

Easter is just around the corner, which means CFA volunteers are about to hit Victorian streets and rattle tins to fundraise for the annual Royal Children's Hospital (RCH) Good Friday Appeal.

For 73 years, CFA has been a proud major fundraising partner of the Good Friday Appeal, raising over \$37 million since 1951.

Last year, CFA brigades helped raise a massive \$1,606,287 for the appeal by volunteers shaking tins on fire trucks, standing at traffic lights, in camping grounds and at clubs.

Today, CFA Deputy Chief Officer Alen Slijepcevic was joined by Caroline Springs brigade members 1st Lieutenant David Topp plus firefighters Jake Busutill and Stephanie Robson to help launch the appeal.

They were joined by faces of the appeal Emily and Finley and their families.

Caroline Springs brigade has raised \$96,434.47 in total for the Good Friday Appeal, edging closer to the \$100,000 milestone.

Captain Anthony Jenkins is the new Collection Group Manager for the brigade.

The father-of-five also has a strong connection with the hospital, one of his daughters helped by the team there.

My daughter, just 18 months then, had her finger cut off and reattached by the plastics team at the Royal Childrens after an accident with a door. She is 13 now and you'd barely know it's been reattached," he said.

"I am so grateful for the appeal and the hospital especially after seeing first-hand the good work they do. They make you feel so comfortable as a parent too."

DCO Slijepcevic said he was extremely proud of CFA's long-standing relationship with the Good Friday Appeal.

"The remarkable thing about our volunteers is that not only do they give up their time to volunteer with CFA, they also happily give their time to fundraise for causes like the Appeal," he said.

"It's a cause close to the hearts of many of our members – whether they were former patients at the hospital or have family who have been touched by the RCH's world-class service.

"We're incredibly proud of our members' continued fundraising efforts and pleased to once again support the Good Friday Appeal in 2024."

Free green and storm-related waste drop-offs for residents impacted by the storms

Residents impacted by the recent storms can continue to drop-off their green waste for free, as well as other storm-related general waste, until **Tuesday 30 April**.

Transfer stations in Pakenham and Lysterfield will continue to accept residential amounts of green waste including tree branches and trunks (up to 30 centimetres wide and 1 metre long), weeds, grass clippings, leaves, and flowers. This also now includes other storm-related waste such as building debris.

Residents must present photo ID as proof of residence within Cardinia Shire to access the free service. Waste will only be accepted from residential vehicles and trailers; commercial business operators cannot use this service.

The annual Stan Henwood Award honours the late Stan Henwood OAM for his lifetime contribution to the Tynong community and the municipality, and recognises individuals who have made outstanding, long-term contributions to the local community.

The award's namesake, the late Stan Henwood, was heavily involved in his hometown of Tynong. He volunteered for and was a member of the Tynong Hall Committee, the Tynong Recreation Reserve Committee and the Make A Wish Foundation, Tynong Tennis Club, the West Gippsland Tennis Association, Tynong Fire Brigade and Tynong Progress Association. Beyond Cardinia Shire's borders, he received a Medal from the Prime Minister for service to sport and an Order of Australia for Service to the Community.

Nominations must be submitted online via the SmartyGrants portal, which will require the nominator to register an account before they can prepare and submit a nomination form. Nominees must have made a significant contribution to community services in Cardinia Shire, have not previously received the award and must not have been a Cardinia Shire Councillor within the last four years.

The Award winner will be announced and celebrated at Council's National Volunteer Week reception in May 2024.

Nostalgia is a great thing, but let's not be ridiculous about it, the combination of old and new works well, some of the new hi-tech we live with and use is amazing stuff that is a pleasure to use and will be the next generations nostalgia to wonder about.

Rods, Reels, Lures, Lines and Flies all have the technology magic wand waved over them to give us the great gear we use today. We are well past the fishing days of Tom Sawyer and Huck Finn, but they both have something we will never get back, youth and time!, so enjoy it while you have it and make the most of both.

Cardinia Shire seniors invited to new Care Finder information sessions

Cardinia Shire seniors are invited to attend new Care Finder information sessions next month to learn about and get help with accessing My Aged Care services. Aiming to assist local seniors who don't have anyone to help them at home, the Care Finder program is a free service that explains and helps seniors to navigate the process of applying for My Aged Care support services, such as cleaning, shopping, and personal care.

Cardinia Shire Mayor Councillor Jack Kowarzik encouraged local seniors to attend the upcoming information sessions.

"To access My Aged Care support services, seniors need an assessment to determine their individual needs, eligibility, and service suitability. I've heard the process can be a bit overwhelming for those who have no prior knowledge about it.

"That's why Council has partnered with Care Finder providers Wintringham, Monash Health, and Care Connect, to host two free information sessions in March and help educate and support our senior community members to get started," Mayor Kowarzik said.

"If you are, or you know of, a Cardinia Shire senior who wants to learn about My Aged Care and Care Finder, please book your seat to attend one of the two events.

"It's a great opportunity to get important information about accessing aged care services that may be available to you or your loved ones. Attendees will also get one-on-one support and advice specific to their needs and receive help to start on their application to access My Aged Care support."

Pharmacy Shows Canine Care

Bunyip pharmacy has been raising funds through in store raffles to support care for injured, neglected and abandoned dogs through "Rescue With Love " an organisation founded in 2005 which is solely funded by public donations and which is dedicated to rescuing and providing medical care to dogs in need. In 2010, R.W.L. received the " Victorian Organisation of the Year " Award. Since its inception R.W.L. has rescued thousands of needy dogs. The Bunyip pharmacy, true to its mission does not sell products which are tested on animals.

Belinda Brasier, "Front of Store and Digital Marketer" at the pharmacy has a burning passion to facilitate such care by personally making monthly donations to "Rescue With Love". She said the pharmacy has donated goods in excess of \$600 towards the raffle.

"R.W.L. takes the seniors that no one wants, the sick that are surrendered to Pounds with a rescue being their only way out. They have all their vet work done and then find them a compatible home. Sometimes a vet clinic will contact R.W.L. about a client whose pet is sick or needs surgery, but the owners can't afford it, but love their pets. If they are able they help out with the surgery expenses and medication," said Belinda.

Belinda recently found 2 Shih Tzu dogs for sale on Facebook. She and her mum visited the seller and bought one which was in a very neglected condition, needing urgent medical attention. The owners, an elderly couple was in hospital and left no one to take care of their dogs. Following veterinary treatment and grooming care, this dog was allocated to a loving forever home and is now living a happy luxurious life.

The Bunyip pharmacy will have a special morning tea on Thursday 29th February, where the lucky raffle winner will be drawn.

Kinder Registration Now Free

It's now free for Cardinia Shire families to register their children for 3-year-old and 4-year-old community kindergarten via Council's registration portal.

From 9 February 2024, the \$31 registration fee is no longer being charged, making kindergarten registration free for families.

Cardinia Shire Council has received additional funding from the State Government's Administrative Support Grants to contribute to the administration cost of operating the kindergarten Central Registration and Enrolment Scheme (CRES), enabling Council to now provide this service to the community free of charge.

Cardinia Shire Mayor Councillor Jack Kowarzik said the additional funding, which forms part of the State Government's Best Start, Best Life reforms, was great news for the Cardinia community.

"The kindergarten Central Registration and Enrolment Scheme is a vital service delivered by Council that ensures fair access to funded kindergarten programs for all families," Mayor Kowarzik said. "The increased funding is a win for our community as it means Council will be able to continue supporting families to access funded kindergarten programs through a simple and inclusive registration process, at absolutely no cost to them."

Mayor Kowarzik said parents could register their child for 3-year-old or 4-year-old kindergarten at any time using Council's online kindergarten portal. "Cardinia Shire is home to around 2,000 kinder-aged children, and we're excited to be able to offer each of them free community kindergarten, and now free registration as well."




