Don't get caught out-

Burn off's are an effective method of managing fire risk on properties however they need to be done right, in line with the law and they need to be safe.

Check council's Local Laws on where and when you can burn off.

Some other points to consider when planning a burn off:

- Consider the weather. If it's too windy, think about postponing your burn off for another day.
- Make sure you register your burn off by calling 1800 668 511. Too often our CFA Fire Fighters are called to fight a fire which turns out to be a private burn.

Legal topic: Looking to purchase a residential property?

Purchasing a home is one of the most important things you can do for yourself and for your family. However, buying a home can be a stressful ordeal and even potentially out of reach for many, including first home buyers.

According to the recent Victorian Government Property Sales Report, the Valuer-General Victoria provided commentary regarding median house prices in Victoria. In the September 2021 to December 2021 quarter, the Victorian median house price increased by 14.0%, although the March 2022 quarter saw median house prices in Victoria decrease by just over 4.0%

For those looking to purchase a home for the first time, the Victorian Government has abolished stamp duty for first home buyers, where the dutiable value of the property is \$600,000 or less. For properties valued at between \$600,000 and \$750,000, stamp duty increases slightly and is relative to the increasing value of the property.

In Victoria, if you purchase a property 'off-the-plan', you will only pay stamp duty on the land that the property is sitting on.

In support of first home buyers, a \$10,000 First Home Owner Grant (FHOG) is available when you buy or build your first new home in Victoria. Unfortunately, the \$20,000 First Home Owner Grant for purchasing or building your first home in regional Victoria ended on 30 June 2021.

For those who are not first home buyers, there are a range of stamp duty exemptions and concessions offered on property purchases, including concessions and exemptions for pensioners. Please visit www.sro.vic.gov.au for more information.

Victorian Homebuyer Fund (Shared Equity Scheme)

If you're finding it difficult to save for a property deposit, the 'Victorian Homebuyer Fund' has been introduced by the Victorian Government to assist with owning your home. If you have a 5.0% deposit, you may be eligible to apply under this Homebuyer Fund. To find out more about the Fund, please visit:

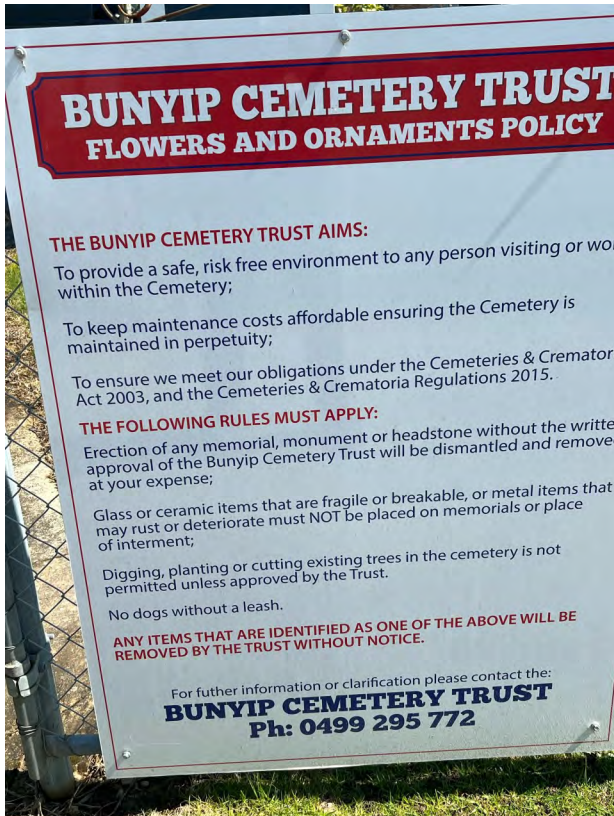

TALKIN' ...FISHIN' A SPECIAL BREED!

Angling takes you on many adventures, some stranger than others, none more so than the float tubers. A special breed of angler and some might say very brave, floating around a lake or estuary with your legs dangling below a blow up boat wearing waders and scuba flippers is definitely a look you don't see every day! Those who partake really love it though.

Despite the fashion statement this is a very stealthy way of approaching your quarry and a very comfortable way to access fishing zones that are not available from the banks, either impeded by structures like trees, undergrowth, weeds or bull-rushes.

These floating craft can be categorised in the forms of 3 types



Inner Tube-Donut style



Inflatable Boat - V Shaped

1. Inner Tube-Donut style
2. Inflatable Boat- V Shaped
3. Pontoon Boat – 2 bodies jointed

Within Boat styles, you're seated in the middle, and using the small oars and wearing flippers paddling to manoeuvre yourself into position, casting at your leisure with many accessories in easy reach, nets, rod holders, tackle packs etc. Inner tube donut varieties is very minimal, most gear is carried on your person as a vest. When landing your fish, these are kept in a suspended keeper net or practise the favoured catch and release.

This type of fishing is not recommended for fast flowing waters, generally best suited for mild conditions on lakes, dams and estuaries is the safest option. It is advisable to always wear a PFD life vest. As well as the advantage of moving around and fishing normally inaccessible areas, there is the added advantage of storage and portability as you can fully deflate the apparatus and fit it into a small car or your garage without taking up the larger space a regular boat would. These float tubes are mostly constructed of a heavy duty inflatable rubberized canvas that is quite tough and can easily be patch repaired if required, getting you straight back into your fishing. Not an expensive item but definitely interesting method of fishing your favourite areas, with a few mates a great day out to be had by all.

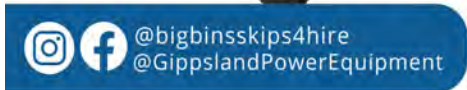

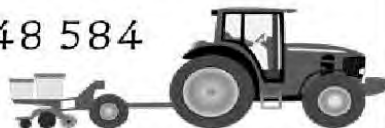
