

Have your say: Garfield North Community Centre

Cardinia Shire Council welcomes your feedback on the concept plans for a new community centre in Garfield North. Feedback is open until 30 June 2022.

After strong advocacy from the local community following the 2019 bushfires, the \$2.3 million project will be jointly funded by the Victorian Government's Growing Suburbs Fund and Cardinia Shire Council's Capital Works Program.

As part of this successful grant submission, concept plans for a new multipurpose community facility within Cannibal Creek Reserve, Garfield North have been created. We are seeking user group and community feedback on these plans to help finalise the design.

A lack of community facilities and places for social connection were magnified as issues during the community's recovery from the Bunyip Complex Fires, which occurred in March 2019. As the community recovers from the impacts of this natural disaster, the Garfield North Community Centre project is one part of a longterm, multilayered social support and community development process to support the recovery of the community, now and into the future.

The new community centre will be used by existing recreation and community groups and provide a muchneeded central meeting place for the Garfield North community.

Brag held a successful Community Energy Roadshow on Thursday 26th May in the Bunyip Hall.

Speakers included Renewable Energy Expert, Dr Moragh Mackay as well as a representative of RACV Solar who outlined how his company's bulk buy process can provide benefits to the customer as well as the local community.

Councillor Graeme Moore explained how the Cardinia Shire is tackling the transition to renewable energy and supporting the work of BRAG in the shire.

The main purpose of a men's shed is to provide for the health and well being of the men attending the shed. Assisting to reduce the social loneliness, isolation and depression caused through unemployment, retrenchment,

retirement or other life changing conditions. Sheds provide a safe and friendly environment where the men can talk, learn new

skills pass on their life skills and be a part of a bigger community and be involved in meaningful activities and projects.



Men's sheds offer many different things to the men that attend, but most men appreciate that the biggest part of attending is the mate ship or friendships that are formed. Being unemployed, retrenched or retired, many men no longer have someone to talk to, be it sports, politics, health, or just a sounding board for the many changes that are occurring within their lives. The friendships that are formed at a shed allow these discussions to occur. The participation in meaningful activities or projects also gives confidence and pride and a sense of accomplishment in completing these activities and projects.

TALKIN'FISHIN' TIME REVEALS ALL EVENTUALLY.

There's nothing like a fisherman's treasure hunt through an old, "no"! A very old tackle shop in any country, possibly hidden away in a small city laneway or in any obscure country town. It gives you the feeling of an Indiana Jones on a quest to find a long lost antique lure or fly hidden away and maybe forgotten about, just waiting for you to revive its effectiveness on the rivers again.


The smell of old cedar wooden draws, leather handles still hanging on by that one solitary brass tack. Mix it with the odour of spilt oils and scents and with the dust and remnants of feather and fur filling the air when you slide them open for the first time in maybe many years. A search for the perfect imitation fly finds a gem, excitement turns to disappointment only to discover it's a dry dead moth that got trapped and has been there quite some time. What you usually find is unidentifiable fishing reel parts without their packaging, springs and screws and other strange gears and knobs, allocated to the file of the 'unknown' draw.

I love the old cabinetry, topographic maps in long wooden narrow draws, collectables and expensive reels kept behind glass with lock and key. Fly boxes and fisherman's trinkets and stream-craft hardware displayed in a gold light, like jewellery. A wall of lures and tackle defies gravity and probably a few building regulations as well. Tackle boxes, nets suspended, bait tins, creels and landing nets too. Long rods laying across tables at 45° to the floor surrounded by windowed boxes of 100's of flies, and the rest standing upright to the ceiling in their racks. Rod guides of gold and silver sparkle like a chandelier in the sunlight of fine dust particles floating in the rays of light coming through the ceiling skylight.

Creeping around the store undetected is not possible, the time worn wooden floorboards creaking gives away your position every time, the store keeper knowing every toned note by heart. Hopefully your search goes on without other customers lurking around you, there's always a reason to keep your spy eye on them and they on you, in case of a treasure find and spotted that needs to be fought over in the bargains bins. The unmistakeable aroma of the bait freezer section of the shop, the stains on the floor from spills and the last power cuts disastrous result, seems always happens on a long weekend eve. The spot still sticky from when 'that kid' dropped and split a bottle of tuna oil at his dad's feet, that'll never be forgotten or forgiven, blow flies still return each summer, every year like a pilgrimage. Allow a few hours to look around thoroughly, you don't want to miss anything.

Once I missed out on a box of 140 handmade Tasmanian flies, by two days, sold for next to nothing at a second hand dealer shop, and if you can't tell, I never got over it.

But while I'm still breathing, the hunt goes on.....





Cannibal Creek Winery was abuzz on Thursday morning, 5 May, as West Gippsland Progress Association (WGPA) launched the West Gippsland Food & Tourism Strategy in partnership with Cardinia Shire Council with a champagne breakfast.

Hosted by Cam Smith, who has the longest-running food show in Australia, his show Eat It on 3RRR at noon on Sundays.

Erin Polson presented the key outtakes that are already completed or underway in the strategy and showcased what key outcomes were yet to be delivered. Over 70 guests, including local businesses, tourism bodies, media, and Council representatives, including the Mayor Cr. Jeff Springfield and other Councillors were delighted and engaged to see the strategy's progress.

As stated in the Pakenham Gazette - Cardinia Shire Bunyip Ward councillor Graeme Moore said he will advocate for funding for the West Gippsland Food and Tourism Strategy. "I congratulate this group for getting together, and I'm here to support them, "Mr Moore said.

"I've always believed these townships would make a really great tourism area, and this is the opportunity. "I can see something positive happening."




