Bunyip Newsletter First Issue

The late Mrs. Elizabeth Porter was a member of the Bunyip Branch of the Red Cross and was actively involved in helping people in the district who were in need of material goods and services. In 1982 she identified the need for the thriving Bunyip community to have a newsletter where locals could be informed of community activities as well as contribute reports and interesting news items from various community organisations.

Through her membership in the Bunyip Red Cross and with encouragement given by Russell and Jean Clark and neighbours Hugh and Jess, the first fortnightly issue was published on the 7th October, 1982. Below is the acknowledgement on the front page:

When her husband Robert became ill, their son Arthur who was living and working at Hazelwood North moved to Bunyip to help his parents out. Arthur has remained a Bunyip resident since. He vividly remembers being involved in the printing of the first issue of the Bunyip & District Newsletter on a Roneo machine. The machine was suitable for reproducing a small number of documents such as school worksheets or exam papers or community newsletters. Stencil duplication was a low-cost printing method that worked by forcing ink through waxed-paper stencils on to target paper. "I remember the purple ink that rubbed off on your hands, the copies had a smell that was recognised by any 1960-70's school kid, Arthur said.

Our first print produced 300 copies and was enthusiastically received by the community. Eventually we began compiling the newsletter on computer and using a printer. All the copies were collated and stapled by hand. These days it's all done automatically and the printer has to just keep up the supply of paper and supervise the running of the machine."

This year the Newsletter has reached the 40^{th} year of publication milestone and we gratefully acknowledge our first editor.....Elizabeth Porter.

From Our First Issue 7th Oct 1982



Bunyip School News:

On Monday morning a number of pupils and two Teachers went to Shelley Memorial Hospital to present Matron with \$189.63 which was raised by the school children with the assistance of sponsorships from local business people. The money was raised through participation by children, teachers and parents in a 5 kilometre "Bun Run" in the Bunyip area. children were given a conducted tour of the Hospital and entertained to morning tea.

On Thursday and Friday of this week 43 children, four teachers and two

parents will be camping in tents on Mr.Burt's farm at Tonimbuk.

Bunyip Primary School Council:

The September meeting of the school council was well attended with only one absent.

After the normal general business of the running of the school, such as paying accounts etc, Mr. Kehayas gave a report on the play the school put on, under his guidance, called "Germs". Everyone was justifiably proud of the evenings performance and as parents our thanks go to the teachers and different ones who helped train the children, and presented

a very enjoyable night.

The main topic of the evening was the general discussion on the planned Multi Purpose Room. Many may not know that after many years of presenting plans and ideas and reasons for such a room to the Education Departement, we have at long last been given a grant of \$80,000.00 and the Council has to find the extra \$20,000.00 that it is estimated the building will cost. It is proposed to form a co-operative in the near future for the purpose of raising this money and more definate news of this will be in future reports.

There will be a public meeting in the near future for all who are interested in the future welfare of the school and to present the

annual financial balance.

The meeting closed at 11.00pm.

The Catholic Womens League of Iona: Twelve members attended the half yearly conference which was held at Warragul during September. The theme of the conference was "Marriage and the Family Today", and there was a large attendance of women from all parts of Gippsland. The conference began with Mass celebrated by His Lordship Bishop D'Arcy and guest speakers furing the conference were Chris and Trish Harkin who gave a very inspiring talk on marriage.

Bunyip Group of Uncle Bobs Club:
The group was formed on 29th April, 1982 and has a current membership of forty. The aim of the club is to raise money for the Royal Childrens Hospital and to help sick and handicapped children right throughout Victoria. Many thousands of dollars are also spent each year in providing equipment and facilities for children's wards in country hospitals. Membership is \$5.20 per year and Associates \$2.60. All members receive a quarterly magazine keeping them informed of activities of Groups and Branches throughout the State.

At present Bunyip Group is conducting an authorized raffle for an Australian Stud Pony, complete with saddle etc., and valued at \$1,200. Tickets are \$1.00 each and can be obtained from John Dyer at the State Bank Bunyip or any member of the Committee.

Senior Citizens Club - Sunyip:

At Senior Citizens Club on Friday October, 1st, we had 18 members attend. We have been able to welcome new members in the last few weeks and they enjoy playing cards etc.

New members are always welcome.

The new Tynong Post Office

Tynong Welcomes New Post Office

On Saturday, 3rd September despite the wet and cold conditions hundreds of Tynong residents and visitors joined in the celebrations of the official opening of the new premises of the Tynong Post Office.

In early 2000, despite still being a small Post Office, Tynong was given a life-line by becoming a "Rural Transaction Centre" with funding from the Federal Government. This enabled the Post Office to have an Australia Post dedicated computer counter terminal for bill paying and parcel transactions. This was about the time that nearly everyone began using their banking cards to pay bills.

The first unofficial Post Office (PO) in Tynong was established in November 1882, in the gatehouse of the Railway Station at the intersection of Tynong Road and Nar Nar Goon - Longwarry Road. The first railway employee was Robert J Mitchell, who also became the Post Master.

In 1993 Australia Post decided to introduce a new way of operating Post Offices and decided to award the business owners a license to handle the mail, and current licensee Pauline Preston was given the opportunity to take on the license for the Tynong Post Office and she took over the license on the 1st July, 1993. As it needed to move, the Tynong General Store owners, Clive Weston and Lesley Holt offered a corner of the General Store in Tynong from where the Post Office has been operating.

TALKIN' LIGHTEN UP!

While most of us aspire to catch the 'big one'! In reality most of our fish we catch are a fraction of that size (not that we'll ever admit to it). However you should not be disappointed with this result though, after all a fish is a fish, you can have just as much enjoyment and fun no matter what the size, you just need to lighten up.

Of course, I'm not referring to your attitude but your gear. Reducing your line strength or diameter, and the weight and size of your rod and reel will even up the fight and prove just as much fun. Quality monofilament lines can be fished in ranges as low as 1&2 kg with rod and reel sizes balanced to match the catch.

Consider a Huckleberry Finn outfit, modern composite varieties are the go, that's a pole only (no reel) a good quality light line the same length as the pole, up to 6.0 & 7.0 metres long with a float and hook attached. Even if you're only after the bait, such as yakkas, and small mullet or garfish, this is a very effective tackle setup. A load of laughs even for the big kids in your crew. Pole fishing out of a boat for garfish is a trouble free rig choice and a fast hook-up and return to the water method especially without a reel, a pendulum swing in/out and set the hook.

If you're a fly or spin fisher, tiny streams or twig waters as they're known designate lighter gear, 2,3,and 4 wt fly rods and lines accordingly. Delicately landing on calm water creeks and streams. If you're a spinner, look for small lures and again light spider web like lines in the 1 to 2 kg range that float in the breeze but still deliver the goods. Don't fear the larger fish appearing, they like a light lunch too, so hang on!

Family history mystery deepens......

A quest of family history has been developing over the past few months in Bunyip. The nieces of Eva Peck, (Fitzpatrick/Mitchell) recently travelled to Bunyip to unearth a family mystery. Eva Peck had once lived in Bunyip and managed a cafe in Main St. That was where she met and married Bunyip resident Jack Fitzpatrick in 1938. Jack was known to work in a butcher shop in Main Street before enlisting in the army during World War 2. Eva's 2nd relationship was to Alan Lyndsay Mitchell. The Mitchells were a prominent farming family, which was reported in the book, Call of the Bunyip. (1990)

The family first visited the cemetery to locate the grave of Percy Mitchell which unfortunately was not marked and so not possible. The nieces four, then travelled to the farm of John & Sue Anderson which is thought to be the old farm of Percy Mitchell, Alan's father. After being so engrossed in their search for some history of Eva and Raymond Peck's life in Bunyip

it suddenly hit them they hadn't had lunch! Luckily the Bakehouse was still open when they got back to town and they indulged in some of the best sausage rolls ever tasted!

After some information from Sue at the Bunyip Historical Society who related to them that were two butchers in town. One had been demolished and the other was where Biddy Martha's cafe is they wanted to check it out. Was this previously the butcher shop Jack Fitzpatrick worked in back in 1930's? The group had a long drive home, so they reluctantly left the town of Bunyip, holding its secrets they longed to discover. But their quest continues and they invite anyone who may be able add or verify any of their discoveries or help with more information about Eva Peck, Jack Fitzpatrick or Alan Mitchell they would be very glad to hear from them via email at waltermarsh@optusnet.com.au or through Sue our contact from the Bunyip Historical Society.






