and ensure you fully extinguish your burn when complete. https://www.cardinia.vic.gov.au/burningoff

School Opens Time Capsule

On Wednesday the 30th November about 100 people including past students and visitors joined the Garfield Primary School community in a historic ceremony that saw the opening of a fifty year "time capsule". Master of Ceremonies for this event was school principal Danny Forster.

In 1972, the then Principal Mr Don McGregor, to celebrate 100 years of education was involved in making up a time capsule and sealing it, to be opened in fifty years time, 2022. The school celebrated 100 years of education at Garfield in 1986.

Unfortunately due to ill health, Mr. McGregor, 88, was not able to attend..

Former student and published author Dr.Jim Connelly who attended Garfield Primary in 1938 presented the school with one of his books.

Mr. Tim O'Halloran entertained by singing the school song to the tune of "Click go the Shears"

Mr. Trevor Riches recalled school memories from the 1960's

School Captains, Lilly Mills and Wil Savage presented interesting past school memories and introduced speakers to come to the podium to give their personal experiences at the school.

When the time capsule was opened, it contained a phone directory, Melbourne and local newspapers, a one cent piece, an electoral roll, magazines and letters written by staff.

A new time capsule was initiated and in it was placed memorabilia from each class, newspaper clippings from 50 years ago, face masks and a R.A.T. kit.

The school currently has 153 students.





TALKIN' ...FISHIN' WHAT'S COOKING

Here's hoping you all had a wonderful Xmas gathering and a safe New Year's Eve.

On many of our fishing trips into the back country locations facilities aren't always there to cook up amazing meals, so you have to do the best with what you have on hand. Anything that's hot and filling is all you need when you're starving after a long hard day on the river or in the boat. While these meals won't pass the 'MasterChef' exam they do the job nicely. Let me share a couple of our culinary delights with you, I can see the wives cringing already!

No.1 Ingredients: 1 small tin of corn kernels, 1 cup or mix of peas and snow peas, 2 pkts of Maggi instant noodles (beef or chicken).

Method: Break in half 2 pkts of noodles into a saucepan, only just cover with bottled water, while boiling up add the can of corn and peas, add a little more water if needed. Add the 2 flavour sachets when it all begins to boil, continue until the noodles soften, pour off any excess fluid, but the more you leave the longer the heat will stay in it.

*keep the empty can, you'll see later!

No.2 Ingredients: 2 slices of toast, the largest slices you can find the better. 1 small can of baked beans, (or substitute with tuna or spaghetti) grated tasty cheese, grated or finely sliced onion, 1 small tin of corn kernels.

Method: Remove (cut) all the crusts from the 2 slices of bread, then spread over 1 side of each slice with a generous amount of butter, especially the edges, this will be the inside. Add the 4 ingredients to the centre of the bread then place the other slice on top, don't overfill, you'll have enough to make another. Squash only the edges together with your thumb or a fork to seal it all in to make a fat envelope. Lift into a lightly buttered frypan turn over a few times carefully as it browns, poke a single hole each side to let the gases escape so they don't burst at the seam. Oh! and there'll be plenty more of that later in the day, that's why we call them 'Fart Pockets'.

Remember the empty corn tin? Cut out the other end of it and butter the inside edge, with your finger, **what?** It's a fishing trip! Watch for sharp edges though, place it in the frypan and crack an egg down the chute and sprinkle a bit of grated cheese on top, a great egg ring substitute. Run a knife tip around the inside if it sticks, Mc'Yoke on toast with a coffee.

A mate and I once stayed in an onsite caravan park cabin, noticing the park had a BBQ facility we bought some sausages to go with our tin vegies. Came meal time a closer inspection of the cooking surface revealed something closer to a medical experiment I did in science at high school. So we opted to cook indoors as the pub meals were closed now, but the only utility the cabin had was a microwave oven. So the sausages went in for 8 min on high, floating in a bath of water. Although they tasted not too bad, it's a good thing they were covered in sauce and wrapped in a bread jacket, because they looked like a grey hot dog, or a close resemblance to dolphin skin in texture and colour. Hunger wins out every time.

Thirty Years Of Service To Community

The Bunyip Pharmacy celebrated 30 years of serving the community last Thursday 15th December with a welcoming birthday cake and morning tea for it's customers.

Last month the pharmacy was one of eight in Australia voted as "Pharmacy of the Year" by it's loyal customers in a competition conducted by Arrotex Pharmaceuticals. Over 1200 pharmacies entered the competition.

Pharmacist Dinesh Solanki came to Australia about 35 years ago, newly married, from Fiji Islands. He is the eldest child of a family of 3 siblings, of Indian parents who were first generation Indians in Fiji. He studied pharmacy at University of Queensland as an overseas student and returned to Fiji on completion of his degree.

As well as working in Fiji he worked in Brisbane, Mooranbah (Central Qld), Bendigo, Forest Hill and has owned Bunyip Pharmacy since 1992. " *If I am not mistaken I may be the longest owning proprietor of a business in Bunyip*", he said. Dinesh is married to Geeta and the couple has 2 children, Vishaan and Prianka.

Dinesh has always been a community minded person. A year after opening his pharmacy in 1992 he was elected to the board of Hillview Bunyip Aged Care where he served for five years. "I have always found the people of Bunyip a very caring, close knit, accepting, understanding and friendly community which was most evident during the recent pandemic where at times people had to wait longer on scripts being filled. But now we are gradually moving to electronic scripts which the doctor can send direct to the pharmacy or to the patient's mobile phone. We are gradually going paperless. Over the last 30 years this has been the most notable change." he said.

Dinesh says he has many fond memories, but the one which stands out most for him was the pharmacy winning a "Pharmacy of the Year" award last month which also came with a \$10,000 community Grant to the Bunyip Market's "Picnic Garden" project.

"Our pharmacy is always looking at how we can improve our services and in the near future we hope to introduce Health Screening and Medication Reviews. I am very grateful to have such a wonderful dedicated staff whose focus is on customer service and care".



PROJECT UPDATE

This year has been significant for the Gippsland Line Upgrade, with our construction teams undertaking important works along the rail corridor and at Bunyip, Longwarry, Morwell and Traralgon stations.

We have completed the new second platforms at all four stations and passenger safety and amenity upgrades including additional lighting, CCTV, passenger information displays, canopy shelters and extra seating.

In Bunyip, construction of the new bus loop has been completed on the south side of the station with additional accessible car parking spaces and pick-up and drop-off bays, improving connectivity for the community.

Works at Longwarry Station have included accessibility improvements with the construction of the new stairs and ramp. Landscaping has also been completed on the south side, along with the formalisation of the bus loop.

JANUARY WORKS

Work will progress this summer on the Gippsland Line, to enable more frequent and reliable services for passengers.

While coaches replace trains on the line for Metro Tunnel Project works, we will progress track installation and put the finishing touches on the station upgrades at Traralgon, Morwell, Bunyip and Longwarry.

Coaches will replace trains between Southern Cross and Bairnsdale stations from Wednesday 4 January to Tuesday 31 January.


Works occurring around Bunyip and Longwarry stations during January

Works will be taking place around the station precincts and in the rail corridor 24 hours a day, seven days a week during January.

Rail replacement services will operate from the north bus stop on Main Street, near the IGA in Bunyip and from Nar Nar Goon-Longwarry Road outside Longwarry Station. For more information on service timetables please visit the V/Line website.

Myki and touch-on facilities will be available at all times from Bunyip and Longwarry stations. There will be no vehicle or pedestrian access across the rail line at the Hope Street, Bunyip or McIntyre Road, Garfield, level crossings from 4 January to 31 January. A vehicle detour will be in place via the Garfield Road level crossing.

Pedestrian access across the rail line will be available at Bunyip, via the existing east rail crossing. Access with prams/strollers and mobility aids may be difficult during this time. If you have accessibility or mobility needs, please call the project team on 1800 105 105 in advance for assistance with your journey.

Together with Julian Tenison-Woods, she founded the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart, a congregation of religious sisters that established a number of schools and welfare institutions throughout Australia and New Zealand, with the emphasis on education for the rural poor.

School Principal, Mr. Andrew Greco said that the MacKillop award recognises an outstanding individual who has demonstrated extraordinary achievements and commitment to promoting and practising diversity, inclusion, equity, and access at Columba Catholic Primary School. "Clancy has demonstrated courage to work for the good of others and always set a good example for his peers, "Mr. Greco added.



Narracan District supplementary election announced for January 2023

A supplementary election will be held on **Saturday 28 January 2023** for Narracan District. The Governor of Victoria, the Hon. Linda Dessau AC, issued a writ for the supplementary election today.

The supplementary election is required because the Narracan District election at last month's State election failed after a candidate passed away before election day.

Enrolled voters in Narracan District voted for the Upper House Eastern Victoria Region in the 2022 State election. The supplementary election will be for the Lower House district of Narracan only.

'Voting is compulsory for all enrolled voters in Narracan District. I urge you to check your enrolment details are current. If you were enrolled for Narracan District for the 2022 State election by the close of roll at 8 pm on Tuesday 8 November 2022, you must vote in the supplementary election,' Acting Electoral Commissioner Dana Fleming said.

Voters can sign up for the VEC's free SMS and email election reminder service, VoterAlert.

Information about voting and nominating as a candidate is available on the VEC website at wec.vic.gov.au or by calling 131 832.


