Halloween in Australia

Halloween is celebrated in Australia on October 31 each year. Also called All Hallows' Eve, the event comes right before All Saints Day. Many Australians celebrate the day by throwing elaborate parties where guests dress as ghosts, ghouls and any spooky characters they can think of.

Children like to go trick-or-treating on Halloween. This is when children knock on doors in their neighbourhood and ask for a treat, lest they be tricked. Other ways of celebrating are by carving pumpkins or putting decoration in the garden.

Five facts about Halloween:

Here are five quick facts about Halloween for you to enjoy:

- The Celts (who lived in Ireland, the United Kingdom and France) marked the end of the summer and the beginning of winter with this harvest festival.
- They believed that the festival would make their gods happy, so they would protect them and their crops during the long, hard winter that was to come.
- People believed that ghosts walked the streets on Halloween night and began to wear masks to fool the ghosts into believing that they were other spirits.
- Many years ago, were also terrified that ghosts or spirits would come into their homes and began leaving bowls of food outside their doors to deter the ghosts from entering.
- 'All Saints' Day' was also called 'All-hallows' which was an old English word. People began to call the night before the first of November, 'All-hallows Eve' and this eventually became Halloween.

Have you heard about the new Fire Danger Ratings?

CFA and other Australian fire services have adopted the AFDRS (Australian Fire Danger Rating System) recently. Do you know what the ratings mean?

With the Fire Danger Period just around the corner, it's vital that you familiarise yourself with the new system and how you should act in bushfire prone areas.

- No Rating
- □ Moderate, Plan and Prepare
- □ High, Be Ready to Act
- Extreme, Take action NOW to protect life and property
- □ Catastrophic, For your survival LEAVE BUSHFIRE RISK AREAS

Received an Emergency Alert warning message on your phone?

Emergency Alert is the national telephone warning system used by emergency services to send voice messages to landlines and text messages to mobile phones within a defined area about potential emergencies. This service is now 5G compatible.

Emergency Alert is just one way of warning communities and will not be used in all circumstances.

It is important that you do not rely solely on receiving an official message and should always be aware of what is happening around you, as you could find yourself suddenly in danger.

If the caller ID number or message header on your phone displays the number '+61 444 444 444' it is genuine. Do not block +61 444 444 444.

Expressions of interest open for Community Capital Works Grants

Applications will close 5pm, Friday 1 December 2023.

Cardinia Shire Council has today opened expressions of interest for Category 2 (Partnership Grants) as part of the Community Capital Works Grants Program 2024-25.

The Community Capital Works Grants Program assists community groups to improve community facilities that are used to strengthen local networks and support community wellbeing.

Grants of up to \$35,000 are available for capital works on Council owned, or Crown land in Cardinia Shire, with contributions from applicants.

Examples of past grant recipients include the Cora Lynn Football Club, which secured grant funding towards a LED electronic scoreboard upgrade, and the Cardinia Environment Coalition, which used the grant funding to construct a new pot wash facility at Deep Creek Nursery.

Get ready for happy summer days at the outdoor pools

Cardinia Shire's outdoor pools will open again in November, ready for community members to enjoy during the sizzling summer days ahead.

The pools at **<u>Garfield</u>**, Koo Wee Rup and Pakenham will open on Saturday 11 November, with the wading pool in the Emerald Lake Park Precinct scheduled to open on Thursday 23 November.

In a change to operating days across the entire opening season, pools will open if the temperature reaches 26 degrees in the pool's location, as forecast by the Bureau of Meteorology at 4pm the day prior.

To check if their local pool is open on a particular day, residents can visit the <u>Cardinia Leisure</u> <u>website homepage</u> during pool operating months, anytime from 4pm the day prior to their planned visit. Pool opening information will also be posted daily on the <u>Cardinia Outdoor Pools Facebook</u> <u>page</u>.

The decision to open the shire's outdoor pools on days 26 degrees or warmer was made after reviewing pool attendance data over the past few years. This data showed that low or no attendance was quite common on days under 26 degrees.

Maintenance, cleaning and upgrade works have taken place on all outdoor pools in preparation for summer 2023-24. Key improvements include repainting of the pool shells at Emerald and Pakenham, installation of CCTV cameras at Pakenham, bird deterrent technology installed at Pakenham and Koo Wee Rup, and pool tile repairs at Garfield and Koo Wee Rup.

Cardinia Leisure will also be hosting various events and activities at the outdoor pools during summer.

TALKIN'FISHIN' LEFT OR RIGHT?

Whether your creator has decided you are predominately Left or Right handed is no matter, there is plenty of fishing gear to suit your need.

Your dominant hand usually does the winding of the reel handle, for the majority of us that's right handed, but left handed is also catered for, however if the need arises whether through injury or disability with practise you can learn to fish comfortably with either. It makes sense to cast with your non dominant hand and immediately start winding with the favoured, not to make a cast then change over or swap hands, unfortunately that's me, like many others, I can do it, but too late to permanently change now and I want the accuracy with my casting.

In our favour Rods are designed ambidextrous, as with most of the double handed stuff like landing nets, gaffs, surf rods etc. also knots tied with left or right handed twist are just as fiddly but as effective and strong in either direction.

Spinning or Threadline reels are mostly convertible to suit which hand you prefer to wind with, simply swapping the handle to the other side is quite a simple procedure that only takes a minute to do.

Baitcasters or Overhead reels are not commonly left hand winding but are available, or as a special order of a few parts can have the gearing, and exchanging the side plate converting your existing reel to L/H winding.

Fly reels and Centrepin alike can easily be changed to suit you, with those that have a one way bearing it's simple to flip over the bearing to operate in the opposite direction. Alvey surf fishing type are brilliant as they work in either direction.

Manufacturers are aware that we are not all made the same, so gratefully neither are their reels.

Are you fire season ready?

Cardinia Shire is one of the most beautiful regions in Australia, but it is also one of the most bushfire prone. Preparing our homes and properties well in advance of the bushfire season is the most effective tool we have to keep ourselves, our families and the community safe.

Grass - keep it short!

Grass fires can start and spread quickly and be very dangerous. Reducing the risk of grass fire is the responsibility of everyone in our shire.

In the lead up to fire season, all property owners and occupiers should prepare their properties for bushfire, even if their property is not immediately next to bushland.

At a minimum you should:

- Maintain all grass and weeds on your block at less than 10 centimetres high
- Clear your property of fallen branches and dead vegetation
- Clean up fine fuels such as leaves, twigs and long grass and remove any rubbish.
- Larger rural and agricultural properties need to create a firebreak at least 10 metres wide along external fences by slashing grass and weeds to less than 10 centimetres
- Create separation between vegetation and buildings and fences by mowing and pruning vegetation.

Fire Hazard Inspection Program

Cardinia Shire Council undertakes an annual Fire Hazard Inspection Program which commences in the lead up to the fire season and comprises approximately 4,000 privately owned properties across the Shire. This program follows a risk-based approach which acknowledges that fire risk reduction is a shared responsibility for all residents in Cardinia Shire. The Fire Hazard Inspection Program is primarily focussed throughout the Fire Danger Period, however Fire Prevention Notices may be issues by an authorised officer year-round.

When a property has been identified as posing a fire hazard, a Fire Prevention Notice may be issued by a Fire Prevention Officer. The Country Fire Authority Act 1958 and Fire Rescue Victoria Act 1958 authorises Municipal Fire Prevention Officers to issue Fire Prevention Notices on owners or occupiers of private properties to complete fire management works.

If you receive a Fire Prevention Notice this means that a Fire Prevention Officer has inspected your property and determined it poses a fire hazard. If you do not comply with the notice, **you may be fined up to \$1,923**, and/or you may need to cover the cost of contractor hire to remove fire hazards, plus administration costs. Legal action may still proceed. Each property is considered individually for its level of risk, but there are key things Fire Prevention Officers look for when inspecting a property:

- Long, dry grass
- Fallen and dead vegetation
- Weeds contributing to a high fuel load
- Vegetation close to neighbouring assets.

Cardinia Shire Council's green waste drop-off events are a free service accepting residential amounts of green waste including garden prunings, tree branches and trunks (up to 30 centimetres wide and 1 metre long), weeds, grass clippings, leaves, and flowers.

Residents must present photo ID as proof of residence within Cardinia Shire to access the free service.

Waste will only be accepted from residential vehicles and trailers; commercial business operators cannot use this service.
