

### TALKIN' ...FISHIN' ..... Fishing Etiquette

Some of the rules when fishing are not written down in your fishing regulations booklets, there are some that are just common sense or just plain courtesy and good manners. These are not something you'll learn right away but a mentor will teach you. If you don't pick it up along the way you can bet others you upset will put you straight in the matter, usually in expressive terms and choice words.

Whether on a river or in a boat fishing, simple rules apply to either, just doing the right thing by the other anglers is all that's required. Don't treat them in a way you wouldn't like to be treated yourself. **The DON'T'S:** 

\*Moving into someone else's fishing spot when they leave for a short while e.g. (Toilet breaks). \*Casting over another person's line, although sometimes it can't be avoided.

\*Handling another fisherman's rod and reel, especially winding in their catch.

\*Giving away to others someone else's favorite location spots or fishing it when there not around. \*Anchoring behind another boats burley trail or in the same action, anchoring too close to their boat. \*Pushing in at the boat ramp either in the launch or retrieval of your boat, unless in an emergency.

\*Not sticking around at the end of a day's fishing to help clean up the boat or fish.

\*Buzzing past in your boat close by the shore anglers and at speed.

\*Approaching a river spot loudly, another could already be fishing there that you may not see. \*Never leave another boatie stranded, assist if you can or call authorities if you can't help, but stay with them.

#### The DO's:

\*Take away any rubbish with you that you bring to the location, leave only footprints.

\*Kill your catch humanely, dispose of the entrails thoughtfully, or practice catch and release.

\*Give space to other anglers, (2 casts) upstream takes precedence over downstream fishers. \*Always gain permission when you can, before entering any private property, do no damage and leave gates as you find them.

\*If you've finished fishing for the day you may choose to give your leftover bait to another angler. \*If you have your bag limit of fish or are doing well, call over a mate to share in your good fortune. \*Beginners will always need help and advice, give it when you can but don't lecture, offer and wait for acceptance, usually it will be appreciated.

\*If you damage or lose borrowed fishing gear do the right thing and replace it with the same quality. \*Bring your own fair share of bait on the day, unless told otherwise.

Good manners in fishing situations doesn't gain nearly as much attention as bad manners. If you want to see prime examples of this, watch the altercations develop on a crowded pier, lines crossed and tangled, spots poached, and pilfered gear. Boat ramps congested with incoming bad weather or on busy holiday weekends, tempers really flair up when inconsiderate people try to push in on the line up or when launch procedures go wrong, bungs left out or flat batteries on the ramp. Use your common sense and be respectful to one another, there's time and space for all to fish, remember you're doing it for the relaxation. **Catcha, The TackleMan** ®

- We are also supporting the Longwarry Battery Project which will help stabilize the grid in our area.



### A message from Russell Broadbent MP Federal Member for Monash

"Your life is precious – not only for you but your loved ones. You've heard this before but safety on our roads is paramount and should be at the forefront of your mind coming into this busy holiday period.

Gumbuya World is a popular adventure park located in my electorate in country Victoria. They have a permit to see 8,000 cars through an intersection crossing the Princes Highway every day. These cars intersect with cars travelling at speeds of 100 km/h near the entrance of this popular tourist attraction. The intersection has low visibility, and multiple accidents have occurred here as a product of these factors. As a community, we have seen too many lives lost and too many mistakes made at a place that is meant to spark memories of joy and laughter – not of trauma and regret.

I recently met with the federal Minister for Road Safety and Transport, Mr. Scott Buchholz to discuss plans about how we can best alleviate this issue. I also met with state member Gary Blackwood and the CEO of Gumbuya World Ron Weinzierl to consider the constant danger this intersection facilitates, and how the state and federal governments can band together to bring safety back to this part of our highway. Creating a permanent fix to this intersection will take time. But you can take action now to prevent any more lives from being lost.

We must drive to the conditions of this busy intersection at this busy time. We must turn our attention back to safety on our roads, safety for our community, and safety for our loved ones. Small mistakes made when driving come with big consequences. We must keep the focus on road safety front and centre. That's just how I see it."

### Applications for Cardinia Shire Council's Heritage Grants 2021–22 are now open.



The grant program helps support our community in identifying, preserving, managing and promoting Cardinia Shire's heritage places.

Cardinia Shire Council Mayor Councillor Brett Owen said grants of up to \$5,000 in matched

funding are available to help repair or conserve places and sites of heritage significance.

"If you own a heritage home, shop or building in the shire that needs some love and restoration, Council may be able to assist with our heritage grants.

"The heritage grants program was developed to provide some financial assistance towards maintenance of these heritage sites, that play a fundamental role in creating a sense of community identity.

"Examples of past grant receipts includes the Koo Wee Rup Swap Historical Society, which used their grant funding to revamp and reopen the main building and old gaol at Mallow House.

"I encourage historical societies, community groups and individuals to consider putting forward ideas that can help protect Cardinia Shire's history for our future generations to enjoy," Cr Owen said.

Eligible applicants and projects can apply for grants of up to \$5,000 in matched funding to help with projects seeking to:

- repair or conserve places and sites of heritage significance, including significant trees
- complete capital works to improve community access
- develop conservation management plans, or
- develop and install interpretive signage.

Applications for staged projects will be considered. Privately-owned heritage places will only be considered for funding if they are used or accessed by the community. Heritage places eligible for funding include those listed in the Heritage Overlay of the Cardinia Planning Scheme. ### Do the right thing and use the right bin!

Residents are encouraged to do the right thing and use the right bin when disposing of household waste. Cardinia Shire Council Mayor Councillor Brett Owen said while most residents are sorting their waste correctly, Council is still seeing contamination of household waste and plastic bags in recycling and green bins. "When items go in the wrong bin, that bin is contaminated. This creates more work at the processing end which makes the waste service more expensive. Sorting contaminated materials is difficult and sometimes impossible as it poses a risk to the workers doing it. If you're unsure of what should go in each bin, check out the 'A to Z waste guide' on Council's website," Cr Owen said. Cr Owen said Council is working hard to reduce waste going to landfill and recycle as much waste as possible. "We use every opportunity to educate residents and promote messages about waste and recycling so that contamination isn't happening in the first instance. However, if it does happen, we are excited that our new waste trucks are fitted with advanced technology that can help spot contamination.," Cr Owen said. Cr Owen said there are many benefits to separating your waste properly. "One of the most important reasons to do the right thing and use the right bin is that you're helping to divert waste from landfill. Recyclable goods can be reused and reduce our reliance on new materials, preserve our natural resources, and reduce the negative impact of waste on our environment. "I encourage families to talk to their children and get them involved in recycling. Teaching children to care for our environment builds important skills in respect, empathy and responsibility," Cr Owen said.

Last year the Bunyip Community House relocated to its new home in Beswick St Garfield, but with Covid-19 restrictions and lock downs it was impossible to operate the "House" to any community viability. Manager Nicole Lucas said that an important role that the "House" did play was running a Food Bank for those disadvantaged in the community. "We were able to work within the restrictions and get food parcels out to people". Since then we have been able to stock food items in a newly acquired shipping container and are in the process of getting a fridge and freezer to stock perishables. Locals have popped in and given us encouragement, so we are pleased with where we have progressed in 12 months".

Inside the Community House we have a bank of Internet connected computers and printers and soon we will be running community programs. The future looks great!

### Garfield Community Garden

Planting calendar reproduced with the permission of Deep Green Permaculture

#### May – Gardening Calendar for Temperate Australia

(http://deepgreenpermaculture.com/)

May is the last month of autumn, when the weather starts cooling down. This is a time for pruning, taking cuttings for propagation, divide perennials, and t put in new trees, shrubs and vines. The soil is also still warm enough for moving and relocating plants around the garden.

It's also the time to clean up the garden, to remove all the dead and dried leaves, branches and plants, which is a great source of organic matter for mulching and composting!

#### Things to Do This Month:

- Continue planting new trees, shrubs, climbers, annuals and perennials.
- Continue gathering and composting autumn leaves.
- Continue cool season green manures crops, which will be cut down and dug into the soil in spring.
- Continue collecting and sowing seeds from berry producing trees and shrubs.
- Continue lifting and dividing overgrown perennial plants.
- Continue planting garlic, strawberry runners and shallot bulbs.
- Continue pruning brambleberries after they finish fruiting cut out the canes that fruited, and tie
  in the newly grown canes to the support wires on the berry trellises.
- Winter pruning of deciduous trees and shrubs can be done in autumn or winter and can begin now.
- Check citrus for gals caused by gall wasp and prune to remove.
- Cut back bamboo, and use the canes next season as plants supports and stakes in the garden.
- Repair trellises now that leaves have fallen from deciduous plants, allowing better access. Check tree ties, stakes and supports. Install windbreaks and tree guards around vulnerable plants.
- · Relocate evergreen shrubs (can be done either in autumn and early spring).
- Lift rooted hardwood cuttings produced last autumn (the year before) and plant them out to a
  permanent location.
- Some perennials plants with long fleshy roots such as horseradish can be propagated by root cuttings, take root cuttings from this time in late autumn until late winter.
- Propagate blackcurrants, redcurrants whitecurrants and gooseberries from hardwood cuttings.
- Propagate vines such as grapes using hardwood cuttings or 'eye cuttings' with a single bud.
- Propagate rhubarb by lifting root, dividing it so each piece has one or more buds and replanting.
- Harvest and store root crops now is the time to begin lifting parsnips from the ground, exposure to cold improves the taste.
- Ponds should be cleaned of old plants, and overgrown marginal plants around the pond can be divided.

#### MEGA QUARRY THREATENS YOUR FUTURE NOW: HELP STOP IT NOW.

Dear residents,

Hanson Construction Materials (Heidelberg Cement, Germany), has indicated that they will complete their Environmental Effects Statement (EES) by April 2021. The EES details their quarry plans and how they say their operation will affect the area.

From April, the EES will be available for public review and all parties, including residents, are invited to examine the EES and make submissions indicating concerns and objections that they have regarding the Hanson plans and its effects on the area.

It is vital that all residents take part in this process. Once the EES is released, residents will only have up to 30 business days to review documentation and make submissions. The EES and its related submissions are what Planning Minister Richard Wynne MP uses to form his decision on whether or not the proposed project is approved or rejected.

The Mount Cannibal and District Preservation Group (MCADPG) is also preparing to oppose the quarry; however, we need your support to succeed against this well-funded, international corporation.

These types of project proposals have been defeated in the past and can be defeated in the future if it is clearly shown to the Minister for Planning that they:

- are being proposed in an inappropriate location,
- · do not have a social licence to operate,
- · would do more environmental and social harm than good,
- lack merit, i.e., would bring nothing of value to community and surrounds in which they propose to operate.

For the past 15 years Hanson has lacked community engagement, refused to answer key question and has failed to work with all stakeholders. While we may dislike Hanson for their ethics and morality, it is this project's lack of merit that will ensure the rejection of their proposal.

The MCADPG have been reviewing Hanson's referral documentation that formed part of their submission to the Minister for Planning in 2013. These studies were commissioned by Hanson and performed by their appointed specialists who expressed a number of concerns about the project. It is from these documents that we know:

Hanson Construction Materials is proposing to extract 2 million tones of granite every year from a new Bunyip North site bigger than the Melbourne CBD for a period of 70-100 years. At full production, the quarry would require 7-10 people on site and would see 550 truck movements on local roads/Princes Highway daily. Hanson/Vic Roads do not have plans to upgrade the roads at this time. Hanson has admitted to many social impacts including dust and noise emissions, ground vibrations, air blasts, road damage and alteration of landscape. Hanson wants to remove 100+ acres of native vegetation, and their operation plans to flatten 3 hills with a pit 160 meters below ground level.

The scope within which the EES has been developed is narrow and it has been undertaken without direct community involvement. It is therefore up to us to now loudly and clearly point out where the issues are with this proposal and the damage that the project would inflict.

We ask all residents to now review Hanson's 2013 EES Referral Report (available on our website) and begin drafting individual concerns and objections to this proposal. If you require assistance in lodging your submission, or you would like to discuss things with a member of the MCADPG committee, please do not hesitate to reach out to us via the contact details below.




