Introducing Bunyip's Australia Day Citizen of the Year

Popular Bunyip man, Alan Wright, was awarded the Australia Day Bunyip & District Citizen of the Year Award at the Australia Day ceremony held in the Bunyip Hall on Saturday 26th January. Representing the Cardinia Shire was Mayor Cr Graeme Moore who addressed the audience speaking on how we should all be proud of being Australian.

MC for the day was Russell Pendlebury and the entertainment was provided by the Bunyip Singers and popular local poet Gerard Cunningham.



Australia Day Ambassador Angela Barker was guest speaker. Angela is a highly motivated and inspirational young woman whose life changed forever in 2002 when at the age of 16 she was brutally bashed to near death by her ex-boyfriend. She suffered severe brain damage, and the prognosis was that she would remain in a vegetative state for the rest of her life. Against the odds, Angela started to make a recovery and today, seventeen years after the assault, although still in a wheelchair, she continues to make progress and to amaze everyone with her on-going recovery.

In 2004, the Federal Government released a DVD about Angela's story called 'Loves Me, Loves Me Not' as part of their Domestic Violence Campaign, which was distributed to every secondary school in Australia. She has spoken to over 36,000 students on preventing relationship violence. During her speech you could have heard a pin drop as Angela held the Bunyip audience spellbound – some wiped away a tear whilst others gave her a standing ovation; such was her powerful story.

Angela now 33, commented she was humbled and surprised when it was announced that she was awarded an OAM Medal this year. She was thrilled to announced that she has become engaged and that her life is getting better by the day.



Proposed petrol station for Bunyip centre


A planning permit has been applied for on the property on the North West corner of Hope Street and Railway Avenue in Bunyip for \$1.5 million petrol station development. The permit applicant is Tim Retrot form proUrban Advisory, Planning & Management and the property owners are Blair and Janice Tourk from Iona. Project managers SwitchCo have also been engaged for the project.

The proposed service station will have an operating permit for 24/7 and employ approximately five staff members and will offer the following.

- Air and water services area
- Carwash facility and associated vacuum bay
- Control building (180m²) and canopy
- Eight car fuelling bays
- Six car spaces
- Bin room
- Plant room

Vehicles would be able to enter via either Hope Street or Railway Avenue. A 7.3 metre high pylon advertising sign would be positioned on the South East corner of the site.

In an interview for this article the property owner Blair Tourk said that his family had been farming in the area for a number of years and had now sold their farm to enable the proposed development of the service station which would be operated independently. The family is committed to the area and their children attend local schools. He intends to engage local contractors where appropriate to the project but a builder is yet to be engaged. Although the proposal includes a 24/7 operating permit Blair does not anticipate this to be the case at this stage and hours would be driven by demand.



Grant to benefit Bunyip



Talkin' Fishin'... The perfect workstation

Health Matters – Fungal nail problems



Fungal nail infections, known to doctors as onychomycosis, can affect both toenails and fingernails, but toenail infections are more common.

What are the signs and symptoms associated with fungal nail infections?

Fungal nail infections can cause a variety of changes in the affected nail, including:

- white or yellow spots or streaks under the tip of the nail;
- thickening and roughness;
- brittle, crumbling nail edges;
- nail discoloration (nails may turn white, yellow or brown);
- separation of the nail from the nail bed; and
- pain and tenderness.

What causes fungal nail problems?

Fungal nail problems are caused by a fungus spreading under the nail into the nailbed. Different types of fungi can infect nails, including the so-called dermatophytes, as well as some forms of moulds and yeasts. The fungus may infect a broken or injured nail, or may spread to the nail from a nearby skin infection, such as athlete's foot.

Fungal infections can be picked up by walking barefoot in public changing rooms, pools, and showers.

Anywhere warm and moist where the public walk barefoot is an ideal environment for the fungus to spread from person to person.

Who is at risk?

There are several factors that can put you at increased risk of developing a fungal nail infection. These include:

- having diabetes;
- having problems with your circulation;
- having a problem with your immune system;
- being a smoker;
- being older than 60;
- wearing footwear that is closed-in, has poor ventilation, and doesn't absorb sweat;
- working in a humid or moist environment; and
- having constantly moist skin, often due to excessive sweating.

People involved in sporting activities such as running may be at increased risk of getting a fungal toenail infection because they often damage their toenails, which provides an opening for infections to get under the toenail. Also, wearing running shoes means that the feet are often exposed to warm, moist conditions, which are ideal for the development of a fungal infection. People who frequently have wet hands, such as cooks and professional cleaners, are at increased risk of developing a fungal infection of the fingernails.

How are fungal nail infections treated?

Early treatment may prevent damage to or loss of the nail, and treatment at any stage may reduce discomfort and improve the nail's appearance. However, fungal nail infections can be difficult to treat, and can recur following successful treatment. Also, because nails (especially toenails) grow slowly, it can take up to a year for the appearance of the nail to return to normal, even if treatment is successful. Fingernail infections can generally be cured more quickly and effectively than toenail infections.

If the infection is superficial or involves only the end of the nail, a topical (local) treatment may be tried. A nail lacquer called amorolfine (Loceryl) can be used, and is applied once or twice a week until the nail re-grows (for toenails this may take up to 12 months). When using amorolfine, do not put nail polish or false nails over the top. Amorolfine should not be used by children, or women who are pregnant or breast feeding. More extensive infections (involving the base of the nail or the nail-bed) generally need oral antifungal medication. The exact choice will depend on which fungus is causing the problem, whether you have other medical conditions, are pregnant or planning to become pregnant (some treatments may affect the unborn baby), and what other medications you are taking.

When medical treatments don't work, another option is to remove the nail, either surgically or with chemicals. A new nail should grow back in its place.

What else can be done to treat and prevent fungal nail infections?

In addition to antifungal treatments, you can help manage a fungal nail infection (and prevent further infections from developing) by:

- keeping your nails short;
- filing down any thick areas;
- thoroughly drying your hands and feet, including between the fingers and toes, after washing; and
- using a separate pair of nail scissors for any infected nails.

For fingernail infections, protect your hands from moisture when doing wet work by wearing waterproof gloves. If a toenail is affected, wear open-toed shoes or shoes with plenty of room for your toes. Always wear clean, dry socks that absorb moisture, especially if your feet sweat a lot, and change your socks when they are damp from sweat. And remember not to walk barefoot in public change rooms, pools or showers.

Black Saturday Fire 10th Anniversary Event at St.Thomas' Bunyip

Fires that devastated Victoria 10 years ago had a lasting impact on the communities round Bunyip. While no lives were lost, the fire in the Bunyip State Forest was a time of great distress and loss. The speakers enabled the congregation to walk in the shoes of those who had experienced the terror and the grief.

Lt. John Legione, who had commanded the Bunyip Fire Brigade on that day, spoke powerfully of the courage and determination of the fire fighters. Jaan Enden, a member of St. Thomas' Church and a farmer at Labertouche, spoke publicly for the first time of how she and her late husband Bruce, fought to save their house and animals. The Bunyip Singers, under the direction of Dorothy Myers, held the event together with a wonderful choice of songs. Members of the Uniting Church and Roman Catholic community also participated. Nobody was in a hurry to go home – everyone gathered under the trees for a drink and nibble. The church was blessed by the tears of the night, the laughter and the conversation

Bunyip Fire Brigade – ready to serve

This is a part of a speech given by the Divisional Commander at the 10th Anniversary of Black Saturday.

To begin with it is impossible to tell the story of the 2009 fires without speaking about the enormous task our emergency services took on during that long and dreadful summer. We had a string of record-breaking hot days, well over 40 degrees, coming on the back of a decade long drought. This created weather patterns and circumstances that we had never seen before.

Today we reflect on the worst bushfire to occur in Australia and the impact that Black Saturday was to have, not only on us as an emergency service, but on the wider community.

Ten years ago today, the state was tinder dry and the storm force winds that accompanied the extreme heat created the conditions for this unprecedented disaster.

Between 2nd and 4th February there were a reported 17 lightning strikes in the Bunyip State Park. Our fire – 'The Bunyip Ridge Fire' being one of them. The fact that this fire was already bubbly away for several days prior to the 7th February was a blessing because it gave the CFA an opportunity to put plans into place and the chance to provided information and warnings to residents in its path.

More importantly it gave the emergency services time to establish an Incident Management Team and ascertain trigger points and make decisions regarding resourcing and the management of this fire.

As a brigade we attempted to contact all of our residents in and around Tonimbuk, with meetings in Labertouche, Jindivick, Tonimbuk and Drouin West in order to assist residents understand the threat they faced and provide information, so that they could make decisions about their safety and the safety of others. With prepared teams of CFA vehicles we readied ourselves for what was to come. And what came, was something out of the box. Something that

very few have experienced before. One of our more experienced fire-fighters described it as "columns of flame falling forward out of the trees... it looked like



someone was throwing a flamethrower out of the trees". At one stage during the ordeal one of our trucks was singed and burnt by a fire that started in the dry vegetation near the vehicle by the millions of embers that were flying across the landscape. Another sought shelter by burning out an area and then parking their truck on it so as not to be overrun by the flames. Not only were our members out in the field risking their lives in order to protect our community, but we had members assisting with the aircraft, with catering and other duties. We also had the wives, the husbands, the partners, the relatives and the children of our members all providing that support that we so desperately needed.

In summary the Bunyip Ridge Fire was as a result of a suspected lightning strike on or about 2nd February 2009, with only two causalities and thankfully no fatalities. However unfortunately we did lose 31 homes and buildings and many kilometres of fencing along with livestock and wildlife. We had almost 900 emergency services personnel on the ground, 120 firefighting appliances along with 10 aircraft and in total the fire burnt through more that 26,000 hectares.

Finally on behalf of the CFA I thank you, the community for your support that you provided during that horrendous time in our history and look forward to that continued support in the future as we protect our community here in Bunyip and the surrounding district and even across the State. We will never forget 7th February 2009.


