At the end of the service, we sang the English National Anthem which was appropriate for the focus of the day.

As the congregation filed out of the church, a peel of seventy chimes was rung on the church bell, one for each year of Her Majesty's reign.

## Bunyip Station Upgrade - Update

As you might already be aware, we conducted workshops with members of the community last year to contribute to the final station design. The key themes we heard from the community

feedback included: improving user journey/experience; improving safety, amenity and accessibility; and better connecting intermodal activity.

This feedback played a key role in finalising the design for Bunyip Station. Specifically, the final design includes:

 $\cdot$  A new second platform to enable more frequent and reliable services, and accessibility and amenity improvements for better passenger journeys.

 $\cdot$  A new canopy connected to the new platform, with a landscaped embankment on Nar Nar Goon Road to help intuitively guide train passengers and other station users to it from the surrounding area.

 $\cdot$  New trees will be strategically positioned at access points to effectively guide precinct users, and new plantings located to provide maximum, amenity, shade and comfort in the public areas.

 $\cdot$  The formalised, asphalted car park and vehicle movement areas will provide safe and accessible pedestrianfriendly environments, with the design seizing the opportunity presented by the sloping site to better connect the town with its recreational and sporting areas. The project will also deliver 30 new car parking spaces at Bunyip on behalf of the Victorian Government's Car Parks for Commuters program.

 $\cdot$  Relocating the pedestrian crossing to the Melbourne end of the platforms, near the northern entrance, which will better connect the town's north and south, boosting accessibility and safety.

We are close to selecting a local artist to design a creative opportunity that will be embedded into the Bunyip Station design. This artwork theme will be informed by consultation undertaken last year with the community that saw the themes of native fauna and flora, local history and community stories voted most popular.

## Council to support NBN to conduct information sessions for local businesses

Cardinia Shire Council is hosting NBN Co by running two information sessions to assist local businesses.

The informal drop-in events for businesses will run from 9am to 12pm on Tuesday 12 July at Toomah Community Centre in Pakenham and on Wednesday 13 July at the Hills Hub in Emerald.

Businesses will have the chance to speak directly with industry professionals in a relaxed atmosphere about business connectivity, access to NBN business grade fibre, and the foundations of best practice around cyber security for businesses.

The sessions will provide practical advice for working with internet service providers and ensuring that businesses receive the best plan and service possible to optimise and future-proof their business.

NBN Independent Business Advisors will also be there to help businesses select the best supplier for their needs and location.

Cardinia Shire Mayor Councillor Jeff Springfield expressed how pleased Council was to be able to provide these events for our local business community.

"Being able to facilitate such worthwhile events for our businesses ensures that they are given the opportunity to discuss their issues and misunderstandings directly with experts from the NBN," Cr Springfield said.

"Business have told us that they are struggling to understand about internet connectivity and are asking for these information sessions, so it is great that we are able to provide them with direct links to the NBN experts."

We will start our evening with a site visit on the Tarago River to view the latest technology for monitoring fish movements, and a demonstration of how we can uncover what species are living in waterways through a simple water sample.

This will be followed by a presentation at the Bunyip Hall from 5pm, where scientist Wayne Koster from Arthur Rylah Institute will present his findings from the fish monitoring, unveiling some fascinating discoveries he has made and explaining how we use this information to manage the rivers through the targeted delivery of environmental water.

We will conclude the evening with pizzas and a chance to discuss any waterway related topics with Melbourne Water staff.

This event is presented by Melbourne Water, Arthur Rylah Institute and Landcare.

## **Open-air fires local law adopted by Council**

Following extensive community and agency consultation, Council has adopted new open-air fire regulations which will come into effect on 1 July 2022.

The local law was adopted at last night's Council meeting and details the regulations for open-air fires - commonly known as 'burning off' – outside of the declared fire danger period.

The Open Air Fires Local Law aims to provide adequate provision for fuel reduction and fire prevention while discouraging unnecessary smoke health hazards.

This new law will provide the community with more opportunities to reduce bushfire risk through burning-off while ensuring public safety remains a key priority.

Cardinia Shire Mayor Councillor Jeff Springfield said he believed the new local law reflected the community's feedback received during the consultation period.

"We listened to the community and made several changes before the adoption of this new local law," Cr Springfield said.

"The proposal initially had a restriction on open air fires on public holidays however we have scrapped this after looking at community feedback and open-air fires can now take place on public holidays.

"We also changed the days residents are allowed to burn-off – this is changing from Saturday to Sunday on weekends.

"Residents raised concerns about smoke so the distances to buildings/fencelines have been increased in this local law to take in account smoke amenity concerns when residents complete burning off.

"The proposal originally included a 25-metre clearance distance, but we listened to the community and this has now been amended to a 12 metre clearance distance.

"We recognise that there is a wide-range of opinions within our community concerning how this local law should best operate. Some residents would like the freedom to burn off any day whilst others wish for no burning off at all. It is our hope that this new local law will strike the balance between all the variety of views that have been communicated with us."

The local law renews focus on:

- Smoke impacts on community
- Bushfire fuel reduction and property preparation
- Burning off timeframes
- Burning off in townships
- Environmental impacts

As part of the local law, the Shire will be divided into three zones with appropriate open-air fire regulations, rather than the previous rules where regulations were based on zoning and land size.

In the Urban and Township Zone, burning off is only allowed with a permit.

In the Bushland and Peri-Urban Zone and the Rural Zone, if criteria is met, a permit for burning off may not be required.

July will be declared a 'no burn month' throughout the Shire. This means burning-off will be prohibited across the entire shire throughout the month.

This change aims to reduce hazardous smoke caused from burning wet material. This is intended to encourage an uptake of alternative methods of waste disposal during these wetter months and reduce smoke impacts over the school holiday period.

The **ALVEY** fishing reel Company, is an Australian family business founded by Charles Alvey in Brisbane in 1920, but has sadly come to an end.

A solidly constructed sidecast reel based on the Scottish designed centrepin reel, with the one major difference of being able to turn the body and spool completely sideways, allowing line to be cast off directly from the lip of the reel with minimal friction or resistance. A durable and wellconstructed reel of minimal parts made of stainless steel and chrome plated brass, wooden cedar spools and later fibreglass and polymers. Winding power with a 1:1 ratio direct winding action, it became a simple and popular reel all over Australia. The company produced 25,000 reels annually in the 1930's until 1939 when WW2 broke out, then the needs for the company changed as it re-tooled its factory for the production of vehicle and aircraft parts to support the war effort taking priority. At the wars end in 1945 the company returned to regular business, unfortunately and sadly its founder also died that year, leaving family members to rally and continue his legacy and expand and streamline the manufacturing process. The company over the following years to had to cope with the ever increasing demand for their products within Australia and now including overseas as well. In 1974 the Brisbane floods caused extensive factory damage, but family, friends and volunteers all helped with the clean-up to get the factory production and staff back on their feet, so respected was the company's product. Always the goal of the business was to give their customers a quality and durable product, a task they always achieved in my opinion. Anyone who owns one of these reels has a deep affection for its simplicity and practical use, especially its perfection and usage in saltwater. In all the years the design remains close to the original but modern manufacturing techniques and materials have been applied that have added to its popularity and appeal to new anglers. The designs including a drag system, cover many fishing variations from Surf, Boat, Estuary and freshwater, truly a versatile and tough reel. I've had a fondness for their reels since I was a kid, with the 4" A1 series being my first of many subsequent Alvey purchases, any I would find hard to part with. I still will only fish the surf with these reels. And sadly the day has come that due to reasons of cost and supply of the raw materials makes the manufacture and means to continue no longer an economically viable proposition. The company will cease all production as of the end of June 2022, trading will continue while stocks last until sold out, so get in and buy your piece of Australian history before the last has gone.

Over the weekend, a family were woken to the sound of their barking dogs and smoke alarms when their dryer caught alight.

When firefighters arrived the family had already evacuated the home, and crews helped the family with ventilating the house. Thankfully, there was minimal damage to the home and the family is safe!

The exact cause of the dryer fire is not known however it is a timely reminder for those who use dryers to:

 $\Box$  Clean lint filters before each use.

 $\Box$  Don't leave dryers on when you leave the house.

 $\Box$  Don't put dryers on overnight or when you are sleeping.
