Proposed Community Solar Farm for Bunyip


The Bunyip Renewables Action Group (BRAG) is working with Komo Energy to investigate the feasibility of constructing a community solar farm in Bunyip. BRAG's membership of the then Yarra Valley Community Power Hub helped provide seed funding for this feasibility study.

Construction of a solar farm in Bunyip will help the community adjust to the inevitable transition to renewable energy. The International Energy Agency has concluded that solar power is the lowest cost source of electricity, ever! Provision of a battery associated with the farm would contribute to stabilising the power grid during periods of peak electricity demand in our locality.

The map below shows the potential area of interest for the solar farm south of the Recreation Reserve. Current proposals are focussed on the north west corner of this area close to the power line along the Iona Road. Work is underway on flood studies of the site, preparation of a planning application and negotiations with AusNet for connections to the grid. Plans to plant screening vegetation so that the solar farm is not visible from neighbouring properties are in hand.

The Bunyip and wider Victorian communities will have the opportunity of investing in the proposed solar farm. Subject to the necessary approvals and sourcing investment funds, construction of the solar farm could start in 2024.

TALKIN' ...FISHIN'

BEACH BUGGIES

Autumn is coming to an end, winter fishing is on its way and there is still plenty of time to setup and prepare for its coming, so get your surf gear ready. The only thing I don't look forward to are those long arduous journey's trekking down the beach carrying all that gear like a pack mule, without the stamina of one.

Backpacks and shoulder bags don't make it much easier, just compact it all.

Why not consider a 'Beach Cart'? A what! You ask? Basically it's a small wagon you either push or pull along the beach full of your surf fishing gear, Rods, Tackle, bait waders and buckets. Designs differ greatly, but some of the things needing consideration are, do you want to push or pull it? The overall size and weight and whether you have 4 wheels or 2? I would definitely go the 4 any day.



Also in the overall size is the carrying capacity of it, and that it be made of a lightweight rustproof or rust-resistant material like aluminium or PVC. The wheels should be wide enough that they won't sink into the soft sand, golf cart wheels or balloon tyres are ideal for this purpose, although stay away from any with tubes or bearings, bushes only, there's no roadside assist here if you get a flat.



Try to travel on the flat packed sand at the water's edge where possible. There are purpose built carts for sale at around \$400-\$600 rather expensive, or you can build your own, there are plenty of examples on the internet. Garden trolleys are also suitable but are made of steel so rust is an issue, but consider lengthening the axles to take the wider wheels. As winter includes rainy days make sure there is room for an Esky, a 20Ltr bucket to waterproof and keep all your valuables and tackle, phones etc. safe, it also make a handy seat for the day. You may want to include external rod holders and separate smaller bait and berley buckets. A telescopic paint roller pole to hang an overhead light from at night is handy too.

Depending on your vehicle space you may find that a folding or collapsible unit will suit your needs better. PVC rod holders are light and durable as your cart should be, nice and easy to quickly hose it all down at the end of the days fishing. You'll hopefully be too busy cleaning your fish. The satisfaction of making your own cart will give you the advantage of custom fitting it out to suit your specific needs and additional ideas. That doesn't mean going all out 'Tim Taylor' (The Tool Man) and fitting a motor.

The building was built mostly by farmers and was ready to start filling it with wheat in January 1942 (that's just 4 months which is unbelievable). The Shed is about 270 metres long, 60 metres wide about 19 metres high along the ridge. As we walked into the Shed we were blown away as it resembled a Cathedral of tall poles and from certain angles it looked like a forest. We were all very impressed and amazed that this was still standing and now is Heritage listed so it will be there for future generations. We want to the Railway Hotel for a pub lunch and then strolled over to look at the Water Tower Museum as well as the old Murtoa Railway station to look at the history of the surrounding areas before we headed back.



Thursday night we held our Film night to surprise one of our members by showing "LiL Abner" for fun with our special Bunyip/ Garfield R- Sure- Ettes giving out Goodies. Friday everyone geared up for an exciting morning playing Mini Golf. On arrival we had a delicious Morning Tea (more food). Family Reunion - Numbers Increase

On Sunday the 23rd of April, almost 72 years after leaving their homeland the descendants of Johannes and Helena van den Beoek a large Dutch family of 13 children came together at the Garfield Community Centre for its third family reunion. Sharing old photos, remembering family members who had passed on during Covid lockdowns and meeting new family members resulted in a wonderful day. The first family reunion was at Officer and the previous one was in Garfield in 2012.

In perfect Autumn weather, the 109 attendees exchanged stories of family past and present.

The oldest family member was 97 year old Harry Van Den Broek of Garfield with 2 month old Great, Great niece Eden McGeoch being the youngest. Johannes and Helena van den Broek have 64 grand-children and including their great

move on the condition that the family members over 18 would sign a declaration that they were responsible for the well-being of their parents for the next 15 years.

They had sold most of their assets to make the trip, but brought seven bikes with them, which family members used to travel around their new district.

grand-children and great grand-children the family is nudging over 400 descendants. There are 13 children, 66 grand children, 172 great grand children and 151 great great grand children.

The van den Broek family left The Netherlands on the 9th, May 1951 spending 5 weeks aboard Sibajak arriving in Melbourne on the 14th, June 1951. The family decided to leave their war ravaged beloved Holland after WW2 and seek a better life for themselves and their children in Australia.

Being in their 50's age proved a hurdle when they sought to move to Australia, which had an age limit of 50 on migrants, but Dutch migrant chaplain Father Maas took their case to Immigration Minister of the time Arthur Caldwell. They were eventually allowed to

The van den Broeks went from hand-milking three or four cows on a five-acre farm and living in a 200-year-old home in Braband, Holland, to share farming on 720 acres (291 hectares) and milking 57 cows (which later increased to 75).

Helena died in Berwick in 1954 and Johannes in Cranbourne in 1977.

It was such a happy and successful reunion that organisers said there would be many more to come.



Did you know this building was once located in the Bunyip supermarket carpark?

J.J Kavanagh (James) was a local auctioneer, real estate agent, and Iona farmer. His father Owen came from Roscommon, Ireland and after arriving in Melbourne, he spent some time in New Zealand. Whilst in New Zealand Owen married Catherine Featherstone and they had four sons.

A few years later in 1892 Owen settled on the Koo Wee Rup swamp. He was allotted 20 acres on which to farm and to work in the mud and sludge digging drains. Owen and Catherine prospered and added to their acreage, milking cows, cropping potatoes, growing onions and running a few sheep. He also had a store and a bakery managed by his son Jack. Owen & Catherine lived at Iona until their deaths in 1934 and 1943 and are buried in the Bunyip cemetery.



Deep Creek Golf Club goes into voluntary administration

Cardinia Shire Council has recently been informed of the voluntary administration of the Deep Creek Golf Club Incorporated. The club is situated at Deep Creek Reserve Cameron Way, Pakenham.

Deep Creek Golf Club has ceased trading and the golf course will remain closed until further notice. Signs have been put in place on site today to indicate its closure.

Deep Creek Golf Association has appointed Worrells as voluntary administrator of the golf club.

The Deep Creek Reserve land, including the golf course and main building, are Council-owned assets. Council has a lease agreement in place with Deep Creek Golf Club for its use and operation of the golf course and associated infrastructure, use of part of the main complex, and operation of the main complex.

Council has provided strong financial support to the club via its provision of new facilities as part of the \$12 million Deep Creek Reserve project. Council contributed \$10 million to the project, with the Victorian Government contributing an additional \$2 million.

"Council is assisting Worrells and supporting those impacted where we can. We recognise this is a very difficult time for all those affected," said Cardinia Shire Mayor Cr Tammy Radford. "While the club is under control of the administrators, no decisions can be made about the future use of the facilities previously leased by the golf club," said Cr Radford.

Deep Creek Reserve and its facilities – including new facilities for Deep Creek Golf Club – opened to the public in late-2019. The club's previous clubhouse, a council-owned building in Oaktree Drive, had reached the end of its practical use. As it wasn't feasible to upgrade this building, Council worked with the club to design and construct a brand-new clubhouse in the multipurpose centre at Deep Creek reserve. A driving range, shedding, and golf course upgrade was also provided for the club to lease.

Since the advent of COVID-19, Council has also provided \$59,500 to the golf club to help cover utility costs, and only charged it a very small fee to lease the premises.

Worrells is responsible for contacting anyone with functions booked at the venue, as well as suppliers and customers. Council is assisting by helping those with bookings find alternative venues. Anyone impacted can visit our venue and space booking portal Booking Cardinia at www.cardinia.vic.gov.au/bookingcardinia

Cardinia Environment Coalition, which is a tenant of the main building and indigenous plant nursery at Deep Creek Reserve, is not impacted by this situation and is operating as normal. The playground at Deep Creek Reserve remains open to the public.




