

ROAD SAFETY ROAD RULES 2017 - REG 67

Stopping and giving way at a stop sign or stop line at an intersection without traffic lights.

In the diagram below Vehicle B must stop and give way to Vehicle A.



I have witnessed many cars in the position of Vehicle B not giving way to Vehicle A. As in the intersection of Hope Street, Nar Nar Goon/Longwarry Road and Bunyip-Modella Road in Bunyip. Hope this excerpt from Vic Roads helps people who do not understand this rule. Editor

TALKIN' ...FISHIN' EXPECT, THE UNEXPECTED

While we try to plan for an eventful trip, the species, the outcome and any possible scenarios- the one thing you can't plan for is the other, the unexpected. This can be an experience in the negative and sometimes the positive. Over a few frothies my mates and I reminisced and got a laugh out of a few of these we and I all but forgot about, or chose to.

On a very cold winter morning at Gunnamatta Beach I prepared for a day's surf fishing, all rugged up in all my wet weather gear and heavy woollen jumper I was warm as toast. Rigged up all my gear, bait bucket, and rod gimbal belt I moved in to the surf to knee deep waves and proceeded to fill my bag of frozen pipis with water to thaw them, when a shout from my mate to 'lookout' saw me get hit in the chest with a solid wave knocking me flat on my back, filling my clothes and waders with ice cold water and sand. The sound of two sheets of sandpaper rubbed together still reminds me of the sound I made as I walked to the showers, I've never felt that cold or uncomfortable ever again.

While as a young boy around 14 on one of our family holidays to Jamieson in Victoria, I'd decided to fish in the late afternoon in a favourite spot in the shade of the willow trees above a low embankment. I noticed in my eagerness to fish that I had threaded the line through all the rod guides and rigged up with the line on the wrong side of the bail arm. So I disconnected the bail from the rotor and let the line drop in the water to prevent a tangled mess, moved the line over and reconnected the bail, I took up the tension and rewound it back onto the spool only to discover I'd snagged the bottom, after I stood up and fought to retrieve it back to the surface only to find a 2 ½ Ib redfin on the other end that had just been sitting there waiting for me.

On an Easter weekends camping and fishing trip to Eildon, I walked along a well-established track bordering the lake, cutting through bush to various clearings suitable for spinning lures and casting a fly between the flooded trees. Rounding a bend in the pathway I was confronted by an aggressive male deer (buck) who was quite adamant that I would not pass him, snorting and honking at me made that rather clear. Load shouts and even handfuls of trail dust he just wouldn't budge! But apparently the spray of 'Aeroguard' I gave at a distance in his direction wasn't too pleasant either and he took off into the bush, I kept looking over my shoulder for the next few hours, those buggers are huge!

On the same weekend a few years later, my work colleague and I travelled to Dartmouth but decided that I would take my boat this time. I should've heeded the early warning signs though. On the first attempt a wheel mudguard on the trailer broke off after I hit a large pot hole in Ferntree Gully Rd, it skidded along the road until the car behind us hit it sending it flying into traffic coming in the other direction, and bouncing it onto their bonnet, after an exchange of licence info, later costing me \$400+ for the repairs to their car. After having it re-welded at my in-laws, we continued our trip, only to hit 'hard' the rail-crossing at Yarra Glen, this time the guard came off and overtook us in the main street. We picked it up and threw it into the boat just determined to get to Dartmouth now. On the Hume Hwy from Bonnie Doon we somehow attracted a police patrol car, probably due to the brace under the trailer that had unknowing broken and was dragging along the road leaving a fireworks display of sparks behind us along with the tarp that was flapping like a flag that had been tied to it before then. I'll never forget the policeman's advice, get it all secure and get there safe, and don't drown, it creates a hell of a lot of paperwork!

We eventually got there at 1am to the boat ramp but it was shrouded in fog so we'd have to wait till morning now to launch, so we settled in for an uncomfortable night sleeping in the car, at first light we launched the boat and went to park the car and the battery died on the ramp blocking it for any other wishing to use it. Couldn't believe it! Fortunately a 4WD turned up and gave us a jump start, parked and left it there. We persisted for the weekend with NO fish caught, and discovered a snake in our tent on the return to camp. The only saviour for the whole trip was a spontaneous decision to stop and fish the Mitta Mitta River at Eskdale which we landed and released 18 fish the biggest was a 4 ¼ lb rainbow. When we finally called it a day, we limped home with the trailer breaking a leaf spring and gradually disintegrating the whole way back to Dandenong. The next week I spent gradually cutting up the trailer and had great pleasure in exercising its demons.

So take heed of the signs, the unexpected will always be waiting!

Columba Primary's "Lifesavers" Lead the Way in Clean-Up Bunyip Event



In the days leading up to the Clean Up Bunyip event on Sunday, a fantastic group of grade two students from Columba Catholic Primary School, known as the "Lifesavers", headed to the Koolangarra Park playground, collecting an impressive amount of rubbish along the way. The students were very surprised at how much litter they found, and their teachers believe they would have kept going all day if they'd had the chance!

Below is a fantastic summary that the grade two students put together about their clean-up efforts:

We wanted to tell you, that today we went for a walk around the streets of our school to collect as much rubbish as we could.

This is where we went:

First, we went up the hill from Columba and turned right down Wattletree Rd. We went past the bus stop and then came back down towards our school. We did both sides of the road.

When we got back to school, we had a rest and a drink then decided to head out again. This time we went down Hope St to the Bunyip Playground where we cleaned up the whole playground area.

These are some things we found lots of:

1. Lots of lolly wrappers - we think these are left over from Halloween. We have an idea that might help this for next year because we were surprised to see so many wrappers around. Next year before Halloween we would like to make some signs asking kids to make sure they don't throw wrappers on the ground.

2. Another thing we found lots of was cigarette butts. Luckily we were wearing gloves and

- 4. We noticed that there was a lot of rubbish in the gutters and the pipes.

- 6. Near houses that were being built we found lots of plastic and foam blocks.



Last week, Grade 3/4 Bunyip Primary School students collected litter from our school yard in an effort to clean up & learn what types of rubbish are effecting our community.







BRAG and Bunyip Connect Inc.

On Sunday, November 10th, the Bunyip community gathered with Bunyip Renewables Action Group (BRAG) and Bunyip Connect Inc. for the Clean Up Bunyip and Grand Opening of the BMX Track Playground event at the BMX Track on Wattletree Road in Bunyip.

The event celebrated BRAG's success in winning an award in the "Energy" section of the 2024 Keep Australia Beautiful Tidy Towns Awards, as well as Bunyip Connect Inc's successful grant for installing a playground at the BMX Track on Wattletree Road.

Leading up to the event, students from both Bunyip Primary School and Columba Catholic Primary School took active roles in tidying their school grounds, with Columba's Grade 2 "Lifesavers" extending their efforts to Koolangara Park.

The event saw a fantastic turnout, with about 50 people attending from Bunyip and beyond. Many donned high-visibility vests to tackle Bunyip's litter "hot spots". Bunyip Tennis Club deserve a special mention for coordinating their Working Bee, which included a clean-up of the area around the tennis courts, to coincide with the event.

The ribbon-cutting ceremony, led by Bash from the Bunyip and District Bendigo Bank, officially opened the new playground. The playground was made possible through the bank's generous funding alongside an impressive Tiny Towns grant.

To add to the day's excitement, the Cardinia Leisure Street Team brought activities like hurdles, giant Jenga, basketball, and footy practice, keeping children active and entertained, while Bunyip Primary School parents hosted a sausage sizzle barbecue to raise money for the school.

A total of 11 large bags of rubbish were collected during the event; 6 full of waste for landfill, 3 full of items for Cardinia Shire's yellow bins and 2 full of containers to be recycled through the container deposit scheme. We would like to thank Cardinia shire for collecting the bags for us after the event.

BRAG and Bunyip Connect Inc. would like to thank the local community groups and businesses whose support was invaluable, including Bunyip Landcare, Bunyip IGA, Biddy Martha's Cafe, and Bunyip Pharmacy.

This community event showed what can be achieved when local groups, businesses, and

individuals come together to support their town.

GOOD NEWS FROM BUNYIP HALL.

Bunyip Hall Committee has been working hard over the past few years to minimise their energy usage and therefore their carbon footprint.

Thanks to a Community Capital Works grant from Cardinia Shire, last year Bunyip Hall Committee saw the installation of solar panels on the hall roof.

As the hall is most often used in the evenings, Cardinia Shire has agreed to provide a battery to store power that is generated from the solar panels during the day for use when the Hall is being used after dark.

Added to this a timer has been placed on one of the instant hot water systems in order to avoid wasting electricity.

Furthermore the (almost antique) gas heaters are soon to be replaced by new energy efficient electric split systems.

To do this the power supply to the hall has been upgraded thanks to Cardinia Shire – which is why the footpath has been dug up recently.

The foundation for all this energy upgrade work which will greatly reduce the Hall's on-going costs was an energy audit undertaken in 2022 thanks to BRAG.




