This project was able to be initiated through the generous Grants of local organisations. Market Committee President, Tony Arrigo expressed his

gratitude to those organisations and said that the next step would be to fit out the shelter with a twin plate BBQ, seating and rubbish bins as well as to enhance the surrounds.

THE LAST POST

If any of you have ever been to a military funeral in which The Last Post was played; this brings out a new meaning of it. Here is something everyone should know. Until I read this, I didn't know, but I checked it out and it's true: We have all heard the haunting song, 'The Last Post.' It's the song that gives us the lump in our throats and usually tears in our eyes. But, do you know the story behind the song? If not, I think you will be interested to find out about its humble beginnings.

Reportedly, it all began in 1862 during the American Civil War, when Union Army Captain Robert Ellicombe was with his men near Harrison's Landing in Virginia. The Confederate Army was on the other side of the narrow strip of land. During the night, Captain Ellicombe heard the moans of a soldier

who lay severely wounded on the field. Not knowing if it was a Union or Confederate soldier, the Captain decided to risk his life and bring the stricken man back for medical attention. Crawling on his stomach through the gunfire, the Captain reached the stricken soldier and began pulling him toward his encampment.

When the Captain finally reached his own lines, he discovered it was actually a Confederate soldier, but the soldier was dead. The Captain lit a lantern and suddenly caught his breath and went numb with shock. In the dim light, he saw the face of the soldier. It was his own son. The boy had been studying music in the South when the war broke out. Without telling his father, the boy enlisted in the Confederate Army. The following morning, heartbroken, the father asked

permission of his superiors to give his son a full military burial, despite his enemy status. His request was only partially granted. The Captain had asked if he could have a group of Army band members play a funeral dirge for his son at the funeral.

The request was turned down since the soldier was a Confederate. But, out of respect for the father, they did say they could give him only one musician.

The Captain chose a bugler. He asked the bugler to play a series of musical notes he had found on a piece of paper in the pocket of the dead youth's uniform.

This wish was granted. The haunting melody, we now know as 'The Last Post' used at military funerals was born. The words are:

Day is done. Gone the sun. From the lakes. From the

hills. From the sky. All is well. Safely rest. God is nigh. Fading light. Dims the sight. And a star. Gems the

sky. Gleaming bright. From afar. Drawing nigh. Falls the night. Thanks and praise. For

our days. Neath the sun. Neath the stars. Neath the sky. As we go. This we know. God is nigh

I too have felt the chills while listening to 'The Last Post' but I have never seen all the words to the song until now. I didn't even know there was more than one verse . I also never knew the story behind the song and I didn't know if you had either so I thought I'd pass it along. I now have an even deeper respect for the song than I did before.

Pharmacy now has a bulk billing GP next door. Not many realise that we have a Consultant Pharmacist that we engage at the request of a doctor to perform a HMR (Home Medication Review). If you qualify (which your doctor decides) then we can send our consultant pharmacist (not me!) who will come to your home and go through with you, all your

Dinesh Solanki medications (prescribed, vitamins, natural medicines, etc) and write up a report that will go back to your doctor, and a copy comes to us at the pharmacy, with recommendations. This service will not cost you as it is paid for by the federal government.

Also we have started an App called Medadvisor at the pharmacy. This is an excellent way to save time. You have the ability to not only know how many prescriptions/repeats you have at the pharmacy but actually request a script to be filled via your device such as your PC at home or your smart phone. You walk in the pharmacy, your script is ready – no waiting! The App will also give reminders of when a script needs to be filled and what prescriptions are to be renewed when you are going to visit your GP. What do you like about Bunyip? A lot of things! that's why I am still here after 24 years! Seriously, it's the people of Bunyip, our locals. They are friendly, engaging, accepting and very loyal. Up until just a few years ago I knew every single person that came into our Pharmacy by their first name. Now as the town is growing we are seeing a lot more new faces, especially families with young children and a lot of mature couples looking for a quieter place to live and retire.



TALKIN' ...FISHIN' MAKE A 'BERLEY DROPPER'

Constructed of 65mm and up to 90mm pvc pipe (plumbing section) with push-on cap ends, drill holes in the centre of both caps in either 8mm or 10mm depending on the cord thickness you choose to use. It is very important that the hole in the top lid (A) is very central so as to pull evenly on the release.

Drill about 12 holes evenly around the tube to let water in, start in from where the caps ends. come in about 75mm. Attach a knotted loop cord passing through both end caps, then knot at the end of the cords, make sure the top cord (1) is shorter than the bottom cord (2) taking the weight of the whole dropper tube.

The bottom cap (B) is to be glued on permanently, using a clear pvc solvent glue (Plumbers stuff). When using this berley delivery system in strong current, advising this) you would need to add weight to the bottom of the cord (2).


Assuming that you're all finished making it, and its ready to use now, fill with enough berley to suit your needs, push top cap (A) on and lower into the water and allow to fill slowly with water through the tubes holes, then lower away gently to the bottom. Lowering until it lands on the bottom, bring it up a bit, a "sharp" tug on the cord will separate the top lid (A) from the tube, (you'll feel this) keep pulling and the tube will invert and spill its contents below you. Pulled up

by the bottom lid (B) to the surface, refill and recap ready to go. Make sure you regularly check any wear on the cord, or you'll be making a replacement for the one left on the bottom. If the cap (A) comes away too easily over time a sand paper rubbed over the rim of the tube will give it more grip.

This is great for boating and pier fishing, but remember to cast to the rear of where you've deposited the berley according to the flow direction of any current, you don't want to supply the other anglers down from you with fish, compliments of your berley mix. The whole apparatus should cost no more than \$10 to make, good fishing y'all.

*Remember don't feed the fish; just excite them with a little now and then.


