Local popular Bunyip doctor, Dr Mamdouh Georgy was awarded the Bunyip & District Citizen for 2018 Award at the Australia Day ceremony held in Bunyip on Friday 26th January.

Councillor Ray Brown representing the Port Ward of Cardinia Shire spoke about the importance of "mateship" which Australians share and which remains an important part of our culture.

Australia Day ambassador Dr Bronwyn King, Radiation Oncologist at Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre was the Guest Speaker. Dr King is the founder and CEO of Tobacco Free Portfolios. During her speech she told how organisations and big businesses are now shying away from sponsoring tobacco companies. Dr King is an acknowledged world leader in the fight against big tobacco investment. She has helped redirect more than \$6 billion of investment from the tobacco industry to other industries globally over the past five years.

Dr King presented Dr Georgy with his award who was very surprised and gave an emotional response in acceptance of the award. Congratulations to Dr Georgy on this well deserve recognition.

STOP the Bunyip North Quarry update

The Mount Cannibal and District Preservation Group

Upcoming Community Information Session

Hanson is holding a Community Information Session on **Saturday 3rd March from 1pm to 5pm** at the Bunyip Hall. The Mount Cannibal & District Preservation Group urge all residents with concerns on how the quarry proposal will affect them to attend this Information Session to discuss these concerns with the specialist consultants and authority representatives.

Hanson's Project Development Manager, Stephanie Salinas, recently sent out an email with Project Update #8 outlining the new 'EES Consultation Code of Conduct', which was accidently sent to recipients not as a blind copy that protects their privacy.

The Project Update document states;

"It is the policy of Hanson to ensure that company projects and activities actively demonstrate respect for the people and organisations we work with, and support inclusive and sustainable community engagement."

"To achieve this, Hanson wishes to encourage that all parties participating in a meeting respect the Code of Conduct outlined below and reserves the right to withdraw its representatives from any event or occasion where it considers a breach of the code has occurred."

"Participating parties include community members, representatives of community organisations, Hanson employees and consultant representatives contracted by Hanson to undertake studies defined in the Scoping Requirements document."

Hanson states that the Code of Conduct would be uploaded to the Hanson website, but as of Tuesday 20th February it was still not available with Project



A recent article in Pakenham Gazette left absolutely no doubt how the owner of this vehicle feels about Hanson's plans for a Mega Quarry in Bunyip North.

Update #7 being the last uploaded in to the project's document area. Apparently it will be included in the Community Consultation Plan Version 3 which is expected to be published by March 2018.

Basically it states it's "the facilitator's role is to direct the consultation session/forum"; "the facilitator will nominate the order of persons who wish to speak and this will be respected"; and "the facilitator, or any participant, has a right to close the forum/session if they believe the Code of Conduct ... has been breached". Hopefully the full Code of Conduct will be available to residents before the Community Information Session so our voices will be heard.

Speaking out at Council Meeting

The Mount Cannibal and District Preservation Group represented the residents of Bunyip, Bunyip North, Garfield, Garfield North, Tonimbuk and surrounding areas at the Cardinia Council Briefing Meeting held in the Council Offices at 20 Siding Avenue, Officer on Monday 12th February at 4:00pm.

President Bill Pearson said, "we are delighted that the Council have provided us with the opportunity to address the councillors and executive of the Shire and fully explain why the residents are so concerned about this massive new quarry proposal in Bunyip North."

Secretary David Bywater said that "the quarry proposal is massive and will permanently and irrecoverably damage the area, its ecology and bio-diversity, and will make a beautiful area unsuitable to live in and enjoy."

Although the council did voice its opposition to the quarry about five years ago, council staff and councillors have changed and they needed to be brought up to speed.

"The council has been great, attending our protest walk and other events, but now we're asking them to officially reaffirm their support," David said. "The increasing population in Victoria and the steady movement of people away from Melbourne will see significant growth of residential housing throughout the Cardinia Shire and this is hopelessly incompatible with the operation of a nearby super quarry."

Assistant Secretary Lorris Jones added that "we will be asking the council to support the community in resisting the quarry proposal and encouraging the proponent to seek a location that is less environmentally fragile, less populated and better placed to safely handle the traffic the quarry wants to generate."

In the briefing to councillors, David Bywater outlined the following issues with the location of the proposed mega quarry.

- Within immediate catchment of the Cannibal Creek and the Bunyip River.
- 360 metres from Mount Cannibal to the west, which is well under the required 1 km distance.
- Very close proximity to growing townships of Bunyip and Garfield.
- Surrounded by prime agriculture, residential living and vital bio-diverse remnant vegetation.
- In close proximity to the Bunyip State Park.
- Tonimbuk Equestrian Centre would be part of Quarry Operations.



Hanson acquire more property

Speculation that the Goy's property on Michell Road was being purchased has now been confirmed. In Hansons Update #7 they advised the following.

"On 10th January, 2018 Hanson took ownership of a property located at Michell Road, Bunyip North. Please note the quarry project proposal does not change in light of the recent acquisition as the Scoping Requirements have already been set. The land use for this property will be for buffer or potential environmental offset purposes. Hanson has commenced arrangements for land management practices on the property as required."

We acknowledge that Hanson representatives were queried about this purchase prior to 10th January, 2018. However, due to contract confidentiality conditions, Hanson was unable to provide a response until the property title had been issued.



The residents of our community are not against quarrying. The materials from quarries are needed by everyone. The Gippsland Region has great resources and is suitable for extractive industries. However, the proposed Hanson Quarry in Bunyip North is in the worst of locations and would bring with it permanent environmental destruction and total loss of community amenity. There are lots of other areas along this ridge that would better suited to quarrying with less population and fragile environment.

It shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent anyone interfering with the Judges and, if necessary, order the removal of such offender from the ground. 6. The Judge may award a second or third prize in place of a first or withhold a prize altogether when the exhibits are of not sufficient worth. 7. All persons exhibiting shall accept that the decision of the Judges appointed by the Society, and

in case of protests, the decision of the Dispute Committee shall be final and without appeal. 6. The Society may withhold any prize when statements have been erroneously made regarding an exhibit and exhibitors guilty of false entries may be debarred from entering again exhibiting and if members, will be expelled from the Society. 7. The Society reserves the right to refuse admittance or eject from the showgrounds any person. And refuse an exhibit or eject from the showgrounds any person. And refuse an exhibit or exhibitor without giving any reason.

8. Any person making a Pavilion entry will receive a ticket stating Section and Number from the Secretary when staging exhibits

18. All persons connected with or engaging in risk or activity in the arena and other departments do so at their own risk.

19. It shall be a condition of entry to the Showground that no person shall hold the Society responsible for any accident that may be caused thereon through or by any exhibit. Competitors also enter, ride and otherwise take part at their own risk.

20. The Society shall not in any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss by fire, storm, and damage by water, flood or lightning.
