

Don't be a Dag...

With no more single use plastic bags available from our local IGA, here are a couple of tips for surviving life without those bin-liners or freezer bags!

Don't bother with kitchen bin liners... I promise your kitchen won't stink!

- It only takes a moment to wash out your kitchen bin with warm soapy water or a bit of eucalyptus oil after you have emptied it.
- Try wrapping food waste, bones, peels etc. in newspaper or put them into an old cereal box or biscuit box. I seem to have plenty of those in my paper recycling bin! By doing this your bin doesn't get smelly and you will barely need to rinse it out after emptying.
- Better still start a compost bin or worm farm to avoid throwing any food waste in the bin and save on nonorganic fertilisers!

Don't use a liner in your green rubbish bin

■ Just rinse it out with warm soapy water (using one of those window cleaner sponges and rubber blade on a stick to reach to the bottom of the bin)... maybe once a month.

Try using reusable plastic or glass containers in the fridge and freezer

- Butter, margarine or dip containers are excellent for freezing single serves of meat chicken or fish... or leftovers! These can be labelled easily with freezer labels and used many times thus avoiding the need to purchase freezer bags.
- Of course larger containers can be used for larger serves.



Talkin' Fishin'... Food for thought

Fishing days can be hard work, giving you the thirst and hunger of a wild animal. If you're fishing from a boat or pier or with the car close enough, you can take the family fridge or esky if you like, with a full banquet. But when you're mobile backpacking and fishing at the same time, travelling along the beaches or streams and rivers, the weight and type of food and drink is definitely a consideration to undertake.

Thermos style drink containers for liquids, either hot or cold, have the obvious thermal properties and strength, with the bonus of the cup should you want a fresh scoop of water from the running stream. Just make sure you check you are upstream from the nearest dead or alive cow sharing the water also.

Food types should be dry or non-perishable. Weight is your greatest hindrance, and lugging a heavy pack around all day plus your fishing gear is no fun and will tire you out in no time.

You want to look for nutritious, tasty energy foods, not heavy and filling. 'Pizza' is not on the menu list. Avoid oily foods that may cause you to make unscheduled toilet stops, but in case of emergencies always carry half a toilet roll with you, because we've all been caught short at some stage... but please bury it!

Commercially sold trail-mix packets contain grains, nuts, dried fruit, even chocolate. You can copy the ingredients and make up your own. Energy bars, and biscuits are all acceptable.

Remember though this is a snack-pack not a smorgasbord!
So don't go overboard. But should you become lost as some

have, you will have a sustainable food supply. Cold boiled potatoes are my favourite, filling and tasty.

Avoid overly salty products as this will only increase your thirst potential. Carry oranges or apples as these provide a refreshing zing and keep you hydrated and come in a happy biodegradable skin.

And yeah, I have heard of sandwiches, but who hasn't had a dry curly edged one or a sloppy warm flat one squashed in the bag that you still ate because you were that hungry... or worse found the one in the bottom of your pack you didn't finish or forgot from the last trip all green and powdery! You know the ones I'm taking about. Your kids used to bring them home from school at the end of term after cleaning out their lockers.

Packaged foods should be in a crushable packets like yoghurts, juice boxes etc. the less of these you take the better. Stay away from the tin stuff because you will be taking all your empty containers home to be disposed of responsibly... WONT YOU?

Hanson announces delay for troubled mega quarry

Hanson Materials has just announced that they are deferring the delivery of the Environmental Effects Statement (EES) for the proposed new Bunyip North granite super quarry for six months. The announcement, made through Hanson's Project Manager Stephanie Salinas and published by way of a limited circulation Project Update, gives no reason for the delay. The EES was ordered by the Minister for Planning, Richard Wynne, in November 2015 and, if the revised timetable is to be believed, the EES will not conclude until June 2020.

This will mean that an organisation with all the resources of Hanson is unable to deliver their studies within a timeline less than four and a half years. "This is woefully inadequate and highly unprofessional by Hanson's own Project Team", said David Bywater, Secretary of the Mt. Cannibal & District Preservation Group, "or perhaps Hanson has made a strategic decision and calculated that a delay like this may gain some form of advantage. Without any reasons given the community can only speculate on why the delay has occurred, but a lack of project resourcing, funding or manpower for this large multi-national organisation would not seem to be a reasonable explanation for the delay", he added.

"This is a terrible blow to residents", said Bill Pearson, President of the Mt. Cannibal & District Preservation Group. "The community has already waited for 12 years



since Hanson deceptively came into our area and purchased the first property for their quarry back in 2006, and now it seems this wait will go on to 2020. The residents have no certainty over their future, cannot make decisions about their homes and properties and are stuck waiting on Hanson. This is unfair, unethical and will not be well received by the community", he added.

In Hanson's Project Update the proponent has published a Receptor Map which shows properties around the proposed quarry site that would be directly impacted by the proposed quarry. The map is inaccurate and Hanson has asked the community to provide updates and has set a time limit of 13th July 2018.

"Why have Hanson delayed their study but still impose an unreasonable time limit on residents to correct Hanson's own mapping errors?", asked Katherine Lee, a resident of Garfield North. She went on to say, "Perhaps they should use their own delay to visit all residents in the affected areas and complete their map themselves. They could also talk to residents and learn first-hand what the issues are with their disastrous quarry proposal".

Coughs, colds and sore throats

Well, sneezin' season is well and truly here, and all the wonderful home remedies are out and about. Some of these ideas, many of them years old are quite effective. Years and years of scientific advances have found very few successful cures for the common cold. The 'common cold' varies so much from person to person in both its symptoms, severity and duration.

While there are many varieties of virus that bring on the common cold, there is always a predisposition in each individual that will lead to the symptoms that each person suffers. In this article I will deal with general information on how to treat colds, coughs and sore throats. I will also briefly discuss that underlying factors often make people vulnerable to suffer specific symptoms.

To acknowledge, investigate and treat the predispositions can result in the person not having to suffer so much next time they are in contact with a virus that causes cold symptoms. I will elaborate on prevention in my next article, but in this article I will concentrate on treatment of cold symptoms, both professionally and a few home remedy ideas.

Symptoms of a cold are many, including nasal discharge and sneezing, sore red throat, swollen lymph glands, headache, elevated temperature, lethargy, coughing and irritability. When treating a cold, I aim to assist with both symptom relief and holistic treatment. Many, many people each year choose to come to me for treatment for a cold. I will give a brief explanation of some of the remedies that I use, and a very brief explanation why. I hope you understand that I have to keep my information general.

Hydration is extremely important, especially if there is elevated temperature and mucous discharge. Therefore drink lots of water. Rest is extremely important, although I think fresh air and a bit of gentle movement to maintain lymph flow is also important. Food should be kept pretty simple with lots of vegetable juices and soups. Sugar has been shown to compete with vitamin C for transport sites into the white blood cells, which may therefore result in reduction in white blood cell function. It should be noted that many fruit juices, including orange juice contain quite a lot of sugar.

As far as supplementation, I have found the mineral salts Iron Phosphate (especially if there is an elevated temperature) and Potassium Chloride (especially if there is nasal mucous discharge). Vitamin C has been shown to both reduce the severity and duration of a cold. Beta carotene and vitamin A are also important



as they assist in maintaining the health of the lining of the respiratory tract. Zinc in many cases is also extremely effective. Some of the herbs I prescribe for the treatment of a cold are Andrographis, Cats Claw, Echinacea Angustifolia, Manuka, Clivers, Licorice, Euphorbia (if there is a cough), Sage (if there is a cough), Elder Flowers and Eyebright. I'm sure you understand that the treatment varies according to the symptoms and each patients constitution or type.

A few ideas to use at home are, if there appears to be sinus and gland inflammation, gentle massages of these area can assist in getting the congestion flowing, which can clear the glands and sinus area of waste. If there is throat discomfort, a combination of sage and licorice root tea can be sipped to give relief. While honey drinks are often suggested and do often relieve, care should be taken that the amount of sugar can often impede the treatment of the virus.

It is often suggested to let the cold run its course, which is fine if you have a healthy immune system, but quite often untreated colds can lead to quite a few secondary problems, so please don't let colds linger.



Health Matters - Ear wax


Wax in the ears causes a great deal of unnecessary concern. Many parents worry that their child has excessive earwax (cerumen), and go to great trouble trying to remove it. This is unnecessary and may be harmful.

Earwax is quite harmless and is a normal part of the body's self-protection mechanism. It is made by tiny glands in the skin that line the ear canal. The job of earwax is to trap dirt and other things that enter the ear canal and to slow the growth of bacteria. In most people the wax just works its way gradually out of the ear canal. Some people seem to make more wax than others. This is not a sign of poor hygiene.

Earwax build up

Sometimes wax builds up in the ear canal. It is not know why earwax build up happens to some people or why it often affects only one ear.

Trying to clean out the wax from inside the ear canal is not a good idea. In particular, putting cotton buds or bobby pins inside the ear canal should be avoided. These can damage the sensitive lining of the canal, and even damage the



ear drum. Most of the time all that happens is that the wax is pushed further down the canal. The only ear cleaning that is needed is to wipe or wash away the wax that has come out of the ear canal.

Ear candles are also not recommended. Research has shown ear candling does not work and it can cause injuries such as burns, blockages and damage to the eardrum.

If there is a build-up of wax in the ear canal it may cause a feeling of ear fullness or hearing problems. This is especially common after swimming. In this case the wax can be removed in the doctor's surgery by gently syringing with warm water. Very hard wax may need softening with drops from the chemist, or slightly warmed olive oil.

Parish mourns local priest

Monsignor Kenneth Hodgson is being mourned by parishioners of Corpus Christi Catholic Church in Tynong after his death on 16th June. His Requiem Mass was held on Wednesday 20th with over 500 people attended his funeral, some travelling from interstate. Following the Mass he was taken to Holy Cross Seminary in Goulburn NSW, where following the committal service he was buried in the seminary grounds.

Monsignor Hodgson was ordained a priest in 1962 whilst in Rome following his conversion as an Anglican minister from the Anglican faith. He had impressive academic accomplishments and was fluent in several languages including French and Italian as well as Latin, and he held a Doctorate in Literature.

He spent some years in America instructing seminarians and preparing them for the priesthood. He became friendly with Mel Gibson's family and performed a marriage ceremony for a cousin of Madonna's. He was well liked and respected wherever he travelled.

When St. Thomas' Aquinas College in Tynong opened it's doors on 28th January 1997, Monsignor Hodgson was one of the foundation teachers of the school.

In 2014 he celebrated 50 years as a priest, and his health deteriorated he went to live at Shanagolden Aged Care in Pakenham until his passing at 92 years.

COTA's men's group OM:NI meets in Bunyip

On Wednesday 27th June, twenty five men braved a freezing cold morning to gather in the Bunyip Hall for the inaugural meeting of OM:NI (Older Men New Ideas). Developed and run by male volunteers from COTA (Council On The Ageing) the introductory meeting provided opportunities for retired local district men to meet, talk and enjoy relating stories to each other about their lives over a cup of tea.

The Bunyip group will be meeting on the first Wednesday of each month commencing on Wednesday 1st August in the Bunyip Hall.

Many men retire and hit a brick wall with seemingly nowhere to go, so they can regress into a cocoon and become quite dormant. OM:NI gets them out of the house and gives them the opportunity to be part of support group where they can help others like themselves.

OM:NI was first established in NSW in the late 90's under COTA NSW. Unlike a Men's Shed environment, there are no physical activities during a meeting. The format of meetings is discussion and support. Members share what's been significant in their lives since the last meeting. There are strict rules which each member must abide by, one of those is confidentiality. This allows men the confidence to share their feelings with other like minded men. Participation in group discussions is voluntary; no one is forced to speak if they choose not to.

A topic is chosen for discussion at the following months meeting. Men from Tynong to Longwarry and beyond are welcome to attend the next meeting in the Bunyip Hall on **Wednesday 1st August at 9:15am**. For more information contact Tony Arrigo on 0407 563 441.

Then beginning outside, Jim drew our attention to the most beautiful work at St Thomas', which is set in the lovely gardens. The Christus Rex, made at the request of Father Fred Morrey, by Sister Jocelyn Anne of the (Anglican) Poor Clares, who were then at Stroud in NSW. It is a very beautiful memorial to the local pioneers and continues to be a focus for devotion and prayer in the church grounds. Jim also mentioned the A'Beckett memorial gate, which originally stood where the Lych Gate now stands. The church was built on land donated by the A'Beckett family who also donated the three stained glass windows in the sanctuary, and the cross and altar vases, plus the first organ. After working bees and fund raising, the church was built at the cost of £375. The foundation stone was laid by Mrs A'Beckett and it was opened on the 28th December 1902. The service that day included 12 baptisms.

The other features Father Jim talked to us about included the very pretty belfry tower, its bell which is

still rung before each service. Later the Walsingham Lady Chapel was added in 1996 and the 'Good Shepherd, Evans' window from St Mary's Garfield was reinstalled at St Thomas' in 2017.

We give thanks for the beautiful weather and the fruitfulness of the day. Will we do it again? Well as Father Ken says, "we have another opportunity on 7th October with the Blessing of the Animals".


Teddy used to built kites, and he and Lorraine would enter kite flying competitions in Victoria, South Australia and New South Wales. "We loved it," said Lorraine.

Monthly local police update (12th June to 5th July, 2018)

There have been some local enquiries regarding children being left unsupervised in cars, so I have supplied some legislatively appropriate facts which might formally explain things.

There is no specific offence under the State Road Rules or Traffic legislation relating to lack of supervision in parked vehicles – but there are pieces in relation to leaving a vehicle unattended / unlocked / running / keys in it. That legislation is mostly relevant to the security etc. of the vehicle, not the person.

But wait... there is an offence under the Children, Youth and Families Act 2005 Sect 494 (1) (amended by No. 61/2014 s. 150) which states:

"It is an offence to leave a child unattended."

The definition of a child under this particular legislation is described as:

"... in any other case, a person who is under the age of 17 years...".

The definition of 'Care' under this Act is:

"... 'care', in relation to a child, means the daily care and control of the child, whether or not involving parental responsibility for the child".

(1) A person who has the control or charge of a child must not leave the child without making reasonable provision for the child's supervision and care for a time which is unreasonable having regard to all the circumstances of the case. Penalty: 25 penalty units or imprisonment for 6 months or both.





So in summary when police are considering legal action with regard to the law in relation to things of this nature.

- Is the child under 17 years?
- Is there reasonable provision of supervision and care?
- What are all the circumstances?

The previous offence's wording with definitions might sound complicated – but police are generally supported by some key words and phrases which are often enshrined in legislation or policy somewhere. Some of those words are:

"Reasonable; Appropriate; Fair; Circumstances; Proportionate".

These words don't always make it into the headlines – but thankfully they're normally hanging around for us nearby because they were well considered at the time of making a decision.


