12th Annual Quilt And Craft Show

The popular annual Hillview Quilt and Craft Show will run over three days next month from Friday the 19th to Sunday the 21st of August opening from 9:30am till 3:00pm each day. A large number of people from all over Gippsland is expected to attend over this weekend.

The Quilt and Craft display will be at Hillview Aged Care, 22 A'Beckett Road in Bunyip. It is run by the Friends of Hillview which is a community committee of volunteers that raises funds through various activities to purchase items of equipment for the staff and residents at Hillview Aged Care. "We have a hard working dedicated committee and receive great support from the community", said Mrs Dickinson.

From humble beginnings twelve years ago, this annual event has grown to become one of this areas top draw cards attracting exhibitors and visitors from near and far.

Show organiser Barbara Dickinson said that the quality of the quilts on display last year showed that more people are taking up the art of quilting and some are producing and showing

magnificent quilts.

To submit an entry is only \$2 and guilters are encouraged to show off their work. 





WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT ANTIBIOTICS

What is an antibiotic and what does it do?

Antibiotics are medications that are used to treat and prevent infections that are caused by bacteria. They are ineffective against infections that are caused by viruses. The common cold and the flu are caused by viruses and this would be the reason why your doctor may refuse to give antibiotics for this infection. Misappropriate use of antibiotics may cause bacteria to become resistant to antibiotic treatments.

The mechanism of action of individual antibiotics within the body and the types of bacteria they work against differs. Hence we have different groups of antibiotics, such as penicillins, tetracycline, cephalosporin's, macrolide (erythromycin) etc that are used to treat different kinds of infections. Your doctor will prescribe you the most appropriate antibiotic for the particular infection that you have, specific to the bacteria that usually causes it.

You do need to tell your doctor if you have any allergies to medicine and taking any over-the-counter, complementary or natural medicines. You need to also tell your doctor if he or she is unfamiliar with any chronic condition that you may have, such as asthma, heart, liver or kidney problems. Of course advise your GP if you are pregnant or breast-feeding.

It is important to follow instructions on when, how, and for how long to take the antibiotics. These instructions will be on the label attached to your packet by your pharmacist. Some antibiotics should not be taken with certain foods, while other are best taken with a meal or on an empty stomach. Your prescription label on the packet will generally have this information. Always finish the entire course of antibiotic, even if you feel better. If you stop halfway through your course the antibiotics may not have chance to completely kill off the bacteria. Bacteria could then become resistant to that antibiotic. This means the antibiotics will no longer work against these bacteria. Your symptoms may return and possibly be more severe. Do not share antibiotics with other people. They may be allergic to it, or have a different infection and can further lead to antibiotic resistance.

All medicines have side-effects including antibiotics. Ask your pharmacist for a printout if one isn't included in the packet. Most side-effects are not serious. Generally diarrhoea, nausea and vomiting are common complaints. If you have severe stomach cramps and severe or prolonged diarrhoea then you need to contact your doctor straight away. You may get a fungal infection such as thrush for which you can buy medications without a prescription.

Less commonly, allergic reactions may occur. Advise your doctor as soon as possible if you develop itching and/or a rash. Stop the treatment and seek medical attention from your nearest hospital if you experience a severe reaction with a lumpy rash, breathing difficulty and or swollen lips, tongue or face.

Patients commonly ask Pharmacists if they can have alcohol whilst on antibiotics. It is generally a good idea not to have alcohol if you are not well. Consuming alcohol in moderation is not usually a problem with most antibiotics, but there are some exceptions. Check with your doctor or pharmacist.





Butterfly Ballet is held each Monday 9.30 at the Bunyip hall, first class is free, ages 2.5 to 5 years old All welcome




CANNIBAL CREEK PONY CLUB.


All the riders enjoyed the day. We would like to thank our Pairs coach Kirsty Porter and Games coach George Fry for all their time.
