Are you burning off safely?

Every year, brigades are called out to out of control burn-offs. By doing the following you can make sure your burn-off remains safe and under control:

- ☑ Register your burn-off with ESTA 1800 668 511.
- Check local council restrictions.
- Check the weather forecast for the day you are lighting your burnoff and the following 3 days. Make sure to keep an eye out for strong wind forecasts.
- ✓ Clear an area 3 metres around and above your burn-off.
- ✓ Have an adult always in attendance.
- ☑ Have sufficient water on hand to extinguish the burn-off.
- ✓ Fully extinguish the burn-off before leaving.

A popular Bunyip couple, Ron and Nanette Balzary will celebrate sixty years of married life on Thursday 19th of May. They married on a beautiful sunny Saturday morning at 11.00am at St. Andrews Presbyterian Church in Oakleigh on Saturday 19th May, 1962. The couple has lived in Bunyip for 43 years.

They met through an arranged date to go to a company ball whilst both worked for the Colonial Gas Company in Oakleigh, Ron as a Gas Fitter and Nanette in the office. Ron remembers his father sitting him down early in the morning on the wedding day and having a "man to man" talk with lots of advice. Nanette remembers her beautiful wedding dress, especially made and gifted to her by her mother. Ron's highlight of the day was seeing Nanette walking down the aisle.

The couple had lived and worked at Wollongong, Fairy Meadows, Oakleigh, Tally Ho and Bunyip. Shortly after they moved to Bunyip Ron was transferred to Wilson's Promontory for five years, then transferred back to Bunyip. Whilst living at the Prom, they leased their home to the Iona Catholic Parish which was home to 5 nuns who taught at St. Joseph's school in Iona.

After working for the Colonial Gas Company for 20 years, Ron started his own business as a domestic fitter and maintenance plumber until he retired. Nanette worked as a cook at a teacher's college in Glen Waverley where in a team there were 1000 meals prepared every day. She also worked at the Hickory lingerie Company.

Ron and Nanette have 3 children, Andrew, Matthew and Melinda. Sadly Melinda was tragically taken in an accident on A'Beckett Road when the car she was driving skidded in loose gravel and hit a tree. They have 7 grandchildren.

The couple has holidayed twice in Tasmania, visited the Northern Territory three times and also spent time in south Australia and Queensland. They both enjoy gardening, touring with lots of driving, visiting people and have a keen interest in family history.

Nanette has been involved with the CWA where she once held the position of State President of the Victorian Branch. She has been involved with the Mother's Club, the Bunyip Singers, Football Club,

Bunyip Historical Society and the Girl Guides. Ron was past President of the East Burwood Football Club, member of the Bunyip Historical Society, Scouts and Cubs involvement and the first President of the Gippsland Oldsmobile Club.

The highlights in their lives include the births of their children and grandchildren. They will never forget the tragic death of their beautiful Melinda, who will always hold a special place in their hearts.

The question people are always asked when celebrating such a special milestone in their lives is what is their secret to such a long and happy marriage. With Ron and Nanette, they continue to live their "secret" in their daily lives. It's "togetherness" — doing things together. They are inseparable in all they do. If you see one in the supermarket aisle, the other is just around the corner in the next aisle. They go everywhere in tandem which is a testament of their love and a fine example to those wishing to attain the same happiness in their married life.

Registrations for 2023 kindergarten are now open

Cardinia Shire Council is encouraging families to register for 2023 kindergarten places by 30 June 2022 to be considered for first-round offers.

Children who attend educational play-based kindergarten develop lifelong skills that build their confidence, enhance their social and language skills, expand their physical abilities and prepares them for schooling. Did you know that in Cardinia Shire, children can access two years of funded kindergarten prior to commencing school? If your child turns 3 years of age by 30 April 2023, they are eligible to attend their 1st year of a funded kindergarten program (3-year-old kindergarten). If your child turns 4 years of age by 30 April 2023, they are eligible to attend their 2nd year of a funded kindergarten program (4-year-old kindergarten). Cardinia Shire Council provides a central registration portal for both years of kindergarten programs offered in Council facilities. Cardinia Shire Mayor, Councillor Jeff Springfield said, "Kindergarten is an essential part of social and personal development for children. It helps to develop language skills, problem solving abilities and self-confidence." "Research shows that quality early education leads to better health, education and employment outcomes later in life, so we'd love to see local families enrol their children in kindergarten in Cardinia Shire."

1st year of funded kindergarten (3-year-old kindergarten)

The 1st year of kindergarten is partially funded by the Victorian Government for a minimum of 5-hours per week. Children must be 3 years-old on or before 30 April in the year they wish to start kindergarten. Children must be 3 years of age before they can start their first day of kindergarten. Children who turn 3 between 1 January and 30 April will have their kindergarten place held until they turn 3. Offers for 2023 places for 3-year-old kindergarten will be sent to parents and carers from September 2022.

2nd year of funded kindergarten (4-year-old kindergarten)

The 2nd year of kindergarten is partially funded by the Government, providing 15-hours per week of early years education for every child. Children must be 4 years-old on or before 30 April in the year they wish to start kindergarten.

Offers for 2023 places for 4-year-old kindergarten will be sent to parents and carers from August 2022.

Registrations

Register online using Council's Online Kindergarten Registration Portal.

Registrations received by 30 June 2022 will be included in first round offers.

Registrations received after 30 June 2022 will be processed in second, and later, offer rounds.

World renowned garden on the way to Olinda



14 April 2022: A stunning Chelsea Flower Show winning garden is coming to the Dandenong Ranges Botanic Garden.

Landscape designer Phillip Johnson has started works this week to recreate his Best in Show winning 'Australian Garden', which will become a permanent fixture and tourism drawcard at the Parks Victoria site in Olinda.

The \$6.4 million project is being funded by a \$3.83 million investment from the Victorian Government, \$2.245 million from the Federal Government and \$340,000 in funds raised by the People and Parks foundation. The Chelsea Australian Garden at

Olinda will be a fantastic opportunity for locals and tourists alike to connect with Australian nature, with more than 15,000 plants from over 400 Australian plant species – including many rare and endangered species – to be planted. At over 7,000 square meters in size, the new Australian Garden will be 20 times the size of the original garden, which was shown to Queen Elizabeth and Prince Harry at the 2013 Chelsea Flower Show. The garden will showcase Australian native plants, sustainable design and habitat creation, including solar power and water-wise design. Philip Johnson will invite horticulture and landscape students to support the garden build and provide a hands-on experience for the students to research maintenance, horticulture and sustainable design. The construction of the garden is expected to be completed later this year. Philip Johnson and nurseryman Wes Fleming's entry to the 2013 Chelsea Flower Show was the first Australian entry to ever win Best in Show at the coveted event in the United Kingdom. 

TALKIN'FISHIN' Women who fish

That's right, not just for men, many women that fish today have a lot of others that came before to thank for paving the way for their acceptance in the sport of predominately male dominance. Those like Chisie Farrington, Dolly Dyer and Joan Wulff fishing Champions in their own right, but not receiving the recognition they deserved at the time.

Joan Wulff: Born in Paterson New Jersey 1926, Inspired by her father's passion for the pastime of fishing at the age of 5 or 6 then at 10 took up a fly rod taking instruction from her father and mentor William Taylor. Within 2 years she was a junior fly casting champion competing in distance and accuracy events from the age of 16 she went on to win 17 national titles from 1943 to 1960. In 1951 she won the national casting distance title against the all-male competition. Joan developed many innovations and casting techniques to improve her casting abilities and competitive nature. Her talent extended into spinning and plug casting as well as trick casting demonstrations at her casting clinics. Her involvement in the fishing industry along with her husband Lee Wulff incorporated products and fly designs of innovation including clothing and tackle, followed by casting clinics and schools that all anglers came to benefit from. Her involvement encouraged other women to join her and take a greater participation and interest in the predominately male dominated sport. Even though Joan's initial contribution was frowned upon by the males as an intrusion into their sporting domain, her success and dominance could not be ignored any more. After the death of her husband Lee in 1991 Joan continued her fly fishing schools and teaching stream crafts also writing regular columns for magazines and including books of her own and further products under the licence of Royal Wulff Products. Joan Wulff continues to operate the Wulff School of Fly Fishing as both a mentor and teacher, a truly inspirational woman in her sport that has achieved many firsts, titles and heights her male counterparts can only hope to reach.
