Supporting A Charitable Cause

Rain, hail or sunshine doesn't deter Frank and Robyn Hill from attending the Bunyip and District Community Market. All the money made from their bric a brac stall goes to supporting farmers doing it tough throughout Australia. The charity, known as "Need for Feed" has already benefited from a donation of \$1000.00 which was handed over in April this year.

They are a lovely, friendly, generous and welcoming couple. Come down to the Market on Sunday the 25th of this month and say "hello" to them and check out their stall. If you don't buy anything from their stall, then consider making a small donation to this worthwhile cause.

Rider Safety

It's often an uncomfortable topic, but motorcycle safety is not something to be ignored.

I have often written about the joys of riding, and advantages of bikes over cars but the Herald Sun recently reported a 23 per cent increase in motorcyclist deaths this year. That amounts to 32 bikers killed on our roads so far in 2022, up from 26 recorded at the same time last year. These figures have now subsequently prompted calls for more rider training and further safety measures.

Its no secret that I enjoy my motorbiking, but the harsh reality is that it does present a higher risk activity when compared to other modes of transport. I have experienced quite a serious accident, completely my own fault, and resulting in a broken left collarbone and broken right wrist, rendering both arms out of action for a while. Needless to say, that dressing myself, using a keyboard and basic hygiene were quite the challenge for a few weeks thereafter!

Nonetheless, the accident did smack me with a good dose of reality, and I must admit I have tamed my ways somewhat. In fact, if I can provide any safety advice and guidance at all, I'd suggest that you motorbikers out there might think of my four C's when it come to safety considerations. Those C's are Cars, Capability, Clothing and Critters:

<u>Cars</u> – needless to say, they are all around us. When riding, be mindful of not only the cars in front of you but also to your sides and behind you. I'd suggest you don't ride fearfully of other vehicles but rather respectfully – keep your distances, be alert but not alarmed. Also, be mindful of blindspots when it comes to other vehicles – when riding behind another car, try to show yourself in their right hand side or rear vision mirrors...just so they know you're there.

<u>Capability</u> – I've often said that one of the joys of riding is the community of bikers, riding in groups. The challenge though with riding in groups is that rider capabilities will usually differ, as will riding styles and the bikes themselves. My recommendation is to always ride within your own limitations – let the quicker, more capable riders go ahead, and agree to meet peridocially at pre-defined locations along the journey. From my experience, when this is made clear upfront, nobody minds…its all just part of the journey!

<u>Clothing</u> – I can't stress the importance of good quality motorcycle gear. It is definitely well worth the investment in more than suitable pants, jacket, gloves, boots and a top quality helmet....do not skimp...it could mean the difference between bruises and breaks if you were to come off!

<u>Critters</u> – we live in a beautiful country and regional area and animals sometimes crossing our roads are a reality. Some of our most enjoyable riding roads are up in the hills, or through the bush and native animals like the good old wombat or kangaroos are plentiful. When my mates and i do our trips into central Australia we have an unwritten rule that we will always pull up stumps and stop riding after 4pm, just to reduce the risk of coming face-to-face with animals as they start to mobilise around sunset.

There are plenty of other safety tips but as we turn the seasonal corner and head into spring, we dust off the bike and start planning day-trips and weekenders, please be sure to consider your gear, the conditions and some of the circumstances I've described above...and most importantly stay safe!

TALKIN'FISHIN' A LASTING FINISH

Weather your assembling a fishing rod you've built or a Fly you've tied, a lure you've made or just have something special that needs a glossy finish. The final procedure can make or break the look and that should be as important to you as it would be to the recipient of the product or gift. Dress to impress as they say!

2 Part epoxy has an 8 drying time, don't rush it though as its strength is in the drying time, slowly. A clear glossy finish is the aim here, after mixing equal parts allow it to stand for 10 mins or so to allow the air bubbles to rise to the surface and pop. Stir the mixture slowly, not vigorously as



this will minimise the air bubbles in it. Coat your product with a small artist brush and keep it rotating until dry, a battery spit rotisserie motor is ideal for the job. Pop any persistent bubbles with a <u>quick</u> pass with a gentle flame, a stove lighter will do the trick. You can use this product for coating rod bindings, flies head building, crank bait and bib lures body finishes, repairs to fishing gear and sealing knots to pass through guides easier.

Another product for use is a quality brand nail polish, there's many colours to choose from in this world. Dress your lures to the 9's and your lead jig heads. Sally Hansen's, Hard-as-Nails is always on my fly tying bench, it adds a light and hard finish to all my creations.

UV Epoxy is a whole new revelation to some, fly tiers can thank the printing, and ink trade, and once again the nail cosmetic industry for this brilliant product. 1 or 2 coats, dried between layers, no drying time, sets by a UV torch light in seconds.

A soft body over fur and fibres can be attained by using glazier's ultra-clear silicone,

but it's messy so use disposable gloves and an icypole stick to apply, hang to dry for 12 hrs.

Use all these in well ventilated rooms or outside, but you can usually expect to find a bug or fly permanently immortalised in your creation next morning. Can be carefully removed with a razor blade then re-coat.
