

Unique Service Medal For Longwarry Firefighter

A unique Service Medal, the only one of its kind in Victoria, Australia and perhaps even the world was presented to a Longwarry fire fighter last Wednesday the 8th of May.

Ninety four year old Duncan Holman, who lives at Hillview Aged Care in Bunyip was presented with a medal for the magic, magnificent milestone of eighty years of service to the CFA by District 9 Operations Officer, Emma Conway. The presentation which took place in the Eileen Dawes Activity Centre at Hillview was attended by family, fire brigade officials, Hillview residents and staff, friends of Duncan and a news crew from Channel Nine.

Duncan, at the age of 14 joined the Country Fire Brigade Board in 1938. When the CFA began in 1941, he became one of its first members. His official record at CFA headquarters shows Duncan as Volunteer number 1092030 becoming a member of the Drouin Fire Brigade on the 1st November, 1938. In 1948 Duncan transferred to the Longwarry Brigade and has continued as a member since.

He has a distinguished service record at Longwarry where he served as Captain for 36 years. Duncan was a foundation member of the popular Longwarry Sunday Market Committee which is a brigade fundraiser. Duncan's late wife Betty, was also active within the Longwarry Fire Brigade where she served for 36 years. His Son Peter, also a member of the fire

brigade has notched up 48 years of service which, with father Duncan is a combined total of 128 years.

The 80 years of service medal, similar to the 70 and 75 years service medals, had to be individually minted as Duncan was the first one to reach these milestones. There were no such milestones previously reached. When Chief Fire Officer of the CFA Mr Euan Ferguson presented Duncan with his 70 years service medal, he paused, looked closely at the medal and said "I've never seen one of these before".

It's absolutely amazing and mind boggling to imagine someone reaching such a distinguished service of 80 years to an organisation. To you Duncan Holman I dips me lid!

An interview with John Anderson

Give a brief description about yourself and your occupation?

I'm a resident of Bunyip, now retired but running a beef farming property

Tell me about the Blazeaid organisation and it's current presence in Bunyip.

BlazeAid is a volunteer-based organisation that works with families and individuals in rural Australia after natural disasters such as fires and floods. Working alongside the rural families, our volunteers help to rebuild fences and other structures that have been damaged or destroyed. BlazeAid commenced in Bunyip on March 12.

What role do you play in Blazeaid?

I am the coordinator for the BlazeAid Bunyip camp

Can you give me some statistics on the work of Blazeaid in fire affected areas from beginning to now

- 600km of fences were lost in the Bunyip fires.
- 169 properties have registered with BlazeAid for assistance with fence clearing and replacement.
- Approximately 450 volunteers have registered to assist with this task.
- Since March 12, BlazeAid volunteers have cleared approximately 270km of fence lines and installed approximately 60km of replacement fences.

Some people have been asking why isn't all of this fencing replacement covered by insurance.

That is a question that the property owners would have to answer. I am unsure of the insurance details for properties, but many were uninsured for fencing

Are the Wintery conditions going to slow the work down?

It will make the task a little more difficult, but even the recent rains have not slowed the teams down

How many crews are currently engaged in fence and other works?

It varies form day to day, but most days there are at least 4 crews out in the field

How many in a crew?

The average crew size is six volunteers



What is required of a crew?

Crews can clear fence lines of burnt wire, therefore making the line ready for new fences. They can then rebuild the fences.

If someone wants to get involved, what can they expect will be required

of them?

A willingness to work, and a good sense of humour. BlazeAid caters for all skill levels, so previous experience with fencing is not required as there are many tasks from rolling up damaged wire to installing fence posts and everything in between. For those that do not want to go on the fence lines, BlazeAid needs people to assist with catering for the volunteers.

Who do people contact if they want to help?

Anyone wishing to volunteer can contact me on 0412 382184

Where have some of the people come from to get involved?

We have had volunteers joining us from all states plus a strong contingent from all over Victoria

How many are currently involved?

On a daily basis, at least 20 on the fences lines plus up to 12 in the kitchens

When do you anticipate the jobs will be complete?

This camp will run for at least another 3 months

Tell me about the catering

The catering has been first class. The first meal of the day, Breakfast, has been very well catered for by a team led by Therese Baker and Sue Neilson. The breakfast team also lays out all the ingredients for the fencing crews to make their own lunch if they are not catered for by the farms they are working on. Another crew comes in mid afternoon to prepare afternoon tea for the crews returning from fencing task. Dinner has been catered for by a number of community groups from around the district and it is first class.

Currently, what is your greatest need?

Our greatest need is the continuing supply of volunteers

How much time do you spend per day or week with Blazeaid?

I spend around 10 hours each day on BlazeAid, 7 days a week

An interview with John Anderson cont'd.

Describe what is a typical day for you?

Arrive at 7.00 to meet the crews. 8.00 Muster and compulsory safety briefing for all crews.

After 8.00 I will visit farms and determine what jobs should be scheduled.

I will visit the crews during the day to make sure they have everything they need to get the job done.

There are frequent meetings at the Tonimbuk relief centre, liaison with other groups and updates to various stakeholders. There are numerous phone calls during the day as well.

I am back at the camp at around 3.00 to meet the teams as they return and get an update of the progress they have made. When all crews have returned, I check availability for the next day then schedule the next days jobs. I join the volunteers for dinner at 6.00 and then that's it for the day.









Dear Editor

I would like to express my appreciation of the community for their outstanding support of Blaze Aid and the communities who were affected by the devastating fires of March this year.

I have met people who have travelled from distances such as Adelaide, Mildura, Geelong, Charlton and further afield to come assist in any way they can. Some people choose to help on the farms by clearing burnt fence lines and preparing the site for new fences. Some people who have travelled here have stayed for weeks camped at the recreation reserve, only to leave and come back and assist again.

People have stepped up regularly to be on rosters to help with washing, afternoon tea, breakfast and dinners.

People travel from Pakenham, Officer, Drouin, Warragul, Maryknoll, Nar Nar Goon, Koo Wee Rup, Longwarry, Labertouche, and Tonimbuk regularly to be bright and early for the "brekky shift" which starts at 6:30am or to

help prepare, cook and serve dinner at the Bunyip Hall which commences at 3:00pm and finishes at 7:30pm.

I have seen pensioners come into Blaze Aid HQ at the Bunyip Netball/Tennis club and donate boxes of eggs, fresh fruit and vegetables, milk and other daily food staples. I have watched as people have put up their hands to purchase much needed food and toiletry items to help cater for our fencing volunteers. This includes people who themselves have been fire affected, many who have lost everything, some their livelihood and some whose property such as fences and outbuildings were destroyed. The businesses who have donated their goods, services and time to help cater for the needs of many others.

In this day and age which seems to focus on the doom and gloom in our society, it restores my faith in the human race and I can say very proudly that I am very honoured to be part of this great wider community.

The railway towns of Bunyip, Garfield, Tynong and Nar Nar Goon were each formed following construction of the Gippsland rail line, situated in the foothills to the Dandenong Ranges, and are inherently linked to the future growth of Melbourne, the south east region, and the Gippsland corridor. In particular, they provide residents in these areas with access to a range of retail, community, civic, health and entertainment facilities and services, whilst also providing business and employment opportunities. TALKIN' ... FISHIN' OMEO REVISITED

Again my Mate and I visited Omeo for a return fishing weekend after a 19 month absence. This time however after 12 months of little or no rain, you guessed right, it bucketed down, from Thursday midday and continued until the Friday morning, dumping 85mm overnight.

Not to be selfish, as we know the farmers sure need it, but couldn't it have waited just one more week? Yeah we could have gone sooner, but who knew 'that' was coming? Luckily we decided on an upgrade this trip to a Motel, a basic room but... hot shower, TV, heater and comfortable beds. Unlike last time, short on cooking facilities microwave sausages are a whole new culinary experience, they look like grey Aliens made into hotdogs, and taste like stew in plastic wrapping. Strictly pub meals this time, done beautifully and takeaway with coffee.

After arrival the next day's plans were to meet up with the river at Anglers Rest, it looked like a fast flowing cup of coffee, what a letdown, but you do the best with what you have. So spinning and wet fly was restricted to the clearer and slower water close into the banks. Surprisingly results were 2 fish landed (brown trout) and 2 lost on hook-up. Showers continued periodically throughout the day, so as the cold night air came on, that steak and veg's with chips and gravy, was waiting for us at the pub and beckoned.

Next day, Saturday, after a good feed and decent night's sleep a fresh start was warranted. On advice from a local farmer, who promised the river would clear up overnight, we planned to return to the same spot, but first we'd try the Mitta Mitta river,*Note to self...buy a 4WD. This is not forgiving country, roads were rough, slippery, muddy and downright impassable in some places especially when it's raining. The river produced no follows or rises, and we showed just as much interest as the fish. So we cooked up a 'Bunnings Lunch' (snags in bread) and coffee, then headed back up to the high plains.

Sure enough, amazingly the river was clear as...cold air chilled us all day but welcome sunny patches produced 5 trout up to 400mm the biggest, all catch and release, the real release was stress levels! The day over, the return to town wasn't without drama, paddocks filled with many



horses roaming free, cattle free-ranging on the roadside and 2 wild deer threatening to make an impression on our vehicle, (big buggers) and rock falls to avoid.

Sunday pack up makes you think "why did I bring so much stuff"? Answer, "You have too much stuff" at least that's what my wife calls it! I call it valuable and essential fishing accessories.



Cancer Council Victoria is working to reduce the impact of bowel cancer by increasing screening rates in under-screened communities living in South Eastern Melbourne. This initiative follows new data from the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare that indicates screening in this area is below the state average.

Bowel cancer is Australia's second biggest cancer killer, yet if found early, 90% of bowel cancers can be treated successfully. The National Bowel Cancer Screening Program sends a free screening test to the homes to people aged 50-74 every two years to detect the early signs of bowel cancer.

Burning wood develops a build-up of soot and creosote, which have the potential to start chimney fires. Please have them inspected and if needed cleaned.

The cooler weather also means an increase in the use of clothes driers. It is important that before each use you clean the lint filter. Lint is easily combustible and is a major cause of fires in the home laundry.

Fire restrictions have now been lifted meaning that burning off is permissible in certain areas. Before you light up please check the Cardinia Shire Open Air Burning Policy using the following link

Doin' the Nooj.

Life can get hectic – work, the kids, the farm, sports, family etc etc. Every now and then you feel the need to step away from all that and reset...

CTRL+ALT+DELETE as such. So when I only have a couple of hours to unwind, one of my favourite rides is a loop through to Noojee, and more often than not to the Noojee Pub.

Coming from Garfield I'll usually jump on to Labertouche Road, just north of the highway after refuelling at the Caltex service station just near the flash new overpass at Longwarry North. From Labertouche Road after a couple of km's I then head up Jacksons Track. Despite what the name suggests, this is a good sealed road with some fantastic scenery, a rolling gradual climb eventually taking you through ever-scenic Jindivick, a couple of tricky 'twisty bits' and through to Neerim South. Take note though that just out of Jindivick take the tight left hander where the naturally continues on as Jindivick-Neerim S rd. Taking a left onto Main Neerim Road, it's a leisurely ride along the hill tops through Neerim and Neerim Junction where you continue climbing in elevation with some amazing views east towards Noojee to distract you. It can get interesting up there when riding my Super Blackbird 1100xx where the full fairing acts a bit like a spinnaker in a strong crosswind and you wrestle the thing to stay in a straight line. Regardless, as you continue north you come to the rapid downhill and the loooong sweeping right hander which feels like it almost loops back on itself as you quickly make your way down into the valley surrounded by rolling green hills and the Alpine Trout

Farm on your left – great smoked trout by the way!

By now you're on the Mt Baw Baw Tourist Road and only a couple of km's out of Noojee. Just before Noojee though, hang a right up a short gravel road to check out the old Noojee Trestle bridge – a great piece of old-school timber engineering.

As you cruise through town, swing right and you'll spot the Noojee Hotel up ahead on a bend. This is a must see for any one cruising through the region. Not sure about the T-Rex out the front, but the 'Nooj' as it's known has to have one of the best decks of any pub out the back. High up on the hill and overlooking the Latrobe River it can't be beaten for a cold beer on a warm summer's day...just brilliant! But without letting the mood take you, best you have a light beer because there's still some riding to be had. Heading a few kilometres further up the Mt Baw Baw Tourist Road, turn right into Willow Grove Road and head towards Fumina, Hill End and Willow Grove. This smaller road doesn't typically carry too much traffic and takes you through some fantastic bush providing plenty of opportunity to scrub the outer edges of your tires with its smooth flowing turns. As always though be on the lookout for critters and any leaf litter or fallen bark, especially first thing after heavy winds.

From Willow Grove I'll then generally take a leisurely cruise the 'back way' along Old Sale Road and head back towards Drouin. Arriving home I reckon I've managed to blow the cobwebs out of the bike, had some 'me' time, explored this fantastic region a little and supported the local economy to boot!... 2.5 hours well spent in my book!

Next month ...I've swapped steeds and taken a few mates out along the brilliant Grand Ridge Road... Cheers.

Blazeaid Bunyip Volunteers Maintain Support By Roman Kulkewycz

It's been nearly 2 months since the devastating fires of Black Saturday and many people have returned back to their usual daily routines. However assistance to the victims is still being given by the volunteer crews of Blazeaid Bunyip who go out each day for 8 hour stints rebuilding fences for the affected farmers. There are those who go out into the field and back home there is the support crew at the base at the Tennis Rooms in Bunyip consisting of about 20 volunteers who are involved in preparing the 3 meals each day for the volunteers. Coordinating the whole operation is John Anderson of Bunyip. John has committed most of his waking hours to organising and ensuring the smooth running of the program. It's a huge job and responsibility which John has undertaken which he carries out in a professional, joyful manner.

The Blazeaid volunteers have come from near and far – some even from Interstate. There is a strong camaraderie between the volunteers who are all there for the same purpose – to help the bushfire victims. Their spirit is edifying. One such volunteer is 58 year old Sonia Mangelsen who has travelled from the South Australian town of Windsor Gardens.



She first heard about Blazeaid Bunyip on the long running ABC Sunday morning program "Australia all over " with Macca and the thought to help stuck in her mind. Every 2 -3 years

Sonia went on an overseas holiday and this year she had booked her air fare for a Sri Lankan holiday. Discussing Blazeaid with a friend the compulsion to volunteer grew too strong. Sonia cancelled her holiday and instead took a flight to Melbourne, hired a Campervan and drove to Bunyip to enlist as a Blazeaid volunteer. In hindsight, she says that not going to Sri Lanka was providential as otherwise she may have been caught up in the terrorist bombings. She is on 4 weeks annual leave from her job in Adelaide with the Teacher's Registration Board and will volunteer here till the 30th May.

She loves Bunyip and its friendly people. Between work and sleep there is not much time for anything else, but on an occasional day off she has visited Bunyip's Community Shop and called into the Bunyip Community House and watched some of the programs run there by coordinator Davina. "It's the close knit community feeling that I love", she said.

Sonia has been involved in fence replacement and enjoys going out with a crew and helping the farmers. "Each day, the first hour or so is taken up with a briefing for the day ahead, but it generally is an informal counselling session with a fire victim who wants to get something off their mind and talking to a stranger is usually much more comfortable" It's so rewarding knowing that just by listening, I have eased someone's pain.

Sonia encourages those with any time to spare, no matter how little to come down to the coordinating centre at the tennis rooms at the Bunyip Reserve and volunteer your time. Something she can't describe adequately is that wonderful feeling that comes with helping someone less fortunate than herself. "You need to get involved to experience that feeling, Come on down"
