Why I support the Voice

There are many disadvantaged groups in Australia, all of whom would surely like to have a greater say in government matters affecting them. So why should one group, Indigenous Australians, be given a special and constitutionally-enshrined voice to parliament? There is no doubting the extreme level of disadvantage in many Indigenous communities: the statistics on, for example, life-expectancy and imprisonment, are shocking and unacceptable. But while that is an often-stated reason for the Voice, it is not, in my view, a sufficient reason. So why do I support the Voice?

Firstly, the proposed Voice is intimately connected to the proposed recognition of Indigenous Australians in the words of the constitution - a recognition (widely supported) that they were the custodians of this land for thousands of years before colonisation. Such recognition is central to what defines Australia, so it should be more than just words. It needs to be more substantial. In my mind this justifies giving Indigenous Australians their own Voice to Parliament: that would be tangible recognition.

Secondly, the disadvantage that many Indigenous Australians experience has a different genesis from that of other disadvantaged groups. Much is the result of colonisation: their land was taken from them, many of their children were taken away, they were omitted from the national census, they lacked electoral franchise, they have been subjected to paternalistic laws. The impact of colonisation on them and their way of life has been nothing short of catastrophic, and warrants redress in a tangible way.

Thirdly, modern Australia has much to learn from the traditional practices and beliefs of Indigenous culture. Top of mind here is "connection to country", respect for non-human life, living in harmony with nature, being custodians not owners of the land. In contrast, modern Australia, with its worship of wealth, consumerism and exploitation of nature is demonstrably unsustainable both environmentally and ethically. It is perhaps wishful thinking on my part, but a louder indigenous voice could show us a way towards a brighter future.




Recently the Bunyip Kindergarten's Parent Advisory Group (the "PAG") organised a Mother's Day raffle to raise some funds for the kindergarten.

The funds raised will go towards outdoor improvements for the children to enjoy. We can't wait to share an update with photos when we get them.


TALKIN' ...FISHIN' CHEMICAL LIGHTS.

Here is an alternative light source that requires no batteries, is safe, not hot, is waterproof, and is almost unbreakable that can last for up to 12 hours. Known as Chemical lights, like little light sabres for your fishing tackle, kids often refer to them as 'Glowies', you'll often see them attached to their bike spokes at night time for a coloured rainbow effect or decorating their arms and necks at parties and at xmas time.

They work by two isolated chemicals combined inside a sealed plastic tube, when bent the inner tube breaks, mixing the two chemicals, causing a reaction that produces a bright glowing fluid. A one-time usage that is safe and self-contained and lasts for a limited time, up to 12 hours. Available in many sizes and shapes from very small up to very large, used by the military and emergency services alike, for illuminating your position and visual locators.

There is a multitude of applications for this product to satisfy your fishing habits, from illuminating your bait and tackle, lures and rod tips for night fishing to making others aware of your position for your safety or general visibility. Available in a variety of shapes and colours, the brightest being the fluoro/yellow and the white, providing enough light to even tie a hook at night, easily hung around your neck on a lanyard and tucked away inside your clothing until required. Some floats come with a removable tip stems that accommodates a changeover to these light sticks for night fishing, great stuff!

Some lures and squid jigs also have a body cavity for scent sticks (like a cigarette filter) or chemical lights exciting fish in the late hours. Light up your rod tips for the surf or river bream fishing, either attach with a small elastic band or use the designed clip on version. Prices vary from the more expensive brands available from camping and fishing stores to the reasonably priced ones from \$2 variety and party shops. Don't forget to care for your environment and dispose of all your plastics and packaging responsibly.

Sarah Alice Kraft

Sarah was one of eight children born in Castlemaine in 1863 to Lawrence and Mary Anne Finch. After to moving to the district in 1878 Sarah's father Lawrence was granted a hotel licence for the Gippsland Hotel in Bunyip. Sarah, her mother, and sisters helped in the hotel as her father became busier with his work as a contractor. As her sisters married Sarah became more involved with the running of the hotel. Sarah registered the birth of a daughter Elizabeth Annie known to the family as Daisy. With both her parents getting older and raising her daughter Sarah took on more duties in running the hotel.

In 1897 a William George Kraft became the proprietor of the hotel and Sarah and he married in 1898. Sarah continued to own and hold the licence of the hotel which was known as Kraft's Gippsland Hotel. Like her father Sarah was a great supporter of the local community. For over twenty-five years she was honorary secretary or assistant secretary of the Bunyip cemetery trust and involved in the Bunyip Red Cross and joined in the patriotic fundraising during the war years. In 1915 Sarah applied for a licence to open a hotel in Koo Wee Rup, it was noted that she had thirty-years' experience in the industry and had owned the Gippsland Hotel for fourteen years. Krafts Gippsland Hotel was sold in 1911.

Sarah was a good businesswoman, who ran the hotel with little trouble. There was instance in 1904 when she was in court having to answer an allegation of breaching licensing laws by refusing to serve a meal to James Douglas, a farmer. A number of witnesses were cross examined. The bench dismissed the case declaring that Sarah Kraft had a good reason to refuse a meal to Douglas, because he had been harbouring her daughter Daisy, and then denied that she was at his house. It was simply a case of a mother protecting her daughter.

Sarah died on 20 June 1933 aged seventy, George died two years later on 5 July 1935 they are both buried in the Bunyip Cemetery.

Cardinia Shire Council adopts 2023-24 Budget

Cardinia Shire Council has adopted its 2023–24 Budget, following a second round of community input into the draft document in May this year. Council received and considered a total of 286 submissions from the community during the budget development process from December 2022 to May 2023.

Cardinia Shire Mayor Councillor Tammy Radford thanked the community for their involvement in shaping the budget. "Thank you to everyone who participated in reviewing the draft budget and submitting feedback. Your input and involvement are invaluable and ensure we put our resources and effort toward the right things to best serve our community now and into the future," Mayor Radford said. "We're committed to making informed and strategic financial decisions that effectively meet the needs of our community and deliver in the areas most important to you. The 2023-24 budget reflects our shared priorities."

The 2023-24 Budget has been designed to reflect Council's commitment to make Cardinia Shire the best possible place to live, work and raise a family.

Budget highlights

To deliver on the community's priorities through the Council Plan 2021–25, Council prepares four-year rolling budgets, which undergo community consultation and are adopted annually. The budget reflects Council's prudent fiscal management, which has enabled an extensive capital works program to be included, and all vital community services to be maintained or enhanced.

The 2023-24 budget includes allocations for the following key projects:

- Better Local Roads Princes Highway intersection upgrades \$17.9m
- Better Local Roads Sealing the Hills \$16.3m
- Integrated Children's Facility (Brunt Road) \$7.0m
- Koo Wee Rup Bowls and Community Facility \$5.4m
- Integrated Children's Facility (Thewlis/Cardinia Road) \$4.0m
- Garfield Netball Pavilion Upgrades \$3.6m
- Officer District Masterplan Civil Works \$3.5m
- Cardinia Youth Facility \$2.5m
- Upper Beaconsfield Recreation Reserve \$1.4m
- Pakenham Tennis Club Relocation (Club Room Renovation) \$1.0m

The capital works program for the financial year 2023-24 is \$113.8m (including \$29.3m carryover from 2022-23), with \$69.2m dedicated to the renewal and upgrade of our \$2.3 billion worth of community assets. The program ensures residents across the shire have access to an expanding range of new recreational and leisure facilities and renewed and upgraded infrastructure. \$59 million is budgeted for all roads and intersection upgrade programs, including the \$17.9m 'Princes Highway Intersection upgrades' and \$16.3m 'Sealing the Hills' programs.

Other capital works budget allocations for 2023-24 include:

- recreation, leisure, and community facilities \$13.3m
- drains and bridges \$2.2m
- footpaths and cycleways \$1.4m
- parks, open space, and streetscapes \$3.4m
- property, including construction and upgrades of buildings \$30.4m
- Plant, equipment, and lighting \$4.1m

General rates in 2023–24 will increase 3.50 per cent, in line with the Victorian Government's rate cap this year. This rate increase is well below current and projected inflation, as well as service contract and supply chain cost increases and staff enterprise agreement commitments. The rate cap continues to put additional pressure on Victorian councils to deliver services with significantly reduced revenue. Reflecting the Victorian Government's increase to the waste levy and increased waste and garbage contract costs, the residential garbage charge is \$348.60 for a 120L garbage bin and a 240L recycling bin in 2023–24. The green waste charge will increase marginally from \$129.00 to \$133.20 for a 240L bin.

Council also amended the Budget Fees & Charges Schedule to include free Annual Parking passes for Cardinia Shire residents for Emerald Lake Park and included a \$40 annual charge for non-Cardinia Shire residents.



OUR VISION:

OUR MISSION:

BUNYIP SOLAR FARM:

BRAG, in association with KOMO Energy, is investigating the feasibility of installing a small solar farm on the Agricultural Society land south of Bunyip Recreation Ground. In the last 2 newsletters we have shared Komo's responses to some FAQs about this solar farm: Here is another question...

How will neighbouring properties be affected?

Solar farms traditionally have a relatively low physical impact on community and environment. The project team will look to engage early with neighbouring properties and the community to ensure any impact can be reduced in the planning stage. Any increase in traffic to the site will generally be limited to construction of the solar farm. This may temporarily affect local traffic, but these movements will be confined to standard construction hours. Vegetation screening to help minimise visual impacts has been planted along the outer perimeter, providing suitable aesthetics to the layout of the site.

Another one of our Community Engagement goals is to

"Inform the Bunyip community about how they can reduce their energy consumption, including more affordable solutions"

No burning off during July in Cardinia Shire

Cardinia Shire residents are reminded that no burning off is allowed across the shire during the month of July without a permit.

This regulation applies every year to all zones across Cardinia Shire.

Lighting open-air fires in July has been prohibited since a new local law relating to open air fires came into effect last year.

This rule is in place to prevent excessive smoke being produced due to wet fuel.

Bureau of Meteorology (BOM) data indicates that on average, a combination of weather factors cause bushfire fuel to be wetter in July than in other months of the year. These factors include high rainfall, low temperatures and high relative humidity.

The wetter your bushfire fuel is, the more smoke it tends to create. This poses a risk to people's health.

Infringements sent to 2022 State election non-voters

Infringement notices will be sent this week to over 220,000 Victorians who either didn't respond to the Victorian Electoral Commission's (VEC's) request for an explanation or didn't have a valid reason for failing to vote in the 2022 State election.

Close to 300,000 Victorians were sent an 'Apparent failure to vote notice' by the VEC in April. Of those, almost 70,000 have been excused for valid reasons. People who did not respond to the 'Apparent failure to vote notice, or who did not provide a valid and sufficient excuse, will be issued an infringement of \$92.


Almost 95% of the infringement notice recipients had not responded to the 'Apparent failure to vote notice', which gave them an opportunity to explain why they appeared not to have voted. People who receive an infringement notice must respond within 35 days – by either paying the fine, requesting an internal review, or electing to go to court. Acting Electoral Commissioner Dana Fleming is urging people who receive an infringement notice to take it seriously.

'The most important thing is that you respond to the notice before the deadline – otherwise you could be issued a penalty reminder notice, which carries the original penalty plus an additional administration fee,' Ms Fleming said.

The VEC encourages non-voters who are unsure what to do, or require assistance throughout any stage of the infringements process, to call 1300 551 575 or visit vec.vic.gov.au/voting/fines-and-reviews

Voting in State elections is compulsory in Victoria, and to make sure no-one misses a future election, the VEC encourages all enrolled voters to sign up for VoterAlert, our free SMS and email reminder service. The service alerted 2.4 million Victorians about key election dates in last year's State election. To sign up visit vec.vic.gov.au/voteralert


