Charging and battery safety

Many portable devices today are powered by rechargeable lithium-ion batteries. These types of batteries pose a higher risk of fire than others.



Lithium-ion batteries are popular because they are light-weight and long lasting compared to other rechargeable batteries. You will find them in many devices such as phones, tablets, power banks, laptop computers, toys, appliances and tools, as well as mobility equipment such as e-bikes and e-scooters. They can also be found in many other modern devices that need power.

What's the difference between lithium-ion batteries and lithium batteries?

Don't confuse replaceable lithium batteries with lithium-ion batteries

Lithium Batteries are single use only

Lithium batteries are not rechargeable and you need to buy new ones once they run out of charge. You might use lithium batteries in torches, television remote controls, some gaming controllers, smoke alarms and digital cameras.

Lithium batteries are most commonly sold alongside normal single use batteries in similar sizes like AA, AAA, C, D or 9v batteries. They can also be found as 'button' batteries like CR2032 or A76/ LR44 as used in watches, heart rate monitors or memory backup power supply in computers.

Lithium-ion batteries are rechargeable

The construction of lithium-ion batteries is very different to single use lithium batteries. You will usually find them in just about any modern device that can be plugged into a charger. Besides mobile phones and appliances, they can also be found in e-bikes, e-scooters, mobility scooters and larger versions in electric cars.

They are often larger and usually in a shape to suit the device they are meant to power. Though not always, they are often not meant to be removed from the device by the consumer. That is, they must be serviced by a technician. Lithium-ion batteries are sometimes also called Li-ion batteries.

How do I know if my device or battery is damaged

Thermal runaway events involving batteries can occur rapidly and can often be quite violent, involving toxic, flammable smoke and vapours, flames, and metal projectiles.

Don't use batteries or devices that show signs of swelling or bulging, leaking, overheating, or signs of mechanical damage (cracked, dented, punctured, or crushed).

Warning signs include:

- Strong odours
- Discolouration, blistering, bulging, or swelling of the casing
- Leaking
- Heating up and feeling extremely hot to touch
- Abnormal popping, hissing or crackling sounds
- Smoke and fumes

Never touch a swollen or ruptured device or battery with bare hands as the heat and/or chemicals can cause severe burns.

Team Boganarama Kidney Kar Rally Update - March 2023

Days to rally start: 132 Funds raised: \$579 / \$3000

Well, where to begin... It's certainly been an eventful and sad couple of months, unfortunately just not on the Kidney Kar Rally front.

Warren's sister Terri was diagnosed with Stage 4 cancer in October 2022, which meant a fair chunk of Warren's time was occupied with numerous trips to the hospital supporting his sister. During this period, Warren's father also had a couple of hospital stays due to falls at home, which again involved multiple hospital visits and organising things for him. Sadly, Warren's sister's health declined quite quickly and she sadly passed away at the start of March. It has been a very sad and tough time.

Although this has understandably taken priority over the car in the last few months, it has reaffirmed to us how important it is for fundraising and awareness of health related causes. Fundraising for worthy causes was a big part of Terri's life, and we would like to continue to carry this baton with our fundraising efforts for Kidney Health Australia and to raise as much money as possible for this extremely valuable cause!

In spite of everything, we still have managed to make some progress. Waz has been responsible for the cosmetics, turning a tired old Jag the colour of a placenta, into the rally-worthy machine it is now. The big reveal will come later...

Meanwhile, I've been underneath dealing with some unfortunate squeaks, rattles and knocks - not something that's ideal on corrugated dirt roads. For those unfamiliar with the front suspension setup on a 1987 Jaguar XJ6, we've attached some helpful photos to show the state of our progress.

Reassembly will continue promptly, and has only required the purchase of a 60-tonne hydraulic press.

If you don't know these named personalities take the time to research them, I think you'll be surprised how much they've influenced either the gear you use today or how you fish with it.

Many Australian owned companies developed new Fishing gear, Rods, reels and tackle to suit the specific regions and fish species of Australia's waterways. Homage has to be paid to their ingenuity and design, the personalities they employed or sponsored to promote their products gave the companies a boost in sales and a greater public awareness, as well as enhancing the profiles of those fishing with their products, a win for both parties.

Those companies include: Jarvis Walker Pty Ltd, Juro, Alvey Reels, this also includes smaller successful lure manufacturers that made an impact on the industry, those like Wonder Lures, and JJ's Stump Jumpers, Halco Lures. All these were the precursors to today's huge cottage industry of homemade lures with the added advantages of new techniques and epoxy resins, injection moulding of soft plastics and coloured additives.

This is a specially designed table setting which seats eight persons and allows wheelchair access either side of the table.



BRAG UPDATE JUNE 2023



"LET'S GIVE BUNYIP SOMETHING TO BRAG ABOUT!"

OUR VISION:

Bunyip and District will become an environmentally sustainable, carbon neutral community.

OUR MISSION:

To reduce Bunyip and District's carbon footprint.

Part of our Community Engagement goal is:

"informing the Bunyip Community about how they can reduce their energy consumption..."

SOLAR FARM FOR BUNYIP:

BRAG is working with Komo Energy to inves tigate the feasibility of a community solar farm in Bunyip. The Bunyip Community Solar Farm is the result of the collaboration between the Bunyip Renewables Action Group (BRAG), Yarra Valley Community Power Hub and Komo Energy, with a joint vision of reducing the community's carbon footprint by facilitating the transition to renewable energy. It is a modest 800 kW (0.8 MW) solar farm with 1 MW DC solar capacity installed as well as a 2 hour battery (1.6 MWh) to be built on land south of the recreation reserve. We would like to hear from the community, and in particular, the neighbours of any concerns or considerations.

FAQ

Why in Bunyip?

Community Solar Farms with storage can be developed in almost any regional town in Australia. Indeed effort is being made to do so in dozens of towns already.

Grant funded: Bunyip Renewable Action Group joined the Yarra Valley Community Power Hub in 2021, which was funded by Sustainability Victoria. This provided grant funding to evaluate sites, develop a lease agreement and commence early engineering to assess suitability for the local grid. The project viability continues to be tested as the project develops.

By developing a community owned mid-scale solar and storage project in Bunyip, the town will take responsibility for electricity usage in the town, rather than it being a problem far away.

Why on this particular site?

The planned site has a few distinct advantages:

- It is relatively flat and accessible.
- A strong powerline is located adjacent
- The site is close to town where the electricity infrastructure is still strong enough to receive power from a solar and storage asset
- The land is not currently being used for more productive uses
- The current land owners are agreeable to hosting a community solar farm

Bunyip - Garfield Probus Club

The Australian Garden was transformed from a sand mine and scrub into a botanical garden of international standing that shows the diversity, beauty and the use of Australian plants in so many different areas that cover an area of 300 hectares.

We wandered in all different directions to take in the beauty of the many gardens and water features before meeting up to go on a tour around the area by a open- air bus on which the guide gave us lots of information about so many things along the way. It was certainly a very enjoyable day.

COCKROACHES CAUSE ALLERGIES By the KOOL Man

Cockroaches cause allergies and threatens mental health besides affecting the physical well being of human beings. Researchers conducted by various bodies indicates that nearly a million people in Melbourne are allergic to pests in general and cockroaches in particular. Exposure to Cockroach allergens such as Chitin (the hard shell) and Cockroach skin can mean a severe asthma attack for asthma patients. While for others the mere presence of live Cockroaches moving about in the house can produce a kind of psychological "allergic" reaction.



People allergic to Cockroaches have a range of reactions, depending on their level of sensitivity. Mild reactions include rhinitis or running nose and, in some cases, skin irritation. But in a very sensitive person, difficulty in breathing and even death from shock can result. For shellfish lovers, a Cockroach allergy can be serious news, as Cockroaches and certain shellfish like prawns, crabs and lobsters can predispose a person to become sensitive to another.

Pest Consultant, John Sheeran of *Kool Pest Control* says, "people simply cannot continue to view Cockroaches as just a nasty nuisance." It is believed that the steady increase in the incidence of allergy over the past 25 years in Melbourne has been partially the result of the trend to make homes more compact. People over the age of 30 have the most serious allergic reaction to insects due to chronic, long term exposure. In fact, the incidence among women who have traditionally spent more time in the house is higher.

Mr Sheeran adds, "that since the allergens that cause the problems are in cast off skins and casings, it is imperative that Cockroaches are not only eliminated but removed as part of pest control measures. Also, for some people Cockroach antigen shots might be recommended to reduce any allergic reaction."

COCKROACH DISH

Take one Cockroach, marinate in wine for a day, fry it in beef fat and smother it with chocolate – it taste delicious, according to China's Yangcheng daily newspaper. Cockroach cuisine as developed by a German Biologist, is more nutritious than beef, and could be adapted to include fried Cockroach, Cockroachstudded pancakes or a simple Cockroach porridge, the weekend edition said. "With the right cooking method, it could be a welcome new dish on the family table!!!" a local pest technician added.

BILL'S WATER TROUGHS

Early in the last century horses were still used to transport the greater percentage of people and goods wherever they needed to go. By the 1930s, Melbourne's population was around one million and Sydney's around 1.3 million.

Animal welfare was not a top priority at the time and public sources of water were not as plentiful as they are today. Such water authorities as were in existence at the time were mostly concerned with the supply of water to the human population. There was also the great depression and in the later years of the decade, drought. Providing water for animals was logistically difficult.

Enter the Bills. George (Joe) Bills and his wife Annis saw a need and took action. George was born in England and later migrated to New Zealand and then Australia. Benefitting from a successful mattress- making enterprise, the couple supported the SPCA (later the RSPCA) and in the early 1900s began the installation of a number of horse troughs around Melbourne.

These concrete water troughs were produced for the wellbeing of thirsty horses and some provided lower drinking containers on the side for dogs and smaller animals. Probably the local wildlife found them handy as well.

After Joe's death in 1927 (Annis predeceased him) under the terms of his will, a trust was established and hundreds of horse troughs were constructed and installed in Australia (mostly in Victoria and New South Wales) and overseas.



Applications could be made to the trust and a trough would be provided for free.

The foundation and water source was supplied by the recipient. Each trough noted the donors as Annis & George Bills.

Ultimately with the move to mechanised transport, the need for the troughs diminished and installation had ceased by the end of the second world war.

There are many of these troughs still in existence and once you become aware of them, you'll start noticing just how many have survived all the changes and population growth of the last 100 odd years. They are a rather unique and interesting piece of Australian history.
