Don't leave cooking unattended this winter



Victoria's fire services are reminding the community to pay close attention in the kitchen this winter as cooking remains the leading cause of fires in the home.

CFA responded to around 250 fires that started in the kitchen across the state last year, an increase of 20 from the previous year.

CFA Chief Officer Jason Heffernan said unattended cooking was one of the most common causes of preventable house fires. "We know a fire in your kitchen can cause extensive damage and high-level injuries, and unfortunately we saw this occur four times last year," Jason said. "We know that 6pm is the peak time for fires, and most are due to unattended cooking or mechanical failure.

"Make sure your kitchen appliances are in good working order, and ensure your stove top, griller, oven, rangehood and cooking area are free from built up grease, dust and oil. "While most fatal fires occur in sleeping areas, it is important to note that most residential fires start in the kitchen."

Fire Rescue Victoria Deputy Commissioner Community Safety Joshua Fischer said it was essential to maintain awareness and pay close attention to the stove when cooking to reduce the risks of a fire starting in the kitchen. "Cooking is a part of everyday life - but no-one can afford to be complacent about the fire safety risks. Ensuring you don't leave your cooking unattended may save your life and property," DC Fischer said. "If a fire does start in the kitchen, turn off the stove if it's safe to do so. Use a fire extinguisher or fire blanket only if you are confident to use them. Evacuate everyone from the home, close the kitchen door if safe to do so, and call Triple Zero."

DC Fischer said all Victorians should have working smoke alarms powered by a 10 year-long life battery in all sleeping and living areas of their home.

"If affordable, we recommend installation of interconnected smoke alarms, so when any alarm activates, all smoke alarms will sound throughout the house," DC Fisher said.

Other tips to cook safely this winter and avoid starting a blaze include:

- Pay attention in the kitchen and never leave cooking unattended.
- Always supervise children, keep them away from the stove top and oven.
- Keep stove top, griller, oven, range hood and cooking area free from built up grease, dust and oil.
- Things that can catch fire such as tea towels and paper towels must be kept away from cooking and heat sources.
- Make sure kitchen appliances are clean and in good working order and keep pot handles turned in.

A fire extinguisher and fire blanket should be stored within easy reach but away from the cooking area. Victorian Fire Services recommend that you only use a fire extinguisher or fire blanket if you feel confident to use this equipment safely.

TALKIN' ...FISHIN' THE CORRECT HAT-TIRE

Part of your fishing attire is a hat, but not just any type, but one is better than none. Sure if it's not important to you just whack anything on that'll cover your head. But if you think about it carefully there is a purpose and need to satisfy. The Australian sun can be punishing and downright dangerous, UV damage should be considered so use a wide brim hat covering your neck, ears and face is a must. Baseball caps just don't cut it, they offer no protection for your ears or neck unless it has a legionnaire's style of flap attached. Coverage is important, we like with our favoured 'AKUBRA's but ventilation is a comfort desired on those all too many hot days. Victorians urged to enrol for upcoming local council elections

Eligible residents and ratepayers are urged to check they are enrolled to vote for the upcoming local council elections by 4 pm Wednesday 7 August.

Electoral Commissioner, Sven Bluemmel, has issued a call ahead of the enrolment deadline: ‘If you’re 18 or over and you live in or pay rates to a Victorian council, enrol and have your say on the future of your local council.’

Australian citizens who have recently turned 18 or changed address can enrol or update their details online at vec.vic.gov.au/enrolment

Anyone on the state electoral roll is automatically enrolled for their current address for these elections. There are also additional council enrolment categories for non-resident owners, occupiers, company nominees and non-Australian citizens who pay rates.

The rules for council enrolment have changed. Property owners who don’t live in the council area but may be eligible to vote because they pay rates should contact their local council for further information.

The 2024 Victorian local council elections will be the state’s largest single election program, with a predicted 4.7 million voters participating in 465 individual elections across 78 councils.

Moira Shire Council is under administration and will not have a general election this October.

7 ENERGY SAVING TIPS FOR THE COOLER MONTHS: As we settle into the cooler months with shorter days, there are many things we can do around the home to keep warm and save money at the same time. **1)**

Change your Heater Setting: According to the [Federal Government's Your Home](#) sustainability guide, 40% of household energy goes into heating or cooling the average Australian home. Buying the most energy-efficient heater can account for significant electricity savings, but it isn't the only way to cut down your bills. Setting your thermostat to 20°C in winter can reduce your bills significantly, with each degree of extra heating increasing energy consumption by about 5-10%.

2) Hot Water Usage: 23% of the energy used in an average Australian home is used to heat water. Switching to a hot water heat pump system will save between 74-78% less energy than used by traditional hot water systems. A heat pump works on the same principle as a refrigerator, but instead of pumping heat out of the fridge to keep it cool, they pump heat into the water. Other simple way to reduce hot water is to run your washing machine with cold water, take shorter showers and install water-efficient showerheads and taps.

3) Sealing your home from the cold: Gaps around doors and windows can let cold draughts into your home. Door seals offer an inexpensive and quick solution to seal out the cold air, keeping your home warm. Similarly, a Chimney Damper can also provide a simple, reusable seal, blocking cold air from entering the chimney and preventing warm air from leaving.

4) Putting your Ceiling Fans into Winter Mode: Many Ceiling fans have a switch above the blades, allowing you to change between summer and winter modes. This will reverse the movement of the blades that will force the warm air trapped at the top of the ceiling to fall into the room.

5) Reduce the hours of your Pool Pump: While we are spending less time outdoors, changing the settings on your pool pump can make a collective difference in your electricity bills during the cooler months. When the weather cools, running your pump between 4- 6 hours per day will be sufficient to filter your pool and circulate all of the chemicals during the cooler months. This will cut the pool running times by 2 hours a day compared to summer.

6) Setting Appliances to run at off-peak times: Many appliances have timers where you can set them to run at off-peak times, maximising your energy usage when it costs you less. Typically off-peak falls is between 9pm and 3pm for most power suppliers. Running your pool pump or doing your washing/dish washing either early in the day or late in the evening can significantly slash your bills. Note that you can only benefit from off-peak rates if you are eligible, depending on your electricity provider and the electricity meter you have.

7) Monitor your energy usage: One of the best ways to reduce your power bills in the cooler months is to track your energy usage. [The emerald EMS app](#) enables you to track your usage from your mobile with energy usage stats and weekly reports. You can also set an energy budget and receive alerts when your usage is peaking. With extra data insights, you can take control of your electricity usage, save money and keep your home comfortable in the cooler months.

Cardinia MYLI Library has Home Energy and Water Efficiency kits you can borrow which include an energy monitor so you can try before you buy!!

'Green up' Cardinia with weed-control

Help keep Cardinia green through applying for weed control grants of up to \$1,500* which are now open for 2024-25.

Available through the Greening Cardinia program, the grants aim to improve biodiversity on private and public land and create habitat for threatened species.

Eligible applicants can be landowners or community groups undertaking works to control high-impact weeds on property located in areas of high environmental value. This can include land near bushland, natural reserves or creeks and rivers.

Landowners on properties over 4,000m² (1 acre) and community groups* may apply for a maximum of \$1,500.

Activities that are eligible include:

- Works that control high-impact weeds on property located in areas of high biodiversity value.
 - Purchasing approved chemicals for the required works* (up to a maximum of \$750 per grant).
 - Disposing of weed material (such as tip passes or skip hire).
 - The hiring of equipment (such as mulchers).
 - Hiring contractors* (conditions apply; see website for details).
- In addition to the weed control grants, the Greening Cardinia program includes an indigenous plant giveaway (Category 2) and biodiversity incentive community group grants (Category 3).

Cardinia Shire Mayor Councillor Jack Kowarzik encouraged residents and groups to help maintain a green Cardinia.

"The weed control program has been hugely successful in recent years and we are pleased to see it return," Cr Kowarzik said. "We see great value in these grants and are encouraging all residents and groups, right across the shire, to get involved. The works carried out under this program will provide long-term benefits to the biodiversity of Cardinia."

Local Law updated to enhance community safety and wellbeing

Cardinia Shire Council has updated Local Law 17 which will now be known as the Community Local Law 2024, coming into effect on 1 August 2024.

This law plays a crucial role in addressing various local issues, safeguarding the municipality's amenity, regulating activities on Council-controlled land and roads, and enhancing community safety. The amendments to the Local Law were carefully crafted based on extensive feedback from community members. These changes also reflect emerging issues and evolving community needs.

Key Changes in the Community Local Law 2024:

- **Hoon Events:** Participation in, encouragement or attendance at a hoon event is an offence. Parking near a hoon event without a lawful excuse is also prohibited.
- **Real Estate Pointer Boards:** Boards can be used without a permit, subject to compliance with specific requirements, including the need to remove boards promptly. These changes aim to reduce clutter and improve road safety.
- **Domestic Waste and Recycling:** The updated law clarifies current requirements for household waste, green waste, and recycled waste collection, and introduce penalties for placing prohibited materials in bins. Educational efforts continue to promote proper waste management.
- **Asset Protection Permits:** Permit requirements have been strengthened to ensure protection of Council assets and increased penalties for non-compliance.
- **Building Site Regulations:** Higher penalties for stormwater protection, containment of refuse, disposal and removal of builders' refuse, and sanitary facilities, have been introduced to ensure compliance and protect community amenities. New regulations have been introduced to control building site work hours, aligning with EPA construction noise provisions.

Cardinia Shire Mayor, Cr Jack Kowarzik, expressed support for these changes.

"We are committed to creating a safer and more pleasant environment for all our residents," Mayor Kowarzik said.

"There are some important improvements here. Local laws are not just about enforcement; they are about education and creating a community that values and respects our shared environment. We will continue to engage with residents and businesses to ensure everyone understands the benefits and responsibilities associated with these changes."

These laws are designed to enhance the quality of life for all residents by ensuring a clean, safe, and well-maintained environment. Local Laws last for 10 years unless revoked or renewed earlier. Local Law 17 was introduced in 2015 and this review ensures that the law is relevant and working as intended.

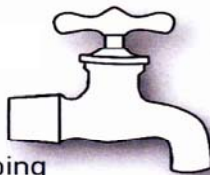
