
Bunyip Beekeeper goes into administration

Talkin' Fishin' ... Restocking

For those of us who still like to tie their own fishing flies like me, not for any cost saving benefit but just for the pure pleasure or therapy, the tools are just as important as the fur and fibres and materials used.

One of those materials is deer hair. As you cut the fibres from the hide, the tips need to be aligned so they can be tied on the fly appearing neatly in line. A deer hair stacker solves this issue perfectly by loading hair in the tube. Bang the tube's end on your bench, remove the end cap, then cut the butt end to the desired length and tie in place on the fly. On average you will pay for one of these is \$20–\$25 each for this essential tool, but why not make your own for around \$2 to \$3 each.

This tool is neither complicated to make nor an engineering marvel, but that's a bit unfair because I would be lost without this handy device. All that is required is a tube with a flared opening at one end so to make it easier to put the fibres inside it, and a removable cap at the other end, both become aligned together after cap has been packed down.

Most times the size you will need for average use is a ½ inch and ¾ inch diameter models, but feel free to make a whole sized collection if you wish. I use the

term inches only because that's how copper pipe is still sold, welcome to the almost metric age! If you are

resourceful enough you can easily get two clean pieces of pipe in the correct diameter from your friendly plumber or purchase at Bunnings. A foot long of each is more than you'll need, with the total length of the finished item only being 2 inches for the larger and 1½ inches for the smaller diameter.

The corresponding copper end caps are only a couple of dollars. Use a plumbers flaring tool to open the end of the pipe in the shape you see in the photos; watch any YouTube video if you're not sure how to do this safely. Then cut to the pipe to length, and file and sand away any rough edges. You can also rub the pipe to a finished shine with steel wool if you like. End caps should be easy to remove and not fight with you or you'll have hair all over you and the bench.

So create your own deer hair stacker and look forward to your creations and subsequent trophy fish. Welcome to a new season of fishing and with no boat ramp fees about to be introduced... and about time!

Monthly local police update (21st December 2018)

By Sergeant Danny Hower, Victoria Police

I hope everyone has had a good and happy end to 2018, and thank you for all the very positive assistance and input that we've had in so many different areas locally during past few years. There are some very good people around and I'm proud to be associated with everyone.

I thought it might be good to round off the past 12 months and start the new-year with some local area police statistics and information.

When a crime or some other pre-determined occurrences are reported to police in Victoria they are initially electronically recorded as an 'Incident' on our Law Enforcement Assistance Program (LEAP). Some of the "other" occurrences recorded as an 'Incident' on LEAP include Missing Persons reports, Family Violence Incidents and Fires. Generally this list of Incidents does not include traffic offences or traffic fines unless they are of a criminal nature, or until they are paid or determined otherwise. Confused yet?

An Incident in the LEAP system will then often have what Victoria Police call 'Sub Incidents' attached. These 'Sub Incidents' are generally additional criminal offences or occurrences committed by the same person that can be related to the initial Incident – or something like that. For your info I haven't been successful in finding 'Sub Incidents' in the dictionary.

The following table is a total of police Sub Incidents (not Incidents) by local geographic location that were reported and investigated between 21st December 2017 and 20th December 2018 for your perusal and discussion... as we say in the business.

In our system if an Incident isn't reported – then it probably isn't recorded – and if it's not recorded – it doesn't look like it happened. Some of the previous numbers might look overwhelming but often increased numbers can be attributed to higher population areas and increased / targeted police activities.


