Additional aged care beds for Hillview Bunyip Aged Care

The Hillview Bunyip Aged Care Board of Management is excited to announce that extensions at Hillview are well under way which will provide a net increase of eight beds for the facility.

The total cost of these extensions is \$2.3 million which includes a generous Grant of \$1.5 million provided by the Department of Health for the construction of rooms to assist people with Dementia. Federal Member for Monash, Russell Broadbent MP has been instrumental in assisting to secure the funding. He has always held the Hillview Board of Management in high regard and in a speech in Parliament he once described the Hillview Board of volunteers as true heroes.

Russell visited Hillview last week and accompanied by Hillview Board members and building contractor, Brad Lamble was taken on a guided tour of the building progress of the new rooms. When completed the new extension will comprise twelve new rooms which will add an extra eight beds at Hillview for a total of 58 beds.

All rooms will feature wireless technology, high energy rating, larger than existing room and have ceiling tracks so that residents can age in place.

Three new communal areas with fire place, family room, TV lounge and new outside court yard area with a variety of uses. There will be a substantial increase in staff in proportion with the increase in beds. Hillview is the largest employer in Bunyip and the surrounding districts. Hillview Bunyip Aged Care is a not-for-profit community managed facility.

Hillview CEO, Mr Frank Hoff said the completion of the extensions will be in early next year.

It was to perhaps help some men talk about the challenges of facing retirement, ageing and generally dealing with finally leaving work. It was a bitterly cold morning but 24 men (all over 50) gathered and we broke the ice (pardon the pun). Through some good guidance from John Doutch and Spencer Wanklyn we settled into some great discussion and all contributed. It was a resounding success and has flourished. What was impressive was the fact that men travelled from other towns to contribute and encourage all in attendance to feel included and important. On the 5th September we held our third gathering and it has helped many guys to speak about issues they probably thought they never could. I highly commend it.

I could not forget to talk about the incredibly versatile Bunyip & District Community House. The delightful Davina would make anybody who stuck their head in the door feel welcome. Report on St Thomas' Bunyip Lecture Four

On the afternoon of 2nd September the fourth of the Bunyip Lecture series for 2018 was given at St Thomas' hall. The lecturer, Dr Brian Chapman, is a well-known professional pianist, teacher and performer who has broadcast frequently and recorded for the ABC.

His topic for this lecture was a challenging one, its title, "Grief Denial and Rage: A Revisionist View of Beethoven's 'Moonlight' Sonata". In it he set out to show that this piece of music has been widely misunderstood, from Beethoven's own time to the present. It was believed that the Sonata was specifically written for its dedicatee, Countess Julie Guicciardi, and that she was the composer's 'Immortal Beloved'. Neither of these things was true, rather both were instances of 19th Century "fake news".

These myths were not disproved until 45 years after Beethoven's death. In the mean time influential pianists such as Franz Liszt and Hans von Bülow, and Beethoven's publishers, who named it 'Moonlight' Sonata, changed the time signature of the first movement to a slower speed and made other changes to support the lovelorn composer image. When the truth was discovered in 1872, nothing was done to correct the interpretation and performances by famous pianists to this day have reflected the myth, not the reality. Brian believes that in this Sonata, Beethoven was dealing with the fact of his own growing deafness, and that the first movement should actually be played nearly twice as fast as has normally been done, as given in Beethoven's Autograph score and in modern Urtext editions. When played in this way, the first movement becomes an expression of dumbstruck grief and the following movements express denial and rage, respectively.

Brian concluded his illustrated talk by performing the whole sonata with this new approach, to great applause from those present.

Talkin' Fishin'... For the first timers

For the first timers who have limited or no fishing experience, time to bite the bullet and get some lessons. If you're seriously lacking in the skills and knowledge but have plenty of enthusiasm, it's not too late, it's time to get lessons. There's no shame in it, only gain. Nobody thinks twice about golf or driving lessons, why any difference? And with far less people watching you if you do stuff things up.

Find someone willing to teach you, preferably older than you, as they tend to have more patience, unless you're the older one yourself, then that may be difficult. So find a young and keen competitive angler willing to share what they've learnt themselves from others.

Ask around. There are many fishing clubs, fishing clinics, with most members willing to share their knowledge. Plenty will claim to know it all, but the last thing you want is to pick up someone else's bad habits or poor casting techniques.

So a one-on-one lesson is your best option, and get the best you can afford. Consider fishing schools, guided fishing, one-day trips or group tours. You'll find you will learn more than you can take in all at once, so try booking a few lessons to get the most out of all that experience. Also makes a great gift idea!



You'll develop your own style eventually, but get the basics down-pat first. Casting, accuracy, knots, baits, rigs and reels with further information gathered from the huge selection of books, magazines, DVD and YouTube clips out there.

A lot of old books still have valuable information that never dates. Sure the gear updates, methods get forgotten, but some methods never die out.

I personally have taught ages ranging from 4 to 83, male and female, with no noticeable difference in ability. None ever thought of giving up (not that I know of), and what was important was finding the right method of teaching for them, the one that they understood best of all. I get great pleasure in seeing the look of success on their face, old or young, when they just get it... and catch their first fish!

Health Matters – Chickenpox

Chickenpox is a highly infectious disease, which mostly affects children. It is generally a mild disease, which does not last long in healthy children, but may cause serious illness or death in people who have lowered immunity. Adults who develop chickenpox generally become unwell and may have more serious complications such as pneumonia.

Chickenpox is caused by the varicella-zoster virus. The same virus also causes herpes zoster (shingles). This virus is present in large numbers in and behind the nose, and is spread from child to child by sneezing and coughing. It usually takes 2 to 3 weeks for the symptoms to appear after infection with the virus.

Symptoms of chickenpox

Initially, the child (or adult) may have flu-like symptoms, including a fever, headache, backache and loss of appetite. This is quickly followed by a red and spotty rash, which soon develops into blisters. The rash normally starts on the chest and back and then spreads to other parts of the body including the face, scalp, arms and legs. The rash is usually very itchy. After a day or two the blisters form a crust or a scab and this peels off in five to 20 days. Some children develop only a few spots and others have them all over their bodies including their vagina, mouth and up their nose.

Treatment of chickenpox

For some children, the rash may be no more than a passing inconvenience, but for others it can be very unpleasant. Treatment is therefore aimed at controlling the symptoms.

Asking your child not to scratch will probably fall on deaf ears, however it is worth trying to distract them as much as you can. Cut their fingernails very short and make sure that their hands and fingernails are kept clean. If the rash or sores are very itchy, bathe the child in a warm (but not too hot) bath with half a cup of baking soda. Your pharmacist or doctor will also be able to recommend some anti-itch preparations if your child is distressed. Calamine lotion can also be useful.

Paracetamol (but not aspirin) should be given as directed to reduce the fever and ease headaches. Ask your child to drink plenty of fluids. Don't worry if they don't eat as much as usual while they are sick — this will be fine for a day or two.

As chickenpox is caused by a virus, no antibiotics will be prescribed, however, they may be offered if your child develops a bacterial infection as a result of having chickenpox. Antiviral medicine can be used to treat people with complicated or severe chickenpox, or those with lowered immunity.

Preventing infection

Vaccines for the prevention of chickenpox are available in Australia. Chickenpox vaccine is recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for all children at 18 months. An additional dose may be given to children under 14 years to increase protection, but this second dose is currently not funded on the National Immunisation Program Schedule.

Vaccination is also recommended for adolescents aged 14 years and over and adults who have not had chickenpox or who have not had the chickenpox vaccine previously. Two doses of vaccine are required in adolescents and adults for adequate protection.

Chickenpox is most infectious from two days before the rash is present until after scabs have formed on the blisters — this takes about seven days. Do not send your child to school or pre-school during this time. Your child can return to school, preschool or day care seven days after the first spots appear, as long as all of the blisters have scabbed over.

For children who have not really been sick with chickenpox this can be a bit annoying. Remember, however, for some children and adults, chickenpox can be a very serious illness.
